

Sunday, May 5, 2019 - Thomas Sunday

This Morning's Readings

Acts of Apostles 5:12-20

In those days, many signs and wonders were done among the people by the hands of the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high honor. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on beds and pallets, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed. But the high priest rose up and all who were with him, that is, the party of the Sadducees, and filled with jealousy they arrested the apostles and put them in the common prison. But at night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out and said, "Go and stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this Life."

The Gospel according to John 20:19-31

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them: "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them: "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him: "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them: "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe." Eight days later, his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said: "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name.

Pascha and the Counter-Attack

May 1st, 2019

A man named Richard Cole died last month at the age of 103. Cole was the last survivor of the once-famous Doolittle Raid on Tokyo, so named for the bold vision and daring execution of Lt. Col Jimmy Doolittle.

In early 1942, Japan's dominance in the Pacific was unquestioned. Their surprise strike on the U.S. Navy at Pearl Harbor left the USN reeling and the Japanese brimming with confidence. But Doolittle schemed to launch B-25 Mitchell medium bombers from the deck of the U.S. Hornet at the edge of their combat range.

Their lightning attack on Tokyo unsettled the Japanese and shattered the notion that they were safe from an American counter-strike. Military history is replete with stories of overconfident armies letting down their guard to effective and unanticipated counterattacks.

As Christians, we are not immune from this danger. "Having beheld the Resurrection of Christ," and having attended a good many Holy Week services, it is easy for us to fall into complacency. After all, we may think to ourselves, we've done our religious duty for a while and can now "take it easy."

I recall my sense of alarm years ago when a brother priest who was serving as a Metropolis Chancellor told me that Bright Week is when his phone would ring as some of our priests go a little goofy. No one is immune for the enemy's counter strike. Bright Week is a time for heightened vigilance.

Many of us have learned through grim, battle-tested experience that whenever God pours out His grace and blessings upon us, the enemy rushes in to snatch it out of our hands. Satan, knowing full well that he has already lost the war when Jesus blew up Hades and demonstrated the Resurrection, seeks to take as many unsuspecting souls with him to his final doom.

But as savvy warriors, we must understand that the battle within rages ceaselessly. The joy we are experiencing now can be ours throughout the year if we, like the five wise virgins we lauded in Holy Week, remain watchful. Now is not the time to let down our guard! The power of Jesus Christ's victory over sin and death avails forever and not just seasonally!

Let us march triumphantly as soldiers of Christ into the fallen world of shadow and ignorance of God with the hopeful message "Christ is Risen!" in our hearts and on our lips in the days ahead!
