## This Morning's Readings

### St. Paul's Letter to the Romans 13:11-14, 14:1-4

Brethren, salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

As for the man who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not for disputes over opinions. One believes he may eat anything, while the weak man eats only vegetables. Let not him who eats despise him who abstains, and let not him who abstains pass judgment on him who eats; for God has welcomed him. Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for God is able to make him stand.

## The Gospel According to Matthew 6:14-21

The Lord said, "If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. "And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

### **Addition by Subtraction**

March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020

Last weekend I spoke with our kids at our "Youth Day" and began by asking them to do a "word association." The first word I gave them was "Lent" which of course mostly brought them to the word "fasting." I then asked them how they felt thinking about these words "fasting" and "Lent" and the consensus we came to was basically that, as we approach this Lenten season with our fast on the horizon, we feel this heaviness or sense of obligation. Lent becomes a list of tasks: fast, pray, forgive, do not judge, go to church more.

I then presented them with this quote from Fr. Alexander Schmemman: "Let us stress that the purpose of Lent is not to force on us a few formal obligations, but to soften our heart so that it may open itself to the realities of the Spirit, to experience the hidden 'thirst and hunger' for communion with God." We see that we cannot just go through the motions of these "tasks" but we must let them guide our life to God. We cannot take these things on as tasks because what they really can accomplish in us is a return to what we have been made to do, commune with God. When I am hungry I realize my body is not the most important thing in my life and that I truly could not exist without God. When I pray I communicate with God and ask for Him to be in my life. When I forgive, I imitate God. When I go to Church I join the Body of Christ in offering prayers for the whole world and by extension, myself and witness the presence of Christ.

We focus so much on the "negative" in Lent that we often do not let the positive things come to fruition. Deep inside us we all have a need for communion with God but we bury this with our focus on food, drink, and simply ourselves. Lent allows us to strip away all these other distractions and focus on God. Looking for a way to begin your Lenten journey? Join us tonight at 7pm for Forgiveness Vespers, a special vespers that ends with all those in attendance asking forgiveness from the others so that our Lenten journey will begin on a light note. Can't make it tonight? You're in luck! We have a service every night this week so you have no excuse! See you this week!




