This Morning's Readings

St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians 1:21-24;2:1-4

Brethren, it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has commissioned us; he has put his seal upon us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. But I call God to witness against me - it was to spare you that I refrained from coming to Corinth. Not that we lord it over your faith; we work with you for your joy, for you stand firm in your faith. For I made up my mind not to make you another painful visit. For if I cause you pain, who is there to make me glad but the one whom I have pained? And I wrote as I did, so that when I came I might not suffer pain from those who should have made me rejoice, for I felt sure of all of you, that my joy would be the joy of you all. For I wrote you out of much affliction and anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain but to let you know the abundant love that I have for you.

The Gospel according to Luke 5:1-11

At that time, as Jesus was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, he saw two boats by the lake; but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had ceased speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and as their nets were breaking, they beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he was astonished, and all who were with him, at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

OPEKTIKÓ An appetizer before the main course

Evangelism

September 22nd, 2019

Growing up in Protestant America of the 1960's & 70's, the word "evangelism" was often heard. It described much of the activities that took place in the church community of my youth. The many Christian missionaries who were directly supported by our church brought back to us inspiring accounts of the mighty works of God being accomplished in "foreign" and "exotic "lands.

Closer to home, the "evangelical" imperative was still in play as Billy Graham and others held large "Evangelistic Crusades" where the Gospel message of Salvation in Jesus Christ was delivered to the assembled thousands. I worked as a counselor at one such Billy Graham Crusade in 1982 in my hometown of Indianapolis where I also engaged in street preaching and personal evangelism in the seedier warrens of the downtown area.

However, in the intervening 40 years, the very term "evangelical" has been bleached of its once uniquely Christian context; now more frequently used to describe a voting bloc in the American political landscape. Evangelism has since been supplanted by Universalism. The exclusive claims of Jesus Christ, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life, no one comes to the Father but by Me." (John 14:6) have been swept aside as too narrow, too exclusive. No, (so the spirit of the age responds) "all ways lead to heaven and your path is no different or better than mine or than none at all."

Within Holy Orthodoxy in America, evangelism is commonly looked upon with suspicion if it is considered at all, some even suggesting that to share the message of the Gospel as Christ commanded us as He was Ascending to His Father (see Mark 16) is "unorthodox." But such notions evince a baleful ignorance of both Orthodox Christianity and of the Greek language.

For instance, when the Angels appeared to the shepherd boys to announce the "Good News," (εὐαγγέλιον) the text reads "εὐαγγελίζομαι" lit. "I am well-messaging." The very feast of the Annunciation we celebrate every March 25th is known as Ευαγγελισμός. In other words, these are our words as Greek Orthodox Christians and as such should feel quite at home in our mouths!

Perhaps the most straight-forward definition of evangelism I have encountered was "one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread." As adopted sons and daughters of our merciful God, we seek always to enlarge our family by sharing the Gospel message freely and with conviction; not as a "nice thing to do" but as our charge before God, our "φιλότιμο" or "grateful indebtedness" as Christ-loving Orthodox Christians.

Precisely how each of us engages in personal one-to-one evangelism depends upon the spiritual gifts each of us have received. We held a great seminar yesterday on how we can better evangelize as a Cathedral community. Let us know how we can utilize your spiritual gifts to spread the Good News to those around us.
