# CALL TO ORDER:

The Meeting was called to order by Ann W., the Intergroup Chair, at 9:33am with the Serenity Prayer. There were nine people in attendance.

### **SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

Ann W. entertained a Motion to Approve the October 7, 2023, Kauai Intergroup Business Meeting Minutes as received via email.

Mathea A. Motioned to approve the Minutes as received; Jim D. Seconded the Motion. All in Favor of the Minutes - Unanimous.

# TREASURER'S REPORT:

Ann W. provided the Treasurer's Report for Tom R. in his absence for the month ending October 2023, as follows:

Ann W. reported that the Literature order of \$930.16 is not reflected on the Treasurer's Report, but it will be brought up to date for next month's meeting.

DISCUSSION: Mathea A. stated that \$5000 is too much to have in our bank account; we should send \$3000 to the GSO to make up for the pandemic (they are still in the red). Petey K. mentioned that we still have expenses coming up for the Thank-A-Thon, and Ann W. stated that the balance is really around \$4106 due to the Literature order, AND we are in the hopes of having the GIS Newsletter in business again. Mathea A. chimed in that Linda B. already produced a November copy of the GIS(!), though, Bob F. stated it has not gone to print yet. Mathea A. Motioned to approve the October 2023 Treasurer's Report. Petey K. Seconded the Motion.

# COMMITTEES:

<u>Events</u>: Mike T. reported that Jonathon has been super busy at work and we're behind on the Thank-A-Thon event. Decorations are taken of by Annie and Lori of the Hui Ohana Group, but they need reimbursement. The Kitchen Crew is covered. The Music is being provided by Bruddah D.; Bob F. suggested we pay him \$100 since he's providing all of the microphone and speaker equipment as well. Kopa is cooking the turkeys (x's 6-7) Emu style at Dawn's house. Bob F. said we can buy the turkeys at Costco for \$20 each. Discussion ensued regarding people not signed up for dishes via the QR code, although all areas of the island are assigned what to bring. Ann W. reported that she found Thank-A-Thon supplies packed up at the Literature locker in very good condition. The next Thank-A-Thon meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 12, 2023, at 8:15am.

Bob F. reported on the Men's retreat. It was a nice facility. They lost \$83, which wasn't bad. They want to have it on the same weekend next year, even though it conflicts with the Hawaii Convention. (They women are moving their Retreat to the first weekend in November.)

<u>District</u>: Jim D., Alternate DCM, reported for District. They are doing well on the Inventory, and they are working on the Budget for next year. Nothing more to report.

<u>Hotline</u>: Sean G. reported the Hotline is doing well. There have been some schedule changes (see handout). Sean G. has received the password to update the website for the Hotline information, so <u>it has been updated</u>. They have been working on collecting call information; some of the information collected this week is as follows:

Back to the Type of Calls, Sean G. mentioned that callers sometimes pretend to be looking for the location of a meeting, but they're really looking to find out what a meeting's like. It was agreed, the bottom line is, the Hotline is still useful.

<u>Literature</u>: Ann W. reported for Literature. We placed a much needed order for Literature in the amount of \$930.16, and it has been received. However, the bookcases that store the books have reached the end of their life, so Ann went ahead and ordered two new bookcases for \$66.76, to ensure the health and safety of those working in the Literature locker.

NEW ITEM: Petey K. announced she is willing and available to take on the Intergroup Literature Chair position. She has 6 years and 9 months of sobriety, has served as the Intergroup Representative and GSR for her Home Groups for several years.

Carolyn V. Motioned Petey K. as the new Intergroup Literature Chair.

Mike T. Seconded the Motion.

Ann W. asked for discussion. None offered. The vote was unanimous.

Ann W. announced Petey K. as the new Intergroup Literature Chair.

<u>Schedules</u>: Tom R. not in attendance, but we received new copies last month.

<u>Kapa'a Nooners</u>: John B. reported for this Kapa'a Open Meeting, which meets every Wednesday (Daily Reflections) and Friday (Experience, Strength & Hope), and now beginning November 2023, on Mondays (12x12), at noon, at the Kapa'a First Hawaiian Church.
