This Morning's Readings

St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 2: 14-22

Brethren, Christ is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility, by abolishing in his flesh the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby bringing the hostility to an end. And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

The Gospel According to Luke 18: 35-43

At that time, as Jesus drew near to Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the roadside begging; and hearing a multitude going by, he inquired what this meant. They told him, "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by." And he cried, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And those who were in front rebuked him, telling him to be silent; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And Jesus stopped, and commanded him to be brought to him; and when he came near, he asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed him, glorifying God; and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

Thanksgiving & The Eucharist

December 1st, 2019

As we recover from the blissful food coma which accompanies the Thanksgiving holiday, at long last fully in the Christmas Holiday Season, it behooves us to reflect for a moment on the essential role of Gratitude in our spiritual lives. This is particularly true of us as Orthodox Christians for whom the celebration of the Holy Eucharist comprises the central core of our life in Christ.

Memories of elementary school Thanksgiving pageants, of the mornings spent glued to the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade as the windows of our parents' home fogged over as the meal is prepared, and of that chilly morning football game played with neighborhood friends re-emerge this time of year. But beneath these blessed memories lie a deeper and more substantial truth.

St. Paul writes; "In everything give thanks for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thes. 5:18) Gratitude to God ($Ev\chi\alpha\rho\iota\sigma\tau\eta\rho\iota\alpha$) defines the life of the practicing Christian who, even in difficult times, perceives life as a divine gift. Ingratitude blinds one even to obvious blessings and casts a shadow over the whole of one's life. Nothing ever satisfies, nothing is ever enough, every silver lining has a cloud. Left unchallenged and uncorrected, ingratitude saps the color from our lives and predisposes us to gloom and restlessness.

But to embrace our own lives and our lots $\mu\varepsilon$ $\varepsilon\nu\chi\alpha\rho\iota\sigma\tau i\alpha$, with gratitude, fills us with strength and resilience in times of trials and with a full measure of joy in times of blessing. How can we condition ourselves to become a people of gratitude, to acquire the grace and ability to give thanks to God "in everything," as St. Paul instructs us to do?

Simply by faithfully and consistently participating in the Eucharistic Banquet offered in the Divine Liturgy, our predisposition to ingratitude and self-centeredness can be supplanted by a spirit of thanksgiving and Christ-focused living! "I will enter His gates with thanksgiving in my heart, I will enter His courts with praise!" writes the Psalmist (100:4) And as we learn, more and more, how to apprehend the gentle hands of our merciful and loving Creator-God, holy gratitude and with it, humility, peace, contentedness, and patience, is birthed within us.

If ever a national holiday deserved to be embraced and Christified by the Church, it must surely be this Thanksgiving Holiday. As we work through our leftovers and let our belts out a notch or two, may we ask God for the grace and wisdom to continually become a people of immense gratitude for His love and mercy on us!

During this season of giving, let's give thanks for the blessings we have, and let's share from our abundance with those in need!


What is Christian Stewardship?
