Greetings yet again from Blaine, Washington.

Yep, this is the third travelogue from Blaine. We are trying to catch up and this may just do it. In our last letter, we told you about taking a half day off work and riding the motorcycle to Seattle and then grabbing a round trip ferry to Bremerton. That was our brief introduction to Puget Sound and the Washington State ferry system. If you're lucky enough to get a sunny day, Puget Sound is a very beautiful destination.

Our next stop was **Northern Lights Indian Casino and RV Park** near the quaint little town of **Anacortes**, Washington. Anacortes is on **Fidalgo Island** in Puget Sound and serves as a nice gateway to the **San Juan Islands**. Fortunately, we had budgeted two days at this stop to see a little of the islands. The first day we rode into Anacortes, looked around, and had an early dinner at the **Adrift** restaurant. All in all, a lovely day and a lovely meal.

A spectacular crossing to say the least. We had hoped to see more of Whidbey Island, but we had to turn around at the pass. We were running out of time and getting very cold. Boy, did the temperature drop at the pass. We hope to get to Whidbey another time and explore more.

On our second day in the area, we got up early and rode through the fog to Anacortes to get on a ferry to a couple of the San Juan Islands. This time we took the motorcycle on board with us. The motorcycle really works well because you board ahead of all of the cars. It's really neat to just ride to the head of the line and board first. When you dock you also unload first. It's neat, it's fast, and it's inexpensive. Our first stop was **Lopez Island**. It's a lovely island for a motorcycle ride. Very rural and very beautiful.

You can easily walk from the ferry to downtown.

Again, there was a lot to see and do, but unfortunately we only had a couple of hours to just catch the flavor of the island. We rode to **Lime Kiln State Park** which is a prime whale watching spot. Also, during the summer the Orcas (killer whales) visit the area to feed on salmon. We could only stay for 45 minutes and in that short time, we didn't see any whales or Orcas. You can, however, book whale watching boats out of many of the islands and the chances of seeing these interesting creatures is very good. The boats boast better than a 90% success rate.

Well, that was our brief introduction to the San Juan Islands. We must come back and see more on another trip.

Tomorrow morning, August 22, we move to **Cedars RV Resort** in the town of **Ferndale**, **Washington**. It's only about 10 miles southeast of Blaine. We will be there August 22 through August 27.
