Spotlight on a Saint: John the Baptist



Advent is a time in which much focus is put on Saint John the Baptist since he heralds the first advent of our Lord. John is one of the few people in the Bible whom we get to so much of his life. 400 years before he was born, his birth and ministry were prophesied (Mal 3:1). His nativity is announced by an archangel (Luke 1:5-15). He leaps for joy as an unborn child when he gets close to the unborn Jesus (Luke 1:39-45). We see his nativity and childhood (Luke 1:57-80), we see his ministry at the Jordan river (Mark 1. Matt 3, John 1), we have the account of his martyrdom (Matt 14, Luke 7) and we even have descriptions of the clothes he wore and the food he ate (Matt 3:4). No one in the bible gets that much attention besides Jesus. John is a huge deal.

But John worked no mighty miracles. He had neither wife no child nor a place he could call home. He lived in the desert and ate insects and honey. He dressed in rough fashion reminiscent of Elijah (in whose spirit he served Luke 1:17). His ministry only lasted a year and a half and he was jailed for criticizing King Herod calling him out for sin. After John was martyred, his disciples went to Jesus. Why? Because that is what John had taught them to do. To go to Jesus and to hear from Him the words that will sustain when all else fails. As the forerunner of Christ, when John died we must wonder if he went to the dead and proclaim to them "Fear not! The Death of death, the Lamb of God lives! For I have seen him and soon he will bring light to those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death. He will free us, raise us, and bring us into His Kingdom!"? One can only wonder.

Jesus says that John the Baptist was the greatest saint who ever lived. And John's preaching is summed up as he points his disciples and us to Jesus and cries out "Behold! The Lamb of God! Who takes away the sin of the world." (John 1:29), this preaching that still echoes through the church.

In honor of John and for the edification of the congregations of the Northeast Kansas Partnership, I will be starting a publishing press and tract series named after him in which I will publish VBS material, Sunday school material, devotional aids, etc for the use of our churches. But the first order of business will be a series of tracts for households to take and read. This will aid in the catechesis and edification of the congregations and like John the Baptist, point us to the Lamb of God. Many of these will cover questions I have received or topics I want you all to know about. But if there is a particular topic you would like to see covered in a tract, please let me know. Why is this titled "Saint John the Baptist Press"? Saint John the Baptist is a man who encapsulates the names of all four congregations in the Partnership. He was the **First** man to point out the Lamb of God as **Immanuel** (John 1:29) of whom **Saint Paul** would preach about Christ and Him Crucified on Mount **Zion** (1 Cor 2:2).

Some of these tracts will be specific to certain churches so as to explain particular architecture or sacred art contained in a particular sanctuary but all will be available in every church. These will be posted at your sanctuary and will rotate new ones over time. Please take them as they come as I pray they will edify you, strengthen your faith, and point you to the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.



The Zion Adult Bible Class and the First Adult Bible Class meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15am. Please come join us!!




