

CHAPTER XV

REVELATION 15TH CHAPTER: THE SAINTS IN HEAVEN

The Prophet John saw the great number of saints in view of the throne of God standing on the “Sea of Glass” in heaven. Notice Revelation 7:9-17 **[see appendix]**. As Christ, our mighty Redeemer look upon the saints waving palms and giving praises to our God, the Holy Lamb will then remember his suffering and death on the cross, and shall be satisfied (*Isaiah 53:11 [see appendix]*). At this time the request of Christ is granted, which he made in his prayer at the Garden (*St. John 17:24 [see appendix]*). Again, this writing shall be fulfilled: **“BLESSED ARE THE PURE IN HEART, FOR THEY SHALL SEE GOD.”** (Matthew 5:8).

Now I will show you the 144,000 mentioned in the 7th chapter of Revelation, who were sealed and delivered first to heaven when all of the saints are resurrected and in heaven (*Revelation 14:1-4 [see appendix]*). He (the Lord) will decorate the saints for the great feast in heaven. But before we notice the decoration, let us notice a promise the Lord made to the disciples at the Lord’s Supper (*Matthew 26:29 [see appendix]*), another promise in Revelation 2:7 **[see appendix]**, as well as verse 17 in this same chapter **[see appendix]**. Now about the “hidden manna”, I will show you a remarkable thing as we look in Exodus (*Exodus 16:33 [see appendix]*). We see that the “hidden manna” traces back to Israel of Old when they were delivered from Egypt to the Promised Land and some of it was hidden. This was the “bread from heaven” and Moses will again see it and eat it; and all of the saved, which were with him.

Now let’s notice the decorations of the saints for this great feast (*Revelation 3:5; 2:10 [see appendix]*); also, notice verse Revelation 2:17, last part **[see appendix]**. Here we see white robes are provided for the wedding and a “crown of life” and jewelry, which has a hidden inscription written on it of something that is between Christ and the individual saint.
