Message from Father Alexander

Setting Priorities



As we continue to wilt in our lovely Summer heat here in Phoenix we have already seen the return of many of our children to school and the return of routines as we begin to settle into "life." We set priorities for when we will bring our children (and ourselves!) where and at what times. If there is a conflict we decide which thing to favor over the other and show our priorities by attending the one over the other event. The other thing we do to show respect and priorities is timeliness. We don't preach of the importance of school to our children then arrive 45 minutes late regularly. We don't speak about how important a certain extra-curricular is and then only sparingly show up to it.

So then how do we approach church and God? Is it a mandated event? Do we choose other events over Him? Do we make an effort to come on time consistently? When we see things through this light it should be no surprise when our families and youth stray from the faith as it is simply not as much a priority as other events in life.

As for everything with God, we have the opportunity to change that at any moment and this year we have many chances to reframe our life towards salvation and eternal rather than the mundane. We know our robust Liturgical life and services that present us with the ability to pray together as a community. But along with prayer, we must learn as well and we have opportunities for young and old.

Our Youth will continue in their 4F program beginning on August 19 at 4:30pm and repeat very 3rd Saturday. After Liturgy on Sunday they will join Fr. and Fr. on the solea to learn about the Scriptures this year! With more parental involvement we will offer more house meetings for different age groups as well. Our High Schoolers will meet the first Sunday of every month at 7pm beginning August 6th.



For our adults (or even our youth!) who wish to continue their education in the faith (which should be everyone!) Fr. Apostolos will host his class The Kingdom of God and How to Attain it Saturdays at 3:30pm beginning August 26 in the Conference Room and on Zoom. Fr. Alexander will offer Bible Study Wednesdays after Paraklesis at ~7pm on 1st Corinthians beginning on August 23.

Number of Stewards using ShelbyNext: 101







In the month of August, we celebrate the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ





This feast commemorates the transfiguration or metamorphosis of Christ on Mount Tabor, when our Lord appeared in His divine glory before the Apostles Peter, James, and John.

Jesus took the Apostles Peter, James, and John with Him up upon a mountain, and while they were on the mountain Jesus was transfigured. His face shone like the sun, and His garments became glistening white.

Moses and Elijah appeared with Christ, talking to Him. Peter declared how good it was for them to be there and expressed the desire to build three booths for Moses, Elijah, and Christ. This reference to the booths could imply that this occurred during the time of the Feast of Tabernacles when the Jews would be camping out in the fields for the grape harvest; for this Feast had acquired other associations in the course of its history, including the memory of the wanderings in the wilderness recorded in the Old Testament book of Exodus.

While Peter was speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them. A voice came from the cloud saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." When the disciples heard this they fell on their faces filled with awe. Jesus came to them and told them to not be afraid. When the three looked up they saw only Jesus.

As Jesus and His disciples came down the mountain, He told them not to speak of what they had seen until He had risen from the dead.

Dormition of the Theotokos


Commemorated on August 15

The Feast of the Dormition of Our Most Holy Lady, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary is celebrated on August 15 each year. The Feast commemorates the repose (dormition and in the Greek kimisis) or "falling-asleep" of the Mother of Jesus Christ, our Lord. The Feast also commemorates the translation or assumption into heaven of the body of the Theotokos.

At the time of her death, the disciples of our Lord who were preaching throughout the world returned to Jerusalem to see the Theotokos. Except for the Apostle Thomas, all of them including the Apostle Paul were gathered together at her bedside. At the moment of her death, Jesus Christ himself descended and carried her soul into heaven.

Following her repose, the body of the Theotokos was taken in procession and laid in a tomb near the Garden of Gethsemane. When the Apostle Thomas arrived three days after her repose and desired to see her body, the tomb was found to be empty. The bodily assumption of the Theotokos was confirmed by the message of an angel and by her appearance to the Apostles.

This great Feast of the Church and the icon celebrates a fundamental teaching of our faith—the Resurrection of the body. In the case of the Theotokos, this has been accomplished by the divine will of God. Thus, this Feast is a feast of hope, hope in Resurrection and life eternal. Like those who gathered around the body of the Virgin Mary, we gather around our departed loved ones and commend their souls into the hands of Christ. As we remember those who have reposed in the faith before us and have passed on into the communion of the Saints, we prepare ourselves to one day be received into the new life of the age to come.



We also affirm through this Feast as we journey toward our heavenly abode that the Mother of God intercedes for us. Through Christ she has become the mother of all of the children of God, embracing us with divine love.



Project Mexico

Last month, from July 20 - 26, four members of our church drove down to Tijuana, Mexico alongside other Orthodox parishes from across the country to help build houses for those in need. We spent our mornings in prayer, our days at the build site, and our evenings attending service. We ate traditional Mexican dinners, and had some time left over to play soccer, sit around the fire, or listen to a guest speaker for the night. While the basic information of the trip can be summed up in a sentence or two, the experience of being there cannot. Personally, I have not been to Mexico since I was kid. Driving into Tijuana and not only seeing but feeling the lifestyle difference, opened my eyes to what life what like for those living in the border town.







Sure, the slight uneasiness of being in another country where they didn't have the same laws had an effect. But it was the fact that these families are unable to build a better life for themselves that truly made an impression on us. Our groups' experience was different. We were a smaller group, while that meant longer days, it also meant being blessed with the extraordinary opportunity to meet and build alongside the family that would be living in the house we were constructing.

The father, José, was a kind gentleman, he owned a taco stand in the center of town. It was getting to know him that made the experience more real, and put more emotion and importance on building a house that would

someday be a home.

As the trip came to an end, we realized we were not only building homes, but building relationships with the people there as well. All of us returned home with new friendships and connections in the Orthodox community in ways we couldn't have expected. The experience was profound. As Fr. Jacob from Assumption put it in one of his talks there, "When you set out to rescue someone else, what actually happens is that they are rescuing you." For anyone who is thinking about going next year I strongly encourage it! If you're curious to hear more, don't hesitate to ask one of us at church, or ask Father Alexander to get connected with us!
