A Few Thoughts from Pastor

Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking Him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes. I prayed to the LORD my God and made confession, saying, "O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love Him and keep His commandments, we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from Your commandments and rules. We have not listened to Your servants the prophets ..." Daniel 9:3-6a

Last week I "marked" a number of you with an ashen cross on your forehead (or hand) as we gathered to con-



fess our sinfulness on Ash Wednesday. And thus began the penitential season of Lent; and I think Daniel would have approved. We certainly didn't do it to be noticed by others, and it didn't mark us as better Christians than others, but it was a part of our worship that day as we returned to the Lord with mourning over our lack of righteousness.

And by the crosses that darkened our brows that day I pray we were reminded of our mortality (*for you are dust, and to dust you shall return ... Genesis 3:19*) even as we lamented the blackness of our sin. And so we began our Lenten journey.

It is sometimes said that we Lutherans know how to "do" Lent. Acknowledging our sin, its horrific cost, and renewing our focus and attention on Jesus Christ and His substitutionary work on our behalf is at the very heart of our Lenten devotion. The Lenten hymns tell the story so well, and they invite us to ponder once again the significance of all those incredible events associated with our Lord's arrival in Jerusalem and all that followed leading up to His death and burial.

And focused on His cross and suffering, we see rightly, with Spirit-created eyes of faith, the result and seriousness of our sin. But we also see God's great (and undeserved) love for His creation and for all mankind. He did it all for us! He sent His Son, He took on our humanity to suffer and die, and He works tirelessly to point us to the Savior there on the cross to make (& keep) us holy.

There are probably numerous words that one might use to describe a proper attitude for Lent, but I pray that right at the top of any such pile of words would be **HUMILITY**. We didn't / we don't / we will not ever deserve what God so graciously promised, *and then <u>did</u> (& does)*, for us. It's all gift, by grace (God's undeserved love), and it's all on account of Jesus and all that He endured and did/does for us.

Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done.

The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

"You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other" (SC I).

Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

Keeping this commandment, and all of the commandments, is a lot easier if you see your chastity and your spouse **as a gift from God** that is to be protected and cherished. In the same way, you will find keeping the Fourth Commandment easier if you see your parents and other authorities as a gift from God, given to you for your blessing.

This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes.

All these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God's purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church, and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and open-handed generosity.

Sarah said she has Convention t-shirts if anyone would like to purchase one, they are \$20.00.

We will be having a "Gifts from the Heart" box in the narthex. Please bring food to be donated to Trinity Food Pantry in Hiawatha. Suggestions were soup, low salt items, cake mix and canned meat. The box will be in the back for a few weeks. (Last year the food collected was taken to Sabetha food pantry).

We talked about Lenten meals and decided Sadie Meyer could work out the details and she will contact the ladies with more information. Easter Breakfast was also talked about—Leslie Brockhoff and Becky Meyer will be getting together to organize something for after church on Easter morning (March 31st). President Sarah announced the Spring Event will be held in Wathena on April 6, 2024.

Leslie and Evan Brockhoff served delicious cinnamon rolls, coffee cakes, and cherry bars with coffee and water after church for everyone before the Prayer Service.

Next month, March 3rd, our Bible Study Leader is Leslie Brockhoff. Hostesses are Becky and Sadie Meyer.

Altar committee for March and April are Becky and Sadie Meyer. Our closing song was "Go, My Children, With My Blessing". The Prayer Service offering went to LCMS National Offering.

A Mustard Seed devotion entitled "Rejoice" was read, and the meeting was closed with prayer.

St. Paul-Zion Dual Parish Committee Meeting Minutes February 12, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Dwight Meyer at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Kurt Killman, Lela Middendorf, Darryl Hoppe, Virginia Freese, Galen Meyer, Pastor Holle, Mark Meyer, Dwight Meyer, Dwight Kruse, Nancy Manche, Leon Wissmann and Jeff Brockhoff.

Opening Prayer – Pastor Holle led us in an opening prayer.

Agenda - Leon moved and Kurt seconded to approve agenda as is. Motion passed. Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes – Lela moved to approve minutes with two corrections – Mark Meyer second. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Holle provided a schedule of services for the upcoming year. He also provided Lenten Mid-week Services for 2024. Ascension services will be held on May 9th at Zion at 7:00. Pastor will be gone on July 7th on vacation. He is looking for someone to serve the pulpit.

Treasurer's Reports – Jeff presented a report for everyone to look at Pastor's salary according to the District Guidelines The District recommends a 3.7% cost of living raise for all workers. He presented a budget for the Dual Parish totaling \$125,151.00. This would be \$62,575.50 per church.

The phone number for the Northeast Kansas Partnership has been disconnected. The cost of the internet is be paid by both St. Paul and Zion.

Credit cards have been issued to Pastor Holle, Sue Beyer and Jeff Brockhoff. The fee for the card is \$95.00 a year. Jeff pointed out that they can earn points on purchases. Credit card points can be used on Amazon and there are limitations on where you can use the points. Kurt moved to accept Treasurer's reports. Galen seconded and the motion which passed. Pastor and Sue had talked about Zion possibly having a credit card. At this time is was deemed not necessary.

Elder's Reports – Galen talked about the 15 minute radio spot on Sundays. The amount would be \$1755.00 a year for 52 weeks. This is a year long contract. Galen moved to proceed and Kurt seconded the motion which passed. Leon moved that Pastor be given a salary of \$84,000.00 with appropriate benefits retro to the first of the year. This amounts to \$8729.85 a month or \$4364.93 for each congregation retro to first of year with five weeks of vacation. Galen seconded the motion. It was noted that Pastor Holle is trying to take Fridays off. Motion passed.

Old Business

Website – Jeff reported that the newsletters are out on the new website – there are calendars for each church and he continues to work on it. Pastor would like to give information when he does his radio spots. Jeff will let Pastor know when everything is up and ready to go live. Sue will be running it once Jeff has everything ready to go.

New Business:

Future Meeting Dates – The attendance numbers will be looked at in June and possibly adjusted at the September Joint meeting. The Dual Parish Committee will meet on Monday, September 16. At that time, the Dual Parish Agreement will be reviewed for any possible changes. The September Joint Dual Parish meeting will be held on September 29. The location is to be determined as this is also a fifth Sunday.

Meeting adjourned at 8:31 p.m. with Pastor Holle closed with prayer.

Tenderhearts are working to complete their Our Heritage Badge, which focuses on learning about our country's early history.


