WHY BELIEVE THE BIBLE? PART II

The witness of the Dead Sea Scrolls, the Martyrs and Apostles



1 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. 2 And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. 3 And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.4 And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness.5 And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day. 6 And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.7 And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so.8 And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day.

Dead Sea Scrolls

Last time we spoke of the reliability of the copies of the bible. One of these sets of copies is called the "Dead Sea Scrolls". They are copies of biblical documents—still being discovered and studied—that were found in caves by the Dead Sea in 1947. Most of the biblical documents found range from 250BC to 68AD. Many think that the bible has been changed to have errors or revisions, but the Dead Sea Scrolls prove them wrong. For example, you will notice in the photo a copy of a fragment of Genesis found at the Dead Sea Scrolls. In which we found copies of books of the bible that were hidden and untouched for a thousand years. So many of the dead sea scrolls match up identically with our copies of the bible so well it is almost beyond belief. Speaking of Isaiah 53 found in the Dead Sea Scrolls, one scholar said *Of the 166 words in Isaiah 53, there are only seventeen letters in question. Ten of these letters are simply a matter of spelling, which does not affect the sense. Four more letters are minor stylistic changes, such as conjunctions. The remaining three letters comprise the word "light," which is added in verse 11, and does not affect the meaning greatly.* Thus the dead sea scrolls teach how God's word can be trusted.

Martyrs and Apostles

Finally, we have the witnesses of the Martyrs and the Apostles. The martyrs are those who suffered death for believing in Jesus and refusing to deny him. We just named our baby Anastasia after one of these martyres—Sainte Anastasia who was martyred in the early 300's. She was one of these faithful Christians who refused to deny Jesus and instead faced death for it. This is a testimony to the reliability of the history of the bible: that these sainted martyrs believed the message of Christ to be the only truth that mattered. The willingness of these individuals to suffer and die reveals the sincerity of their faith. For, one can hardly die for that which he believes to be a myth. Stories are easily abandoned, but the truth is not. The martyrs went to flame and sword and gallows without denying the Jesus who died for them.

However, the most important of the martyrs are the Apostles themselves—all of whom, except Saint John, died by martyrdom. Consider how Saint Paul himself is evidence for the truth of Christianity. St Paul starts writing his Epistles only around a decade after the resurrection! And when he writes, he is writing letters to an already existing and thriving Christian Church. This man who was the chief persecutor of the Church became the one who proclaimed its message so boldly. All of the apostles were eyewitnesses of the truth of Christ, witnessed his miracles, heard his teaching, witnessed his resurrection, and were sent out by him to proclaim these realities so that all might believe. They were imprisoned and beaten for preaching this message, and yet they continued to repeat the same words. Regardless of what suffering befell them, they did not change their message, nor did they recant their witness. Charles Colson once said that the Watergate Scandal proved to him the scriptures were reliable. He said "12 men testified they had seen Jesus raised from the dead, then they proclaimed that truth for 40 years, never once denying it. Every one was beaten, tortured, stoned and put in prison. They would not have endured that if it weren't true. Watergate embroiled 12 of the most powerful men in the worldand they couldn't keep a lie for three weeks. You're telling me 12 apostles could keep a lie for 40 years? Absolutely impossible."

The apostles themselves knew how important this eyewitness testimony was. So much in fact that they made it one of the single requirements for someone to be an apostle. When replacing Judas they said that the replacement had to be one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²² beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." Acts 1:21-22

Apostolic witness, eye-witness accounts, assure us of the truth of the Scriptures. We have the inerrant Word of God because He has preserved it for us to this day and we can and should trust the bible. We have all of these things written "that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ the Son of God and that by believing, we may have life in His name" (John 21:31).

Sunday School at St. Paul starts after the service at 9:30am.


