

A Few Thoughts from Pastor

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD, your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster. Joel 2:12-13



During Advent we prepared for His coming, and during Christmas we celebrated that God had taken on our flesh and become Man. During Epiphany we marveled and rejoiced in the fact that the Baby, the Boy, the Man Jesus IS God (literally Immanuel – God with us)!



And now we are in the midst of the "gesima" Sundays, a two and

a half week "pre-Lent" if you will, during which we prepare ourselves for the 40 days leading up to Easter; a preparatory season for the preparatory (& penitential) season of Lent. And when we prepare well ... oh what joy Easter morning will bring.

Now forty days is not an insignificant amount of time. A 40-day trip or vacation would likely require a fair amount of forethought and preparation, and so we too would do well to prepare for our upcoming 40-day (from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday after Good Friday ... not counting Sundays) Lenten "journey."

And the reason for our pre-Lent (and Lenten) preparations and special efforts and self- discipline? Well, nothing more than that we might arrive again at Easter in a manner befitting God's holy people; that we might bask in the glorious glow of new life on Easter morning and add our voices to those of the angels, archangels, and all the saints who have gone before us as we sing loud Alleluias to the King of all creation!



So during Lent we prepare for Easter, and on Easter (and every "little" Easter or Sunday thereafter) we celebrate! We celebrate our Lord and Savior's life, death, AND resurrection. We celebrate His victory over sin, death, and the devil FOR US; His victory (and by grace, our victory) and triumph over all our enemies. We celebrate His accomplished work of salvation even as we continue to look forward to His return. We celebrate and proclaim, "Alleluia, Alleluia, Christ is risen!"

Hours: 8:00am-1:00pm Tuesday, Thursday Closed Friday And so, to that Easter-focused end, I invite (& challenge) you to prepare for Lent during this time of "pre-Lent." Prayerfully consider how you might better prepare yourself this year. Consider how you might find or make more time to seriously consider and ponder our Lord's passion and all its implications. Ask yourself how you might reflect on your own sins and life to better prepare to hear once again of our Savior's death and resurrection. And remember, without a little extra effort and planning the 40 days of Lent will likely fly by, and while you probably won't "miss" Easter, you may not be as prepared for it as you could (or should) be, either.

So, am I just wanting everybody to simply give something up for Lent as some people do (or at least talk about doing)? No, not really, although such measures can be a helpful way of disciplining our bodies to remind ourselves that we *are not* slaves to our earthly wants and desires. And I suppose if you were really set on "giving something up" I might suggest "giving up" your normal Wednesday evening plans and replacing them with our mid-week Lenten services. There we will focus on our Lord's passion and suffering and we will consider and ponder the implications of all that surrounds His suffering and death; and we will be reminded of our great sin AND His even greater love.

And then, in addition to gathering with the rest of the church on Wednesday evenings, you may want to consider devoting yourself to prayer a little more each day during Lent. Pick a time (morning, evening, or something convenient) and a prayer (Lord's Prayer, Luther's morning or evening prayer, collect of the week, psalms, etc.) and spend some time just talking to God each day. Pray for a different family member or friend each day, or just pray for your pastor (God knows he needs and covets such prayers).



Give And if you'd really like to be prepared, might I suggest reading a chapter (or more) from the Bible each day, or digging out your old catechism and reading about a fortieth of it each day. Or find your old Bible History book and reread the stories you once learned as a child. Or start going to Sunday morning Bible class. Just find or do something this Lenten season to better prepare yourself for Easter.

Pray And if you miss a day or forget ... don't quit!!! ... just start again, right away, and soon it may become a habit, a very good habit, one that helps keep you connected

with God through His Son, Jesus Christ. It's how the Spirit works, through His Word; it's how He makes and keeps you holy. I guess that makes the Spirit the "*Holyfier*" ... but that's a thought for another newsletter And if you need help or direction or encouragement, let me know, that's part of what I've been sent here to do.

Scripture records that Jesus once fasted and prayed in the wilderness for 40 days, and He was tempted just as we are ... and so I'll leave you this month with the words of this Lenten hymn:

O Lord, throughout these forty days You prayed and kept the fast; Inspire repentance for our sins, And free us from our past.

> You strove with Satan, and You won; Your faithfulness endured; Lend us Your nerve, Your skill and trust In God's eternal Word.

> Though parched and hungry, yet You prayed And fixed Your mind above; So teach us to deny ourselves, Since we have known God's love.

Be with us through this season, Lord, And all our earthly days, That when the final Easter dawns, We join in heaven's praise.

Stewardship



Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper - down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.






