### Valley Fliers February Board Meeting

## Approval of January Meeting Minutes

Scott moved to approve as corrected. Richard seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

# Treasurer's Report

See Alan's handouts. It wasn't a great month. We only had two planes flying during January. 36 minimum flying fees, one membership turned over. Our fuel cards actually still work, so we will keep or resume using them now. Hangar rents did increase slightly. The maintenance costs were the 88L manual and some parts. The travel charges were related to Florin flying the seat to Scappoose. The January statements should be viewed as very preliminary because we haven't yet finished closing last year's books. Alan has added back the Air Power check that they are not supposed to cash, but we don't yet have confirmation they've received the core. The costs associated with 9MA's new engine are still shown as Asset Acquisition in progress, but most of that amount will be moved into the value of 9MA and depreciated over time.

Alan did receive the Wa State Reseller Permit. Question from the floor: What is a reseller permit? Answer: it keeps us from having to pay sales tax on things the club buys. Alan is still adjusting to the monthly filing requirement and may have incurred another late filing fee.

Net cash decreased by \$4700 in January. We expect large bills for maintenance on 9MA and 88L during February, so it likely will go down more in February. Question from the floor: How much do we expect from insurance for 9MA? Answer: we already received their payment in the amount of about \$24000. That covered about one third of the total cost of engine and prop. Alan notes 117 will go into annual at the end of February. Jon says 117 may need a seat rail during the annual. It will also need work on the nose strut, and to have the vacuum pumps inspected. Alan suggests we have a class on reading the new JPI engine analyzer.

### Maintenance Officer's Report

Florin was not present so no handout and no report.

Alan discussed the question of whether we should set aside 9MA to work on 88L, or finish out 9MA first. Jon says 9MA still has 3 days or so work to finish. After some discussion the fact that more of our members can fly 88L, particularly with 9MA needing break-in, the consensus was to prioritize 88L.

### Safety Officer's Report

Richard shared that he had a near miss with a Mooney. The Mooney approached from above and the left, so was blocked by the wing. He wondered why he didn't see that plane on the GPS before he got close. He believes he missed the plane in the clutter on the zoomed-out screen. He reminded us to keep up our scans and pay attention. He also reminded us that particularly outside class B, not all planes will have ADS-B and show up.

### **Old Business**

#### **Annual Meeting**

**ByLaw Changes** John distributed draft ByLaw changes to be discussed at the annual meeting. He has withdrawn two proposed changes granting free flight hours to the Treasurer and the Maintenance officer as those could be effected by a vote of the members under the current bylaws. The board will propose motions on that topic at the meeting.

We are discussing an addition to Article 3 that explicitly empowers the board to create or have created operating rules. The draft addition was wordsmithed a bit. Question from the floor: has the club ever done a "Safety Day"? Answer: we haven't but Richard volunteered to work with members to try to organize one.

Next up was a modification to Article 11, section 1.1, adding verbiage that members agree to follow the club operating rules.

Finally, the board discussed a change to Article 14, section 2 allowing the Board to impose financial responsibility for an incident or accident on a responsible member up to the greater of the insurance deductible or the value of a membership share, whichever is greater. Current language limits member responsibility to the insurance deductible. The board answered questions about the proposed language. The intent is to provide the board with flexibility.

**Election** No nominations have been received. Tim will send another solicitation. All current officers intend to re-
