From Pastor's Study Maundy Thursday—2022

People of the 8th Day

All over the city of Rome, you will find many places where there is an 8 spoked wheel etched into the wall or ground. Hidden in that 8 spoked wheel is the ancient Greek acronym: IXTHYS. In ancient Greek, the word simply means "fish," but each letter also stands for the initial letter of each word in Jesus' longer title—Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior ($\eta \sigma \sigma \delta \zeta \mathbf{X} \rho \sigma \sigma \delta \mathbf{Y} i \delta \zeta \mathbf{C} \omega \tau \eta \rho$). If you look closely at the picture, you could probably spot all those letters! Many think that these are hidden all over the city to mark the places where the local church was. This 8 spoked wheel with the acronym of Jesus marked the place where the people of the 8th day worshipped!

"On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb". This sentence began our Gospel for Easter. Jesus was dead for 3 days before He rose so don't be confused about that. "The first day" is speaking of what day of the week it took place on not how many days He was dead.

When the Bible speaks of the days of the week, it will use the numbering system from Genesis 1. What that means is that the Bible uses the language of "on the 1st day", "on the 3rd day" "the 7th day" etc for the days of the week. When the Gospel says "on first day of the week", it means Sunday. It was the first day of creation in which God said "LET THERE BE LIGHT" and it is the first day of the new creation when Christ, the Light of the world emerged from His tomb. So if Sunday is the first day, Saturday is the 7th day, which makes the Sunday after it the 8th day. This is why Christians from the very beginning have gathered together every Sunday for the worship of God and the receiving of His Word and Sacrament. Because Christ rose on the 8th day (Sunday), since the Resurrection, the Church has always gathered for Christ's word and sacrament every Sundays (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:2; Rev. 1:10; Mark 16:2; Luke 24:1; John 20:1, 19). We are the people of the 8th day.

The First day of the old creation is the 8th day of the new creation. Sunday to Saturday is 7 days. Which means that the next day—the Sunday—is the 8th Day. From ancient times the number 8 has been the symbol of the Resurrection, for it was on the day after the Sabbath, and so the 8th day, that Christ rose from the tomb. Furthermore, the 7 days of the week are the image of the time of this world, and the 8th day of life everlasting. Sunday is the liturgical commemoration of the 8th day, at the same time a memorial of the Resurrection and a prophecy of the world to come. For something deeper, some of you may know about 666 which is often called the "number of the beast". But it really isn't a big deal. If you add up all the Hebrew letters of the word *beast* or *Nero Caesar*, you get six-hundred and sixty six. Really not a big deal. What is a big deal is that if you add up the letters of Jesus' name you get eight hundred and eighty eight! The three fold number of the new creation found in the name of Christ.



Simply put, the number 8 has always been an image of new life, new creation, and baptism. Think of how many people were on the ark? (1 Peter 3:18-21). What day did circumcisions take place on? (Lev 12:3; Luke 2:21). This is also why Baptismal fonts are often 8 sided because it is there we receive new life. Because of what Jesus did on the 8th day, the Church lives in an Eternal 8th Day. The resurrection on the 8th day shows that Jesus is fixing everything, making all things new (Rev 21:5), and swallowing up death forever (Is 25:8). Sunday is when we remember that 8th day. Sunday is at the same time a memorial of the Resurrection and a prophecy of the Eternal world to come. Let us rejoice in what Christ has done for us on the 8th Day as He has made us His people.

SUNDAY SCHOOL


We invite all kids to come and join us for Sunday School!

The Zion Adult Bible Class and the First Adult Bible Class meet on Sunday mornings at 9:15am. Please come join us!!



A motion was made, seconded and carried to purchase one new long table for the church fellowship hall.


Items for the college student goody bags will be collected this week and given to the college students.
