## Valley Fliers September Board Meeting

#### Meeting Called to Order at: 6:3

**Present:** Eyre, Glassmyer, Neville, Vader, DeWitt, Botezatu plus 11 members and 1 potential member.

## **Approval of August Meeting Minutes**

Alan moved to approve as corrected, Richard seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

## Treasurer's Report

See Alan's handouts. It was a busy month. Four memberships turned over in August. The month was not particularly large for August. The Asset Acquisition in Progress line is related to the engine replacement for 9MA. The Washington DoR now is requiring us to file monthly reports. We had a penalty in July for late tax filing, but we may get that refunded. Question from the floor: Why did the sales-by-item summary have non-standard average hourly prices? Alan says it includes zero dollar hour flights for maintenance flights. Prize hours also show as zero dollar hours and those zero dollar hours affect the hourly prices. Question from the floor: have we already paid costs for the new engine? Answer: yes, a deposit, money for the prop, and a few other costs. Alan asked if we had heard from the insurance company? John says yes, he is in active discussions with the adjuster. Question from the floor: Will this cause our insurance rates to rise? Answer: we don't know yet. We just renewed, so we won't see the change for some time.

## Maintenance Officer's Report

See Florin's handouts.

**9MA** had an oil change before its incident.

**117** Jon has the replacement stabilator cap, but it is waiting to be painted. It is coming up on the club-imposed 250 hour annual. Ed noted the nose wheel was off 117 in July of last year.

**88L** has been flying a lot and is due for an annual based on club policy. Florin asks if we should do a 100 hour inspection. Alan asked if we should just do an annual on it. Several members comment that we are already down one plane. John suggests we might want to push it a little past as it is just a club policy. The beacon switch failed, and Jon said the others would likely fail soon. We replaced all the similar panel switches at about \$200 each. Alan asked if there is a giant list for the upcoming annuals? Florin doesn't know off the top of his head. He doesn't remember anything giant on the list. Jon pointed out the 117 nose wheel will need to be rebuilt. Joh has all the parts, but hasn't done it yet.

Scott asked about a 63S cowl fastener. He notes it is loose. Florin added it to his list.

## Safety Officer's Report

Richard said the 9MA report is in its final review. It is a one page summary plus a fair amount of detail. He will provide it to the board, and recommends we distribute it to all members. The team took a lessons-learned approach to the investigation. Richard hopes to send it in the next week or so. Florin asked whether we have suspended his flying rights? Answer: no, we have not. Alan said Posey will put a cover on it. Question from the floor: what happened? John briefly reviewed the sequence of events. Question from the floor: what is our deductible? Answer: zero.

#### Old Business

**9MA Engine and Insurance Update** Richard asked whether we have an approximate time line for the new engine? John says no. We do know the engine is being built. They quoted 2-4 weeks, but after a week and a half they called and said it will be 6-8 weeks. If we'd known Penn Yann was also a dealer, we probably would have booked through them. Florin asked when the clock started? Alan says the invoice shows 8/19. It now looks like 9MA won't be back in service until at least the end of October. Jon wants to pull the engine out sooner rather than later. No objections were raised. Richard asked if Florin and Jon moved the plane when they went down to look at it. Florin says yes. Florin raised questions about the club's response to the incident. Richard says some of

Florin's issues will be addressed in his report. Richard notes the investigation team has discussed the options and limits of the bylaws and will discuss those things in the team's report.

#### New Business

Aircraft Tug / Movement John asked Meg Vader whether or not she could move the airplane if she could see. Meg says she hasn't tried. Jon says we could add lights on the ceiling. Meg says she thinks she could move the plane if she knew where to go. The board seems to believe we could paint new lines. Florin asks who would do the lines? The stencil previously used has been lost. Question from the floor: could we get a little electric pusher? Response: we could get a little cordless-drill driven tug for about \$1500 (plus the drill). John suggests painting the lines is a good first step. Several folks suggest a block and tackle might work to pull it back into the hangar. Richard asks whether or not if a small cheap tug shows up on EBay, it could be seriously considered? John says we should research a tug before trying to jump on it.

#### **Potential New Members**

**Florin** asked whether the club is taking pilots who are taking primary training. **Answer**: yes.

**Will Cole** was in Ohio working so was not present. He is a new pilot with about 75 hours. He just wants to stop renting. John thinks he is renting from Spanaflight now.

**Nick Webb** got his private about a year ago. He has 137 hours. He's been renting out of Renton. Nick is a computer consultant. He consults on AWS. Florin asked whether he would be flying the Cherokee? Nick says both that and the 172R. Question from Ed: where did you take your training? Nick says at a club, "The Aviators". Ed notes that club is moving to Auburn. Florin asks whether Nick will be flying during the week? Perhaps. He is thinking about getting an instrument rating.

Florin asks if we can wait for Will to come to a meeting before approving him? John says we don't want to make members wait to sell their shares. John has spent a lot of time talking with Will. Scott moved to accept both. Richard seconded. The motion carried unanimously.
