Safe Arrival and Dismissal

As part of Ontario's new regulation for safe arrival and dismissal Thorncliffe park daycare centre and school age program has created a policy that will follow outlined steps for staff to follow when a child has not been received into care and no change to the child's schedule was communicated from the parent/guardian.

The daycare staff will attempt to contact the parent/guardian followed by an email. Efforts to assist with the well-being of the child will be followed by contacting emergency persons of the families contact list. Finally, if the daycare is unable to contact parents/guardians within the time frame of 15min then emergency services will be contacted. To avoid this please call the centre ahead of time.

Hi Nusra, M.J will not be in daycare today, he has a dentist appointment.

I's your duty to report when your child is away

At 10:00am a phone call is made to absent child's parents to confirm reasons for absence.

Staff will proceed to call child's emergency contacts when parent contact is not made

Supervisors will call police to conduct a well-ness check it parents and emergency contacts are not successful





'It's too cold for my child to go outside, can you keep them inside?

The snow hasn't fully arrived yet, but when it does, we want to ensure your child has the best possible experience during their time outdoors. The winter season provides new environments and materials, which give children new tasks (for example sliding down an ice patch or climbing a snow bank). Engagement with outdoor environments in the winter incites new problem-solving skills such as, "How can I slide down this ice patch without falling?" "How fast can I run up this snow hill?"



Why is it important for families to extend the learning at home?

Home and daycare are a child's two most important worlds. When daycare and families work together on the same skill, project or strategy, it creates instructional coherence, which in effect, doubles the child's ability to learn. Families and educators can work together so the child sees and knows that there is consistency, collaboration, and trust between them. Furthermore, parents feel apart of the classroom. This is illustrated in the photos below. Preschool 2 parents work directly with their child to extend on their classroom project "City Project"















Positive teacher-child relationships

- Engage in one-to-one interactions with children
- Get on the child's level for face-toface interactions
- Use a pleasant, calm voice and simple language
- Provide warm, responsive physical contact.
- Acknowledge children for their accomplishments and effort.


Pin these important reminders

- Children attending Thorncliffe Park school must be signed in every morning by a parent/guardian by 8:30am
- Parents must call the program to report child absenteeism. (read safe arrival and dismissal on page 3)
- If any information has changed regarding your phone number, address etc. please let us know so that we are up to-date.
- Google forms for bus children must be completed before 12 noon.
- Parents are required to provide 2 weeks notice of their child's withdrawal from the program. Without sufficient notice you will be subjected to a charge.
- Any child with a medical condition that may require medication to be kept on site or needs accommodations must have an individualized medical plan document completed

Chocolate covered ice cream hearts





Directions

Lay a pint of strawberry ice cream on its side and cut into 1-inch-thick rounds with a large serrated knife; peel off the carton. Cut out hearts with a 2inch cookie cutter, place on a rack set on a baking sheet and freeze 30 minutes. For the coating, combine 3 ounces chopped chocolate with 3 tablespoons coconut oil in a microwave-safe bowl; microwave in 30-second intervals, stirring, until smooth. Pour over the ice cream hearts. Freeze until set, then drizzle with melted candy melts.

Cook's Note

Use milk, dark or white chocolate to cover the ice cream hearts.
