Revision Tips:

- Little and often works well with English revision. Complete short bursts of revision 3-4 times a week for 20-30 minutes at a time.
- Read, cover, write, check, correct - Read a section of your Knowledge Organiser and when you're ready, cover it up and write down as much information as you can remember. Then check your work using your Knowledge Organiser and correct any mistakes or add any information missed. You could repeat this task until you remember all the key information.
- Flash Cards: These are great for examination preparation and especially good for you at home to support you with your revision. On one side write a question from your subject. This can be an examination style question or facts on a topic from the Knowledge Organiser. On the other side bullet point the answer.
- Mind Mapping: Mind maps are a great way of getting information in and out of your brain. You could create a mind map for one section of your Knowledge Organiser with a key theme in the middle and then you can branch off with all your thoughts and ideas linked to this. To help this stick you could use colours, keywords, and images. Alternatively, you could create mind map for a whole topic or unit, getting everything down you can remember and then colour coding it to make links between key pieces of information.
- Knowledge Drop: This is a great task for knowledge recall from a previous lesson or a topic studied some weeks ago. Simply write down all the points you can remember about a topic, it could be a spider diagram, or a bullet pointed list. You can then check what you have remembered by using your Knowledge Organiser or exercise books.
- Clock Learning/Revision Clocks: For this technique you need to draw a simple clock with twelve sections. Divide the subject you are learning/revising into twelve chunks and write the title of each chunk in a different section. Then spend five minutes noting down everything that you know about that section before moving onto the next. Correct and check using the knowledge organiser. You will have used these in class or for homework before, so you will have examples of these to use. If you are unaware of what they are, please speak to your English Teacher.

Revision Tips:

Daily – 5-20 minutes:

- ✓ Speaking (minimum 1 question) say it aloud (in French), use a cue card, check accuracy of tenses. Use the blue final revision booklet (given out in class week bg. 19/2/24.) Ask teacher to record answers/pronunciation for you.
- ✓ Writing: 1 sentence to a 40/90 (F tier), or 90/150 (H tier) paragraph in French. Key focus ACCURACY. Of opinions, past, future tenses. Ask teachers. You should write in your writing book (handed out in class week bg 19/2/24) everyday. Teachers should check this every lesson. Bring to every lesson.
- ✓ Reading: Annotate the weekly past paper in English at home each week. Use www.wordreference.com or google translate to help. Make a list of key words to learn in French and English and add to your A3 theme/topic knowledge organisers – handed out in class in early January, prior to February mocks. Bring these papers to every lesson. You can do the questions at home or in class. (10-20mins available for reading practice each lesson).
- ✓ Listening. Use BBCBitesize listening past paper questions. Use www.yabla.com. Ensure that you take any transcripts from class and spend time at home annotating in English.
