Private Confession

???

Martin Luther once said "When I urge you to go to Confession, I am doing nothing else than urging you to be a Christian" (Martin Luther's Exhortation to Confession, 1529).

Certainly we can see numerous examples in the bible of private confession. Like 1 John 1, Psalm 51, and James 5. But one place where we see this played out is in the events of David and Bathsheba in 2 Samuel 12. We know about

the grievous sins that David committed but we often forget about what happens afterwards. The prophet Nathan comes to David, confronts him with his sin, and calls him to repentance. David then confesses his sin and receives absolution. David had done heinous and horrible things! But when he confessed his sin Nathan says "The Lord also has put away your sin; you shall not die." This is private confession! Where we confess our sins, and receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

Luther makes clear in his small catechism "This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22–23) Therefore, we believe that "when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine com-



mand, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

We know from the catechism that the scriptures teach that Pastors possess "The Office of the Keys which is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent." So this all means that when the apostles and therefore Pastors are sent out by Jesus, He gives them the keys to loose (forgive) the sins of penitent sinners and bind (not forgive) the sins of the impenitent so long as they do not repent (Matt 16; Matt 18; John 21).

Because the Scriptures show examples of this, we see this in our Lutheran Confessions. Therefore, private confession is in no way a "roman catholic" practice but it is indeed very Lutheran! To show this, I vowed at his ordination to hear confession and never reveal the sins confessed to me. If I ever did, I would be removed from the ministry. Moreover, you can see in our Small Catechism, the fifth chief part is all about private confession. Then of course the Augsburg Confession teaches that "private confession is not abolished among us" but instead that "private confession ought to be retained in the churches" (Augsburg Confession XXV & XI).



This is a treasure which Jesus has given to His Church through His Pastors to forgive sins and comfort troubled consciences. This is a gift of the Church where Jesus gives you forgiveness so there is no law on how much you can or have to do this but it is a great treasure of the Church and comfort to troubled souls to receive the forgiveness of sins. If you are curious what it looks like, you can see what the Rite of Private Confession looks like in the Lutheran Service Book (LSB) on page 292. And those "confessional booths" you see in TV shows or in the Roman Catholic church weren't invented until around the 1600's. The ancient practice of the Church is to confess your sins at the altar rail.

So, all of that being said, you will notice in the calendar that every Saturday morning from 9-9:30 is now marked with a slotted time for Private Confession. I will be available in the Zion sanctuary for anyone who would like to take advantage of this treasure of the Church.

What about frequency? Well, in the olden days (before the telephone was invented) some of you may remember the language of "announcing for communion". This is when you would come to the pastor every Saturday for confession in preparation to receive communion every Sunday. You are certainly welcome to come that often, but to give you a tip, I and my family try to go monthly, some people go weekly, and some people just go 4 times a year or only in Lent. So if you live in Hiawatha or thereabouts, it's pretty easy to make it every now and then and I highly encourage it. If you don't live in Hiawatha, perhaps if you are making a trip to Walmart or McDonalds on Saturday morning, you can add this to your schedule every now and then. Otherwise, I am happy to meet with you at your home or at any of the sanctuaries of the partnership if another time works better for you.

Jesus gives us this gift for our comfort and consolation that even _____ that awful sin you committed is forgiven and covered by the blood of Jesus. And I can promise you, that when you confess your sins and I place my hands on your head and pronounce God's absolution, there is nothing like it in the world.



Dear Parents and Confirmation Students, Grace to you and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Once again we see summer ending and a new school year beginning. For many this is a bittersweet time...a mixture of mourning the loss of summer freedom coupled with an enthusiasm for what we will experience this year. For others the excitement of a new school year far outweighs the Rest and Relaxation you may be leaving behind.

Now I know you see the importance of secular school...for a good education is vital in today's society. In our ultra-competitive world the employers are seeking the very best employees. Consequently, both parents and children realize you must do well in school in order to get a good job with growth potential; but, what about Confirmation?

Confirmation, as you know, is that public rite of the Church preceded by a period of Biblical instruction, or catechesis, designed to help baptized Christians learn to identify with the life and mission of the Christian community.
