From the Pastors Study
Saint Martin's Day, 2022
Do you have an Advent Wreath?
John said "The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome Him" (John 1:5). Jesus is the Light of the World (John 8:12) so Christmas is about when the Light of the World was born. Because of that, much of our Christmas celebration and decoration surrounds lights. The days are darker so we need more lights-we have Christmas trees, Christmas lights, and advent wreaths.


In 1 Corinthians 9:25, Saint Paul wrote, "Every athlete exercises selfcontrol in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable." The image of the advent wreath is the image of a crown of victory. As our Victor, Christ has won the wreath for us. In His death our sins are atoned for and we see the fullest of his divine love. In His death, we have victory. In the Revelation of Saint John, chapter 4, we hear of the 24 elders who stand before the throne of God with wreaths on their heads. Having been united with Christ, we wear that wreath of which John speaks. So our Advent wreaths refer to the victory wreath, which does not wither through death but rather remains eternal, because God Himself places it on our heads.

As a whole, the candles represent the advent (the coming) of the Light of the world as with each week the wreath becomes brighter. As Christians, our lives, our families, our souls, and our homes are to be filled with the light of Christ. Jesus says that you are the light of the world (Matt. 5:14). You are the light of the world because you are in Him who is the light of the world (John 8:12). Nobody has to do this, but it is a nice tradition that teaches us about Jesus (as all good traditions do). In this tradition, we see our homes filled with growing light and warmth each week of Advent until we anticipate the celebration of the coming of the Light of the World. In these short and darker days, our evenings are lit by the light of the Advent wreath until we celebrate the Light that shines forth from the Child in the manger. Jesus Christ is the Light of the World, the Light no darkness can overcome, and this is the confession made by the Advent wreath.

## How?

Here's how it works. On the first day of Advent (Nov 27), Christian families have historically set up an Advent wreath. This is a wreath of greenery adorned by a set of four candles. Typically, three violet or blue colored, and one rose-colored to match the vestments the pastor wears for each of the 4 Sundays in Advent. One candle on the first Sunday, two on the second, three on the third (this is the pink one), and then all four on the last Sunday of Advent. The wreath is often set up on the dining room table and the respective candle(s) are lit for dinner and evening prayer each week. At midnight on Christmas Eve, the Advent wreath has a white "Christ candle" placed in the middle. This Christ Candle is used until Epiphany (Jan 6).

## Why?

After our people had come out of Egypt, Moses told them "When your son asks you in time to come, 'What is the meaning of the testimonies and the statutes and the rules that the Lord our God has commanded you?' then you shall say to your son, 'We were Pharaoh's slaves in Egypt. And the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand." (Deut 6:20-21). So when your children ask you about why the Church does certain things-like the advent wreath-you can tell them it is because we were slaves in sin but Christ has come, born of Mary, to redeem us with a mighty hand nailed to the cross. The Church is all about catechesis and that is what traditions like these are so good at doing. They teach. This is part of the heritage we have been given to pass on to our children. So that every Advent, they might be reminded of who Jesus is, what He has done for them, and the importance of this wreath of victory He has placed on their heads.
