Museum hosts Guest Speakers

The G.A.R. Memorial Hall and Museum hosted Jack Dempsey on November 14 September 24 as part of the museum's continuing seminar program. Mr. Dempsey's presentation was two fold – the memoir of Eunice Hunt Taylor, wife of the first Medical Director of the army of the Potomac and secondly, Charles S. Tripler, a medical officer during the Spanish-American War and on the eve of the Civil War, was charged with medical care of the largest American Military force in our history. 2024 promises more excellent programs for our community. There is no charge for admission to the presentations (donations are appreciated to help maintain the museum) and light refreshments will be served.

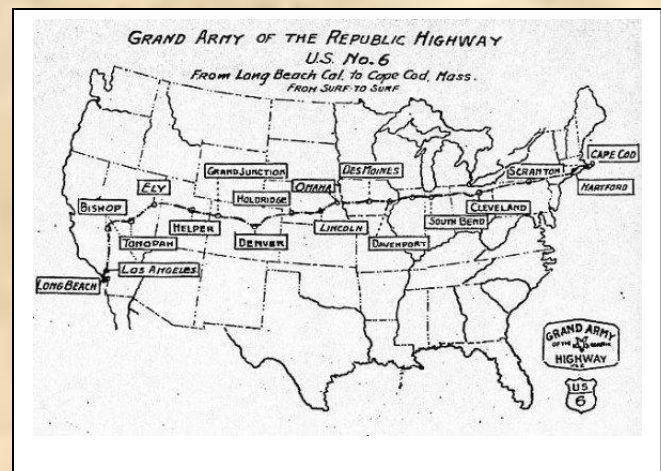
CIVIL WAR DISCOVERY CAMP

August 13 – 10:00am to 3:00pm – Civil War Camp of Discovery (\$20.00) for children age 7 to 14 years. Starting on G.A.R. Island Park, planned activities include learning the Civil War manual of arms with wooden muskets, how to march, how Civil War soldiers lived and much more. Students will also be allowed to fire a reproduction Civil War musket (with prior parental approval). Lunch is provided on the Island. After a mock battle, students march to the Museum where they will be discharged from the army and paid \$13 in replica 1860's federal money.

U.S. 6 - Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Highway

At the National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic in 1936, it was proposed that US 6, which runs from Provincetown on Cape Cod, Massachusetts, to Bishop, California, be designated as the Memorial Highway. Because this highway passes through or near the metropolitan areas of New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles, the West Point Military Academy, as well as many small cities and towns, it is often called Main Street, USA.

The highway is a main route of the United States Numbered Highway System. The route has been modified several times. The highway's longest-lasting routing, from 1936 to 1964, had its western terminus at Long Beach, California. During this time, US 6 was the longest highway in the country.

Last Union Veteran: Albert Henry Woolson

Born in Antwerp, Jefferson County, New York, on February 11, 1850 (he may have insisted on the 1847 date to appear older when he enlisted), Albert Henry Woolson spent most of his life in Minnesota. The Woolson's arrived in Minnesota sometime after 1855, settling in near the frontier town of Mankato. At the outbreak of the Civil War, Woolson's father, Willard Paul, enlisted in the 4th Minnesota Infantry as a musician, a trait his son would follow later in the war. Due to a disability, the elder Woolson was discharged during the Siege of Corinth in 1862. A little over two years later, Albert enlisted in the 1st Minnesota Heavy Artillery. With a musical background and at the tender age of 14, Woolson became the bugler for Companies C and D. The unit spent most of the remainder of the war on garrison duty near Chattanooga, Tennessee and did not see combat. Woolson was discharged on June 26, 1865, and returned home to the Mankato area.

Woolson worked as an engineer in the Grist Mill and by the 1890s, he accepted a position as one of the State Boiler Inspectors for Minnesota. After wife Jane passed away in 1901, Woolson married Anna Hagen on September 1, 1904. The marriage added four children to the surviving seven from Woolson's first marriage, all but one outliving the old soldier.

Woolson proudly joined the local G.A.R., and for the final fifty years of his life belonged to Willis A. Gorman Post No. 13 in Duluth. Woolson attended the last National Encampment in Indianapolis, Indiana in August 1949, where six of the surviving sixteen men attended. Woolson and the other five attendees rode in a parade through the Indianapolis to the cheering thousands. In the parade, Woolson carried the colors of Company C, 1st Minnesota Heavy Artillery.

When James A. Hard died in 1953, Woolson became the last Union Soldier. All of Duluth turned out for Memorial Day that year to honor him. Still fit at 103, Woolson wore the uniform of the G.A.R. and presided over the ceremony as the honorary grand marshal of the parade. Later, he laid a wreath at the soldiers' and sailors' monument, received honors from the Duluth Lions Club, the national Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion, and proceeded to the cemetery to honor the dead veterans.

Even in his last year, Woolson attended the annual Memorial Day parades in Duluth. In 1954, he reviewed the Duluth branch of the University of Minnesota ROTC class. In something that must have amazed Woolson, the parade featured a formation of F-86 Sabrejets and a helicopter from Duluth's 515th Air Defense Group. After Memorial Day 1956, Woolson's "remarkable stamina" finally turned for the worse, and he entered St. Luke's Hospital, where he spent the rest of his life. On July 26, he lost consciousness and passed away one week later August 2, 1956. With his passing an era came to an end, and the books to the GAR were officially closed. Cora E. Gillis, the GAR's final secretary, fittingly wrote that "The final taps have sounded, with the passing of the last member of that once great army, Albert Woolson, of Duluth, Minn. Their memory will remain forever."

Shortly after his death, Albert Woolson was immortalized by appearing on the Grand Army of the Republic monument at Zeigler's Grove, Gettysburg National Military Park. August 12, 2023, Park Hill Cemetery in Duluth, Minnesota, the [William Colvill Camp 56, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War](#), hosted the Last Union Veteran ceremony for Pvt. Albert Woolson, St. Louis County. The ceremony was inaugurated by the firing of an original Napoleon cannon from Battery I, 1st US Artillery. The 1st Minnesota Infantry marched in at the sound of the cannon and performed "Rest on Arms" maneuvers near Woolson's gravesite. Woolson's Last Union Veteran ceremony was performed to a large crowd of spectators, including three relatives of Woolson.

We still have work to do with our on-line presence and will be a priority in 2024.

Our success is totally due to the support and devotion of our members and supporters. I also want to thank our Board of Directors for stepping up and helping out as we chart our future, building upon our past. We will be trying being open the third Saturday of each month in addition to Wednesdays, to help better serve.
