# This Morning's Readings

## St. Paul's Letter to the Galatíans 4:22-27

Brethren, Abraham had two sons, one by a slave and one by a free woman. But the son of the slave was born according to the flesh, the son of the free woman through promise. Now this is an allegory: these women are two covenants. One is from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery; she is Hagar. Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. But the Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother. For it is written, "Rejoice, O barren one who does not bear; break forth and shout, you who are not in travail; for the children of the desolate one are many more than the children of her that is married."

## The Gospel according to Luke 13:10-17

At that time, Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity for eighteen years; she was bent over and could not fully straighten herself. And when Jesus saw her, he called her and said to her, "Woman, you are freed from your infirmity." And he laid his hands upon her, and immediately she was made straight, and she praised God. But the ruler of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had healed on the sabbath, said to the people, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be healed, and not on the sabbath day." Then the Lord answered him, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to water it? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?" As he said this, all his adversaries were put to shame; and all the people rejoiced at all the glorious things that were done by him.

Rejoice, therefore, O universe if thou should hear and glorify with the angels and the shepherds. Glorify Him who by his own will shall become a newborn babe and who is our God before all ages.

Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral
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he Magic Hat December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2018

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Homilies have very short shelf-lives. Whatever a priest may have to say during the Sunday homily carries very little weight and is quickly forgotten in the rush of events that overwhelm us once the new workweek begins. There is, however, one notable exception; the annual Stewardship Sunday homily!

This is the week when the faithful may listen more intently, wondering to themselves "Can he do it?" "Can he pull the rabbit out of the hat?" In other words, can the priest weave together a tapestry of syllables, words, and phrases sufficient to inspire increased revenues to the local parish? Sorry to disappoint, but there will be no rabbits pulled out of the magic hat this morning!

And not for lack of effort, I can assure you! Over the years, I have utilized various methods and fund-raising tools from national stewardship ministries, developed themes, created logos, written articles, published newsletters, delivered stirring homilies, (at least I liked them!) held giving-themed Bible studies, mailed letters, elicited testimonies, sponsored lunches... you name it!

Such methods and tools are modestly effective, certainly. But among the just under 1500 verses in the Bible pertaining to tithes and offerings we find these words of Jesus; "According to your faith, be it done unto you." And it is upon the fulcrum of our personal faith in Jesus Christ that the issue rests. Our own Synod of Orthodox bishops commissioned a survey on the faithful's views of stewardship and, unsurprisingly, discovered the truth of this statement.

Those parishes which taught that giving is an essential component of the faithful's spiritual lives, as essential as prayer, fasting, and Bible reading, enjoyed robust revenues. Conversely, those parishes still mired in passé notions of "dues" (Which way to the Country Club?) and "fair share" struggled. If the aim of stewardship is to pay the light bill... we will probably raise enough to pay the light bill.


Robust giving in the parish only emerges as we begin to understand the irreducible role that the parish plays in our spiritual lives. As we come to view the local parish (correctly) as the Ark of our Salvation revenues will emerge. In a healthy parish filled with committed souls stewardship becomes virtually invisible and crass appeals for emergency funds are unnecessary. Gone are baskets, fund-raisers, and minimal budgets, replaced with vision, purpose, and growth.

Not to worry! You will still hear (dare I say?) an inspiring homily about stewardship this morning! With nearly 1500 Bible verses about stewardship it is possible even to *accidentally* preach about giving! And I certainly pray that we will be moved to respond with more meaningful tithing commitments to our Cathedral home. But the issue, ultimately, rests on our faith in Jesus Christ. Once we commit to *that*, the revenues will follow!


