Museum Founder and Benefactor Don Limpert

Donald Edwin Limpert, 94, of Manchester, passed away Friday, February 18, 2022 at his home. Don was born on May 7, 1927 in Groveport, Ohio to Frank and Mary Edna (Staubaugh) Limpert. Raised in Sterling Heights, Michigan, as Don recalled to many visitors, allowed him as a young child to see Michigan's surviving Civil War veterans participate in Memorial Day parades down Woodward Avenue.. Thus began his lifelong passion leading to his nationally recognized collection of Civil War arms, memorabilia, records, original letters, and especially those of the Grand Army of the Republic. An active and resourceful builder in Oakland County, Don moved his family to Manchester, in 1963. There he established his reputation for restoration and historic preservation, notably, the Black Sheep Tavern, the Manchester Mill and the Manchester Village Blacksmith's Shop. Don served as Member and Chair of the Township Planning Commission, Trustee of the Village of Manchester, member of its Historical Society, the Men's Club, and Masonic Lodge. Following his interests in collecting, he was a member of the Michigan Regimental Round Table Civil War Group and a charter member of the Michigan Chapter of Stein Collectors International. Don donated items of his G.A.R. collection to various Michigan communities and towards the end of his active life, Don funded the establishment of the Michigan Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Hall and Museum in downtown Eaton Rapids, Michigan, furnished with items from his collection. He will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

Don is survived by his children, Bruce Limpert and Denise Thompson; grandchildren, Adam Lim pert and Callie Limpert of Manfield, Texas; and a great grandson, Mason Cruz Berryhill, of York, South Carolina, and his faithful friend, nurse and care-giver, Amanda Martin. He is preceded in death by his parents, brothers, William Limpert, and Frank Limpert, his sister, Marjorie Deck, his wife, Rita, infant daughter, Renee, his sons, Scott and Ryan, and grand-daughter, Hannah Chelsea Limpert. Cremation has taken place. A gathering will be announced of a remembrance in the Manchester community later in the Spring. Contributions in Don's memory may be made to G.A.R. Museum, Eaton Rapids, or a charity of choice.





Save the Date! 2022 Annual Civil War Discovery Camp for Kids

The Board of Directors of Michigan's Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Hall and Museum has set the date for the 2022 Annual Civil War Discovery Camp for Kids. It will be Tuesday, August 9th beginning at 10:00am through 3:00pm. It is intended for children ages 7 to 14 years of age.

Activities will include instruction of the Civil War manual of arms using wooden muskets, how to march, how the Civil War soldier lived and much more. The students will then be split up into smaller groups and continue to explore various aspects of the Civil War. They will also have the opportunity to fire a reproduction Civil War era musket (with prior parental approval). Instructors will load the musket with a black powder only and then cap the rifle. The instructor will continue to hold the rifle, while the student is fitted with safely glasses, then steps up and then is allowed to pull the trigger. BOOM!

The student's will then march in formation over to the G.A.R. Memorial Hall and Museum for a tour, learning about the Grand Army of the Republic and the Women's Relief Corp, the woman's auxiliary to the G.A.R. At the conclusion, students will each be paid \$13.00 in replica 1860's script and discharged from military service with an appropriate discharge certificate.
