

### Recipe Corner

#### Whole Apple Caramel Cake

Preheat oven to 160°C Fan. Grease a deep-sided baking tray. Mix the following ingredients with an electric mixer:

Ingredients:1 tsp vanilla essence½ cup melted butter1 ½ cups self-raising flour½ cup granulated sugar1 ½ tsp baking powder½ cup soft brown sugar½ tsp baking soda

4 large eggs ½ cup milk

Peel and core 12 small eating apples and leave whole. Spread half of the mixture in the baking dish and place whole apples evenly on top. Cover apples with remainder of the mixture. Bake for 35-40 minutes.

#### To make caramel topping:

1 cup soft brown sugar 1 tsp sea salt (optional) 
3/4 cup melted butter 1/2 cup single cream

Heat all the above ingredients slowly to the boil. Boil for 3 minutes stirring all the time. Pour over the warm cake. Serve with cream or ice cream on the side.
