

Data Notes & Limitations


- Data reflects information obtained from **EvaluationWeb** data collection system by DPH Funded sites for the calendar year 2022.
- Data for this presentation was extracted from Evaluation Web on February 2023. This is an update, **not** a final PrEP data report.
- Data was analyzed using Microsoft Excel.
- All data is self-reported information unless specified.
 - Intentional reporting bias (e.g., the participant wants to be seen in a positive way) and/or unintentional reporting bias (e.g., the participant forgot that they had engaged in risky behavior).



Number of Clients Screened for PrEP by Gender Identity, 2022, (N=17,895)






Number of Clients Screened for PrEP by Race/Ethnicity, 2022, (N=17,895)






Number of Clients Screened for PrEP by Age Range, 2022, (N=17,895)





Number of Clients Screened for PrEP by Priority Population, 2022, (N=17,895)






Number of People Screened for PrEP by Zip Code, 2022, (n=13,046)






Number of Clients Eligible for PrEP by Gender Identity, 2022, (N=11,858)






Number of Clients Eligible for PrEP by Race/Ethnicity, 2022, (N=11,858)






Number of Clients Eligible for PrEP by Age Range, 2022, (N=11,858)





Number of Clients Eligible for PrEP by Priority Population, 2022, (N=11,858)






Number of Clients Eligible for PrEP by Zip Code, 2022, (n=10,589)






Number of Clients Referred to a PrEP Provider by Gender Identity, 2022, (N=1,967)






Number of Clients Referred to a PrEP Provider by Race/Ethnicity, 2022, (N=1,967)






Number of Clients Referred to a PrEP Provider by Age Range, 2022, (N=1,967)





Number of Clients Referred to a PrEP Provider by Priority Population, 2022, (N=1,967)



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2022 PrEP Data Summary



Summary

From January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, there were:

- 17,895 individuals screened for PrEP
 - 46% Male, 68.3% Black & Latinx, 56.4% Ages 20-39, and 14.3% Hetero Female
- 11,858 Individuals eligible for PrEP
 - 50.7% Female, 74.3% Black & Latinx, 48% Ages 20-39, and 41.7% Hetero Female
- 1,967 individuals <u>referred</u> to a PrEP Provider
 - 60% Male, 46.2 White, 62.6% Ages 20-39, and 30.8% MSM



PrEP Disparities

- In 2021, there were 232 newly diagnosed HIV cases in CT.
- Black/AA people represented 16.3% of PrEP users in 2022 but 36% of new HIV diagnoses in 2021.
- Hispanic/Latinx people represented 30.5% of PrEP users in 2022 and 32% of new HIV diagnoses in 2021.
- White people represented 46.2% of PrEP users in 2022 and 29% of new HIV diagnoses in 2021.



2022 PrEP-to-Need Ratio

The PrEP-to-Need Ratio (PNR) is the number of <u>PrEP users in 2022</u> divided by the number of <u>new HIV diagnosis in 2021</u>. PNR serves as a measurement for whether PrEP use appropriately reflects the need for HIV prevention. A <u>lower PNR</u> indicates more <u>unmet need</u>.




2022 HIV PNA Survey: PrEP and PEP Data


















Legislative Proposals

HB 5500 - Routine HIV Testing: This bill was passed in 2022 and requires medical providers or a designee offer all patients aged 13 or older an HIV test at least once. The law applies to primary care settings beginning in 2023 and emergency room departments in 2024.

HB 6733 - Universal Hepatitis C Testing: This proposed bill is part of the DPH Tech Bill and if passed will require physicians to offer all patients over the age of 18 a test for hepatitis C at least once and all pregnant women a test for hepatitis C with each pregnancy.

SB 1068 - PrEP/PEP Drug Assistance Program: This proposed bill will establish a payor of last resort drug assistance program to pay for PrEP and PEP medications for people who are uninsured, underinsured or uninsurable.

2023 Biomedical Prevention RFP

 This RFP will seek to identify one contractor to coordinate the delivery of HIV Biomedical services statewide and serve as a training/technical assistance provider to those delivering services across the state. The contractor will also be required to assist with HIV biomedical services program evaluation, developing a mechanism for statewide data collection, and developing an Academic Detailing initiative for medical providers.



Two -page PrEP reports

 Two-page summary PrEP reports will be made available via the DPH website and disseminated to all funded partners. The initial report will cover all of 2022 PrEP data. The following reports will cover 6-month time periods.



What is PrEP Navigation?

PrEP Navigation is a term used to describe a comprehensive system of services and support that help individuals who are at high risk of contracting HIV to access and remain on pre-exposure

PrEP is a daily nill that has been shown to be highly effective in preventing HIV transmission when taken consistently. However, many individuals who could benefit from PrEP face barriers to accessing and staving on the medication, such as lack of knowledge about PrEP, stigms around HIV and sexuality, financial constraints, and difficulty navigating the healthcare system

As required by NDCC 23-01-44, all authorized sites are required to report twice per year on the status and services provided by their programs. These reports contain information about the demographics of the persons served by syringe service programs and the services they received during the reporting period.

It is not recommended that sites document persons by identifiable information, however they must be tracked longitudinally by a SSP created identifier. This allows for clients to receive services at appropriate other services provided on the individual level

The biannual report required sites to document the following data points.

Demographics:

- Gender of Participants Race/Ethnicity
- Current Living Status
- County of Residence Substances Used Within the Last 30 Days

- Number of Perticipants Serviced Number of New Participants Enrolled
- Number of Syringes Distributed

Benefits and Goals of PrEP Nav.

The benefits and goals of PrEP navigation programs are numerous. By assisting individuals in accessing PrEP, these programs help to reduce new HIV infections. This is especially important for high-risk populations, such as men who have sex with men and people who inject drugs.

PrEP navigation programs also aim to outcomes for those at risk of HIV infect. providing ongoing support and education, can help clients maintain adherence to PrE: medication, which can induce the risk of HIV transmission and in




- . There were 56 individuals who received testing services (HIV, hepatitis C or STDs
- Safer sex education was provided, and 1,890 condoms were distributed.
- . 11 clients requested and received referrel to substance abuse treatment services

During the reporting period, there were 7,609 syringes distributed and approximately 2.986 collected. The number of syringes collected could be

inderreported. An actual count of syringes does not take place, rather they are estimated by the participants and workers by weight or sight within a biohazard container, SSP workers are instructed to not handle syringes or to dig within higherend container

as this is when an accidental needlestick could occu Information collected on the substances reported by participants in the 30 days prior to enrollment at the SSP are described below. Prescription meds. suboxone and methadone responses indicated that these substances were used not as prescribed. Meth was the primary substance reported with 92% of

participants indicating use.



Naloxone is available for distribution at both SSP locations. 68 doses of naloxone were distributed to participants to use when needed to help save the life of a person experiencing overdose due to opioid us
