Trust the Process

Dear Saints of the Northeast Kansas Lutheran Church Partnership. Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, Amen.

When I was younger I had a pastor who suddenly announced to our congregation that he was going to soon retire. I expected we'd have a retirement pot-luck party, some gag gifts and that he'd have a great send off. It wasn't like that.

His retirement get-together was what you might call 'bitter-sweet.' It was bitter in that we were all deep down sad that he was leaving us; even though we were, at the same time, happy that he would now, in his retirement years, have some time for himself and an opportunity to spend more time with loved ones. We were preoccupied with our thoughts on how we'd ever replace him and how long that might take.

Now, in view of my own impending retirement, I better understand how he must have felt as he was retiring from full time Church Work at Trinity. What now? God only knows. We must faithfully and prayerfully wait for God to disclose that. No matter what, you know that the Lord who brought you together all those years ago will not abandon any of you now. Whether you remain a quad Parish or form some other sort of partnership, He will be with you and see that you are fed and nourished through His Word and Sacraments. If change is necessary, remember that it is most often good for us in the long run. Remember too that 'change' often comes through a divinely established 'process' and that it doesn't occur according to 'our' time table; but rather God's.

Yes, 'Change,' quite frequently comes as a 'process, as we see in 1st Samuel 16 when God came to Samuel and told him, "I've rejected Saul as king. Go to the tribe of Jesse where I have chosen one of his sons to be king." Now Samuel was a prophet, but it didn't take a prophet to assume that anointing another king while Saul was on the throne might not go all that well. Thus Samuel responded to God that he would be killed if Saul found out. God then instructed that he, "Take a cow and put together a sacrifice and invite Jesse and his sons to that sacrifice." Samuel did. And as planned, Jesse, his sons, and the whole town showed up to watch it. As Samuel watched Jesse's sons arrive, he had a hunch about who Yahweh had in mind to be the new king.

In Verse 6 Scripture tells us that, "When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed stands here before the Lord." Samuel apparently rationalized that since Eliab was the oldest and of impressive stature that he would be the logical choice, as well as first in line to receive his father's inheritance. But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

So, one after the other, each of Jesse's sons passed in front of Samuel. How about this one? No.

This one? Nope. This one? Nope. Finally, after all seven had passed in front of him, Samuel asked Jesse, "Are there any more?!"

To that Jesse's answered: "There is still the youngest." "He is tending the sheep." "Send for him, Samuel said; we will not sit down until he arrives."

So, Jesse sent for his youngest son, David, and had him brought in. He was glowing with health and had a fine appearance and handsome features. Then the Lord said, "Rise and anoint him; this is the one."

Now, after the anointing, one would assume that David would take the throne immediately...that is what would happen if we were in charge or if it was a human Hollywood production; however, God's process isn't always as predictable as ours. Saul was **not** instantly kicked off the throne, and David was **not** immediately carried in on the shoulders of his people to begin ruling that day. Instead, Samuel anoints David, and then the story stops for a while. "Why, you ask?" ...Because, this change was part of a 'process.'

When this part of the story ends, the Bible tells us that David went back to watching the sheep. If you are tempted to say... "Well, that doesn't make any sense! Why would God anoint him and then send him back to where he had him before? What was the point of anointing David before He was ready to make David king? ... don't.

For God anointed David well before he was ready to appoint him King because God wanted to take David through a 'process...' through a series of actions or steps, in order to achieve a particular goal. David's anointing was essentially a 'reminder' of the promise that the 'process' would fulfill.

God knew that some things needed to happen in David's life before he could be king. Likewise, there are some things that need to happen in our lives, and perhaps in your walking together in this Partnership, before you can step into what God has in store for you.

David could easily have developed an attitude in his waiting. But, he doesn't. Why? Because he knew that God was using the process to bring His plan to fruition.

Believe in God's promises and His processes. Don't be lured into unbelief by people who say, "But, I had faith, and God didn't do it." Or by people who say they're frustrated because they thought God said it would happen and it hasn't yet. Or by people who say, I 'had' faith.

Such faithless or past-tense statements reveal a terrible ignorance concerning how faith works. If you think you can have faith one moment, and have your faith go away when nothing happens, it's not faith at all. Faith is what keeps you going *until* you see God do what He intends to do. Faith causes you to say, "I may not have seen it yet, but I am sure I will!"

I don't know what God has in store for me in the weeks, months or years ahead, but in His time, I will. I've had His anointing, but remain waiting my next appointment. In a similar way, David had the anointing to be king, but God hadn't yet given him his appointment.

That David could see the anointing. That other people could see the anointing. That everyone was watching when Samuel poured the oil over David's head and anointed him as King, that is where things became sticky. When you can see your anointing; that you've been set apart, that you're a better salesperson than anyone else, that you're a great singer, that you have influence, that you can counsel, that you can lead others and that other people can see it, too...people who tell you how talented you are and how far you will go...that is when you are tempted to think, "Well, if I can see it, and others can see it, why can't God see it?! What is He waiting for?"

He could be waiting for your vision to improve...for your comments betray you and show that you can't see the forest for the trees...you can't see what is happening all around you because you are focusing on a light at the end of a tunnel... that you going through a process in which He is preparing you for what's in store.

If you can't see what God is doing in and around you because you are focused on something else, you can entirely miss out on what God has planned for you.

So, dear friends, keep your focus on God and wait for Him. Trust in Him only. He hasn't ever failed you. Fellow Redeemed, it has been an honor. Thank You and God Bless You all!


