There is something special about the Season of Advent. Imagine, if you will, that you are a faithful Jew living 2,000 years ago and that for thousands of years your people have been praying to God for deliverance. Then one day, His prophets told you that He was sending a Messiah, the Christ, to come to save you. You believe His promise and so you wait...and you wait... for that day to come. As you wait, you pray...and you pray... for that day to come.

During your wait, you wondered if God had forgotten about you, or if perhaps He had changed His mind. Sometimes we may feel like saying to God, and maybe even do say, "How long do we have to wait? Where is our deliverance?" In that sense, we really aren't too different from the faithful who waited for the First coming of Jesus. But yet, there is one huge difference between them and us. And that is, my friends, that we have been more blessed than the Jews of thousands of years ago, for we have received much more than God's promise...we have seen the promise fulfilled, in our Lord Jesus Christ. So, do we still have to wait? Yes, we do. Do we still have to wrestle with living in this fallen world? Yes, we do. Do we still have to call out to God in our tears and anguish? Yes, that too has not changed, and will not change in our life here on earth. But dear friends, what has changed is this —

you and I have the honor and privilege of actually getting to hold our Deliverer in our hands, each and every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper, and to be reassured in doing so that our deliverance has come. We get to hear Him speak His words of comfort and hope and joy and peace. We have Jesus!

For us, Advent is still a time to long for Jesus...to long for Him to return again to redeem all of heaven and earth. This is God's promise to you and to me. He fulfilled this promise in Christ and one day, you and I will see it with more than our eyes of faith...you and I will physically and visually witness His return. But until that day, our mouths must say what our hearts continue to pray, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel and ransom captive Israel."

Sunday School at St. Paul starts after the service at 9:30am.





Color is everywhere. Color is God's way of filling his world with beauty and giving pleasure to those who live in this colorful world. For centuries, Christians have used color in divine worship to emphasize the redemptive action of God through His Son. Color, just like music, plays an important role in the life of God's worshiping people.

Since we are just beginning a new church year, let's look at the parament color for Advent. Blue is the more contemporary color increasingly used by many congregations in their observance of a new church year. Some churches still follow the older tradition of using purple for Advent and Lent. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. Blue, the color of the sky, helps convey that powerful message. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in history assuming our flesh, will also return on the last day of time from that same blue sky he ascended to long ago.



Second Sunday of Advent. Light 1st and 2nd candles in order.

Scripture (Isaiah 11:1-10)

Prayer: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to make ready the way of Your only-begotten Son, that by His coming we may be enabled to serve You with pure minds; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Third Sunday of Advent. Light the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd (rose) candles in order

Scripture (Isaiah 9:2-7, 40:3-5, 7:14-15):

Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, we implore You to hear our prayers and to lighten the darkness of our hearts by Your gracious visitation; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fourth Sunday of Advent. Light all the candles in order

Scripture (Luke 1:24-33, 2:1-6)

Prayer: Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come and help us by Your might, that the sins which weigh us down may be quickly lifted by Your grace and mercy; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

The Jesse Tree is a time-honored Advent tradition that traces the Old Testament lineage of Jesus through images and symbols.

images and symbols.

The idea of a Jesse tree stems from a prophecy in the Book of Isaiah: "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a branch will bear fruit." (Isaiah 11:1)

Jesse was the father of David, one of Israel's greatest kings. When David died, God's people waited for another king to emerge from his family line. Many generations later, Jesus was born.

These 19 Jesse Tree symbols represent key biblical figures and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The symbols can be cut out and hung on a branch or tree, or used as two-dimensional ornaments pasted on a large tree drawing.

Apple

The apple reminds us of the forbidden fruit that Adam and Eve ate in the Garden of Eden.



Ark of the Covenant

The Ark of the Covenant held the Ten Commandments. It also is a name we call Mary.



Bethlehem

Jesus was born in Bethlehem, a small town whose name means "House of Bread."



Sword of Judith

With the help of God, Judith saved the Israelites from the Assyrian army. Her faith precedes Mary's.



Altar of Holocaust

The Altar of Holocaust is where Moses made a sacrifice of burnt offerings to God.



Crown and Scepter

We remember during Advent that Jesus is our king.



Jacob's Ladder

Jacob dreamed of a ladder with angels that extended from heaven to earth.



Jonah and the Whale

Jonah was stuck in the whale for three days, prefiguring Jesus in the tomb for three days.



Tablets of the Law

The laws (Commandments) were given by God to Moses at Mount Sinai.



Burning Bush

God revealed himself to Moses through a burning bush.



Paschal Lamb

The Jews sacrificed a lamb as a symbol of their release from slavery. Jesus is the "Lamb of God."



Manna

As the Israelites traveled to the Promised Land, God provided

The six-pointed star represents the royal house of David.
