Join us for some musical fun during our first program of 2024. Kim Richardson (Music Director for Pickerington's Vineyard Community Church) and her daughter, Rebekah (Groveport H.S. Junior) will alternate playing classic and modern music on Cleo Richter's circa 1860 Melodeon organ and a 1960 Magnus organ recently donated by Society member, Ken Planisek. Guests will have a chance to play "Name That Tune" and win a prize!

Doors open at 2:00pm. Because seating is limited, two 30-minute musical sessions

will be held: One from 2:15-2:45pm; the second from 3:00-3:30pm.
