CAROL'S CORNER

Happy Easter! Oh, I know, you are saying Easter is over. We already celebrated it, it's time to move on. Except it's not. The Easter season lasts until Pentecost. This means that our paraments stay white (some churches use gold). These colors symbolize joy. The stories we'll hear in worship will all have something to do with resurrection and our call to live Easter.

I was reading an article by the theologian John Dominic Crossen and he was talking about Easter being a metaphor. A metaphor is a figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or actions to which is it not literally applicable according to the dictionary. Yet just because Easter is a metaphor doesn't mean it's not real.

Easter becomes real when we live it out. When we put the flesh and bones on it, if you will. Easter makes a difference when we take to heart the teachings of Jesus. When we live out of love for one another, when we forgive, even when we don't want to. When we look for places of agreement, and agree to disagree agreeably where and when we can't.

Ester is about hope. Even though there are wars, death, dying, famine on the wide scale and illnesses and poverty and struggle on the personal side, Easter provides hope. The possibility to make and be a difference in this world. We may not be called to settle wars around the world but we can, because we are loved, because we follow the one who gave his life for us, make a difference in our families and our communities.

Easter does not end death, but it does offer life. It reminds us that we are beloved. Each and everyone of us is precious to the One who created us, who gave us life and breath and who walks with us even today. Even when we don't or can't see it.

Easter is about saying "yes" to the vision of life and community that was offered to us by Jesus. A new community, the kin-dom of love and grace.

A kin-dom where Judas would be, could be forgiven, where Peter is re-affirmed, and where all are indeed welcome. A kin-dom that we learn about from the teachings of Jesus, who was born, lived, and died willingly for us to know that there is a different way to live, a life of abundance and blessing.
