

Recipe Corner

Raspberry and Coconut Slices

Preheat the oven to 190c, fan 170c, gas mark 5. Grease a 22cm square tin and line with baking paper:

Ingredients:

120 g low fat spread, plus extra for greasing 40g desiccated coconut

200g plain flour Pinch of salt
60g caster sugar 250g raspberries
50g porridge oats

In a large mixing bowl, combine the flour, sugar, oats and coconut with a pinch of salt. Add the spread and rub it into the dry ingredients with your fingertips until combined and the mixture resembles purse crumbs.

Press half the mixture into the prepared tin. Top with the raspberries, pressing down gently with a spatula to release the some of the juice. Scatter the remaining oat mixture and smooth with a spatula doesn't matter if some of the raspberries are peeking through.

Bake for 30 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from the oven and set aside to cool in the tin for 1 hour, then turn out onto a chopping board and remove the baking paper. Cut into 16 squares and serve.
