This Morning's Readings

St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians 3: 4-11

Brethren, when Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience. In these you once walked, when you lived in them. But now put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old nature with its practices and have put on the new nature, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there cannot be Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free man, but Christ is all, and in all.

The Gospel According to Luke 17: 12-19

At that time, as Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus's feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus: "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him: "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

Gifts of Leadership

January 19th, 2020

This morning at the conclusion of Divine Worship, we will administer the Oath of Office for our 202 Parish Council members. Our beloved Cathedral as ever benefited from the leadership skills and diligent efforts of our parish family members who have answered the call to serve in the offering of their spiritual gifts to Christ's Body, the Church.

A once fashionable, now outmoded, view of Parish Council service suggested a division between "spiritual" and "secular" aspects of parish life. In this passe understanding, council members' activities were focused solely on the mundane aspects of parish life with the clergy alone being concerned about the spiritual health and vitality of the community. But such a view interposes a rupture where none truly exists.

St. Paul wrote to the faithful believers of Colossae in Asia Minor ; *"And whatever you, do it heartily as unto the Lord and not to men."* (3:23) And to the faithful in Rome, he likewise listed gifts of service, or administration (*διακονίαν*) among those at work in the Church. Again, our Cathedral family is blessed in that our devoted parish council members understand this very well, as evidenced by the sweeping work undertaken last year to frame our Strategic Plan.

Elected by you from the parish membership, our council members labor to discharge their spiritual gifts for God's glory and for the "building up" of the Church, always mindful that our *raison d'etre*, our reason to exist, is to advance the cause of Salvation in Jesus Christ in whatever we undertake, whether in planning a spiritual retreat or in updating the maintenance needs of our campus. Guided both by our Uniform Parish Regulations and, more urgently, by the spirit of the Gospel, our activities are and must always be transparent as we co-labor under the guidance of the Holy Spirit to piously and effectively discharge our respective duties and shared calling.

This morning as the oath is administered, I ask that we stand in affirmation of the council members' willingness to serve and to pray for the strength and wisdom of God over them and us. We cannot know what unforeseen challenges 2020 will bring our way. But we can be confident that Almighty God always makes a way through challenging times if we follow His lead. The Oath of Office is as follows;

"I, (name) do solemnly affirm that I will uphold the dogmas, teachings, traditions, holy canons, discipline, worship and moral principles of the Greek Orthodox Church, as well as the Charter and Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, and that I will fulfill faithfully and sincerely the duties and obligations required of a member of the Parish Council. So help me God
