Who Are we?

Missionary Highlight

Mike and Ginger Zenk, in North Africa, the Middle East and Central Asia. It is hard for me, as an American, to really understand persecution. I have had people insult or laugh at me over the years, but that's about the extent of it. Ginger and I work with people who live with real persecution.

However, 23 of the 28 nations we work in are listed in the top 50 nations in the world where followers of Jesus are most heavily persecuted, according to Open Doors USA. Take the following example for instance.

"Victor", a local Christian in one of our countries, was convicted of "blasphemy" in May 2017, and was sentenced to death by a District Court on January 3 of this year. Victor, who has been fighting to clear his name since his arrest in 2012, appeared in court as part of an ongoing appeal against the life sentence he received when first convicted. The court however, upheld the 2017 conviction and further ruled that the proper sentence for "blasphemy" against the prophet of the majority religion, was death rather than life imprisonment.

Victor, who has been imprisoned for nearly ten years, was appealing against a life sentence for "blasphemy. A District Court judge instead sentenced him to death. The ruling is based on a 1991 constitutional court decision that the death penalty is the only appropriate punishment for "blasphemy" against the Prophet. Victor's legal representatives plan to appeal against both the death penalty and the original conviction.

Victor was convicted of "blasphemy" for allegedly sending texts "insulting" the Prophet on a phone that was not registered to his name. He has always denied the allegations. In September 2020 it was reported that he had suffered a heart attack in prison, and that there were serious concerns for his deteriorating physical and mental health. Laws outlawing insulting religion have existed in the region since 1860 and were incorporated into the national Penal Code at the country's founding in the 1940's. The laws have gotten more strict over the years, now stating that any person who "defiles the sacred name of the Holy Prophet" is to be punished with death or imprisonment for life. This, however, was followed by the 1991 court ruling that the only suitable punishment for "blasphemy" against the Prophet was death. Higher courts are, nevertheless, reluctant to uphold a death sentence, and no executions have ever been carried out.

As you can imagine, this affects what our work looks like in so many countries. Our staff constantly have to take steps of faith, without foolishly inviting the persecution. What an honor it is to work with such modern heroes! Thank you for partnering with us as we equip and train them for their work!
