This Morning's Readings

St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 6:12-20

Brethren, "all things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything. "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food" -- and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Do you not know that he who joins himself to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two shall become one flesh." But he who is united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Shun immorality. Every other sin which a man commits is outside the body; but the immoral man sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God? You are not your own; you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body and in your spirit which belong to God.

The Gospel According to Luke 15:11-32

The Lord said this parable: "There was a man who had two sons; and the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that falls to me.' And he divided his living between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took his journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in loose living. And when he had spent everything, a great famine arose in that country, and he began to be in want. So he went and joined himself to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed swine. And he would gladly have filled his belly with the pods that the swine ate; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired servants.' And he arose and came to his father. But while he was yet at a distance, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned

against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet; and bring the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and make merry; for this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to make merry. Now his elder son was in the field; and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what this meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has received him safe and sound.' But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, but he answered his father, 'Lo, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command; yet you never gave me a kid, that I might make merry with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your living with harlots, you killed for him the fatted calf!' And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to make merry and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.'"

You Are Not Your Own

February 16th, 2020

Today's epistle once again flies in the face of everything we are told in society today. Paul emphatically tells the Corinthians and us that, what we do with our bodies does matter to God and for our salvation. The go-to idea today is that, "if it makes you happy and doesn't hurt someone else, go for it!" This has snuck into mainstream Christianity as well and it really shows a lack of a simple reading of the Scriptures.

Paul cannot be any clearer today: our body is for the Lord and for eternal salvation, not for food and sensual pleasure. This is not out of some strict, puritanical hatred of "fun," but because our bodies have a higher calling than to literally be weighed down by food or other pleasures. Our body is a Temple of the Holy Spirit, a dwelling place for God, a place where God will dwell in us if we only let Him. We push Him out when we decide that we take more pleasure in the things that "feel good" to our body. Our bodies and souls are God's and "bought at a price." God came down from Heaven to become like us and free us from being slaves to the "pleasures of this life."

This probably sounds a bit dramatic and foreign to us today but we can break it down on a "micro" level as well. When we eat a lot of food we literally feel weighed down by this consumption (think post-Thanksgiving). It makes it harder to do our daily tasks (physically we feel more lethargic) and often slowly begins to take over our life and become what we live for every day. There are physical, mental, and spiritual consequences to us becoming so attached to food. The same goes for "sexual immorality." If not used in it's intended fashion, for the growing of the bond of love in marriage and the procreation of children, sex often brings about "unintended consequences." In both of these cases presented by Paul, we know the proper use of food and sex is not for indiscriminate use. We readily see what happens when we eat to excess and if we actually think for a minute we can see what happens when we give our body away in excess. There are always negative consequences to giving ourselves over to this sort of lifestyle.

Our bodies are not our own but Christ's. This should not be shocking or sad or even news to us but something that is a cause of joy! God dwells in us. As we come to the season of Great Lent and begin to fast we have the opportunity to see what our bodies can be when we focus on God and not on them. If we truly follow the guidelines of the Church it can become obvious to us that they exist to guide us to union with God in mind, soul, AND body. "Let us commit ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God" this Lent and when Christ rises from the dead on Pascha we will see our bodies rise from the slavery to sin and death and fully realize our potential as Christians.




