Message from Father Alexander

Eat, Drink, and Be Merry!

As we once again round into the Holiday Season, our Church continues in Her cycle of readings that are offered throughout the year. Interestingly, many of the upcoming Gospel readings on Sundays speak about a theme that underlies our secular understanding of the season. Our consumerist world tries to sell the idea that this is the "Season of Giving" but the message truly is, it is the season of buying, of storing up for ourselves, making ourselves more comfortable, and enjoying our lives (and maybe giving a little to others when convenient).



We indeed center our lives around eating, drinking, and being merry for the next 2 months, paying attention to those in need mostly

when it is simply useful for us and then returning to our comforts. The Lord warns us sternly in some upcoming Gospels: The Gospel of the Rich Man who has a plentiful harvest and instead of looking outside himself and giving some away, builds a bigger storage barn for himself to live off of without cares for the rest of his life. The Lord castigates him saying, "Fool, tonight your soul is demanded of you!"



Again we will read of the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, the Rich Man feasting sumptuously every night and not paying attention to the poor man, Lazarus who sat at his gate every week. When they died it was the suffering of Lazarus that brought him to Eternal Rest and the ingratitude and selfishness of the Rich Man that brings him to the Eternal Fire.

What would we do indeed if we thought our soul would be demanded of us every night? Would we seek this building of bigger barns and bank accounts, or would we seek to give? Would we fall into the trap that our world seeks for us to fall into: just eat, drink, and be merry this season! Or would we ponder on our Lord's

Incarnation, how God became man and dwelt among us. We must think about how this season of Thanksgiving is one wherein we should truly be giving thanks, not just at the table on Thanksgiving Day, but in every moment for all the wondrous things God as done for us.

The centrality of thanksgiving is shown in our Church when we come together every Divine Liturgy for the Eucharist, giving thanks to God by offering Him our meager wine and bread which He deigns to make into His own Body and Blood. We owe everything to Him, let us always dwell on this and give thanks unto God in every moment of our life by giving of what we have and worshiping our God who so showers us with everything we need.

We are excited to announce the Stewardship Theme for 2023... *Giving Thanks - Eucharistic Stewardship.* The word Eucharist comes from the Greek word for thanksgiving. This is what we do when we celebrate the Divine Liturgy - we are giving thanks. The Eucharist - the sacrament of Holy Communion - is the focus of our parish life.

Stewardship is our response to God's grace and moves us from grace to gratitude. Just as we love because God first loved us (I John 4:14), we give because God first gave to us. The question of the Psalmist "What shall I give to the Lord in return for all His benefits towards me?" (Ps 116:2), is answered in every liturgy when we pray, "Let us offer ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God."

But how can we possibly thank God for all he has given us? "What shall I give to the Lord in return for all His benefits toward me?" One way to give back to the Lord is through stewardship - we give of our time, talent and treasure.

It is during this season we are asked to prayerfully consider what our stewardship commitment can be. How much time can I give to the church? What are my talents I can lend to the church? What is my financial situation and how much money can I donate to the church? The Lord calls us to give 10% of our income to the church. Everyone's situation is different. Some have more to give while others do not. But if we are each giving what we truly can afford to give (in time, talent and treasure) then we are doing the best we can. So please take this time, leading up to Stewardship Sunday on December 11th to consider your gifts to the Lord. We are grateful for all of our stewards and thankful for your generosity.

THE HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL ENDOWMENT FUND



The Holy Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1992 with an initial deposit of \$2,000. The goal was to build the Endowment Fund whereby the interest and appreciation would one day provide sufficient income so Holy Trinity would no longer be <u>totally dependent</u> on an annual festival to supplement stewardship income.

The Endowment Fund is obligated to preserve the donor's contributions such that the principal will remain **inviolate** and be held in perpetuity by the Church. The funds are prudently managed by the investment committee, which reports to the Parish Council. The investment committee only approves withdrawals from the earnings and appreciation, over and above the donor's contributions, and are used only to benefit Holy Trinity and its ministries.

Over the course of the past twenty-nine years the committee has held steadfast to this mission, and as a result, generous donors from our Church, desiring to leave a legacy <u>in</u> <u>perpetuity</u> for their family, have made contributions totaling \$644,340.00.

This is your opportunity to put your lifetime thumbprint in the history of Holy Trinity Cathedral.

We have been blessed by the generosity and foresight of the individuals and families listed on the next page. We benefit today from their kindness and vision. Your gift, no matter the amount will be combined into the general endowment fund, and will be greatly appreciated.



Holy Apostle Philip

Commemorated November 14



The Holy and All-praised Apostle Philip, was a native of the city of Bethsaida in Galilee. He

had a profound depth of knowledge of the Holy Scripture, and rightly discerning the meaning of the Old Testament prophecies, he awaited the coming of the Messiah. Through the call of the Savior (John 1:43), Philip followed Him.

After the Ascension of the Lord, the Apostle Philip preached the Word of God in Galilee, accompanying his preaching with miracles. Thus, he restored to life a dead infant in the arms of its mother. From Galilee he went to Greece, and preached among the Jews that had settled there. Some of them reported the preaching of the Apostle to Jerusalem. In response, some scribes arrived in Greece from Jerusalem, with one of the Jewish chief priests at their head, to interrogate the Apostle Philip.

The Apostle Philip exposed the lie of the chief priest, who said that the disciples of Christ had stolen away and hidden the body of Christ. Philip told instead how the Pharisees had bribed the soldiers on watch, to deliberately spread this rumor. When the Jewish chief priest and his companions began to insult the Lord and lunged at the Apostle Philip, they suddenly were struck blind. By his prayer the Apostle restored everyone's sight. Seeing this miracle, many believed in Christ.


When the Apostle Philip arrived in the city of Phrygian Hieropolis, he saw that there were many pagan temples. There was also a pagan temple where people worshiped an enormous serpent as a god. The Apostle Philip by the power of prayer killed the serpent and healed many bitten by snakes.

Among those healed was the wife of the city prefect, Amphipatos. Having learned that his wife had accepted Christianity, the prefect Amphipatos gave orders to arrest Saint Philip, his sister, and the Apostle Bartholomew traveling with them. At the urging of the pagan priests of the temple of the serpent, Amphipatos ordered the holy Apostles Philip and Bartholomew to be crucified.


Suddenly, an earthquake struck, and it knocked down all those present at the place of judgment. Hanging upon the cross by the pagan temple of the serpent, the Apostle Philip prayed for those who had crucified him, asking God to save them from the ravages of the earthquake. Seeing this happen, the people believed in Christ and began to demand that the apostles be taken down from the crosses. The Apostle Bartholomew was still alive when he was taken down, and he baptized all those believing and established a bishop for them.

But the Apostle Philip, through whose prayers everyone remained alive, except for Amphipatos and the pagan priests, died on the cross.






