



# Celebrating the day of the dead.

For me, the Day of the Dead was a tradition that inadvertently became one of the most significant in my life when I was at the University of New Mexico at the Centro de la Raza (UNM) since 2002 when my grandfather Gabriel Cortez passed away. I learned about this pre-Hispanic celebration, putting the altars decorated with the art of papel picado, the sugar skulls, the meanings of the candles, food and incense or copal. This tradition is celebrated on the first and second days of November. On November 1st. we celebrate the souls of children who have passed away and on November 2nd the lives of adults. These days we honor our loved ones who have passed away.

I began to put an altar in my house to continue with the tradition that I learned since my maternal grandparents had passed away. My grandmother Aurora Zubiate passed away in 2006, the same year that I came to live in Roanoke Virginia. Over time, I started acquiring new things to decorate my altar, where I had to have my Virgin of Guadalupe, the photographs of my grandparents, famous people like Celia Cruz, Frida Kahlo, Selena and other famous people who have passed away.

As the years passed and my children grew up, it was our tradition that they celebrate Halloween and while they were enjoying a party that I had at my house, I spoke to my children, neighbors, and friends about my altar of the day of the dead. This is how I started the tradition for my circle of friends and neighbors. In 2018 and 2019 I began making altars in the windows of two local restaurants in Salem and Roanoke Virginia. In 2020 I also made a virtual altar where people could put photos of their deceased to remember them.

My purpose of creating the altars is to raise awareness of this beautiful tradition that has become part of my family, my culture, and my community. Especially now that we have lost many, many loved ones due to the pandemic, shootings, and attacks. I think it is more meaningful to remember how beautiful their lives were. I heard an expression that said, "God, I'm not asking you why you take [Them] from me, but I thank you for have been giving me the opportunity to have lived with them" Let us remember our deceased with affection, the memories that we create with them, we remember what they liked, what they taught us and above all what we believe, that those days, their souls come to visit us.

# Celebrando El día de los muertos.





Para mí el día de los muertos fue una tradición que se convirtió sin querer en una de las mas significativas de mi vida cuando estaba en la universidad de Nuevo México en el Centro de la Raza (UNM) desde el año 2002 cuando falleció mi abuelo Gabriel Cortez. Aprendí sobre esta celebración prehispánica, poniendo los altares decorados con el arte del papel picado, las calaveras de azúcar, los significados de las veladoras, comida y el incienso o copal. Esta tradición se celebra el primero y segundo día de noviembre. El 1ero de noviembre celebramos las almas de los niños que han fallecido y el 2 de noviembre la vida de los adultos. Estos días honramos a nuestros seres queridos que han pasado a mejor vida.

Yo empecé a poner un altar en mi casa para seguir con la tradición que aprendí ya que mis abuelos maternos habían fallecido. Mi abuelita Aurora Zubiate falleció en el 2006, el mismo año que llegué a vivir en Roanoke Virginia. Con el tiempo, me fui haciendo de cosas nuevas para decorar mi altar, donde no podía faltar mi virgen de Guadalupe, las fotografías de mis abuelos, de personas famosas como Celia Cruz, Frida Kahlo, Selena y otras personas que han fallecido.

Conforme pasaron los años y mis hijos crecieron, era nuestra tradición que celebraran el día de Halloween y mientras ellos disfrutaban de una fiesta que hice en mi casa, les hablé a mis hijos, vecinos y amigos sobre mi altar del día de los muertos, así que empecé a hacerlo de una tradición para mi circulo de amigos y vecinos. En el 2018 y 2019 empecé a hacer altares en las ventanas de dos restaurantes locales en Salem y Roanoke Virginia. En el 2020 hice también un altar virtual donde las personas pudieran poner fotos de sus difuntos para recordarlos.

Mi propósito de crear los altares es para crear conciencia de esta hermosa tradición que se ha hecho parte de mi familia, mi cultura y mi comunidad. Especialmente ahora que hemos perdido muchísimos seres queridos a causa de la pandemia, de tiroteos, de atentados y pienso que es bonito recordar lo bonito de sus vidas. Yo escuche una expresión que decía, "Dios, no te pregunto por que me lo quitas, pero te agradezco habérmelo dado". Recordemos a nuestros difuntos con cariño, las memorias que creamos con ellos, recordamos lo que les gustaba, lo que nos enseñaron y sobre todo que creemos, que esos días, sus almas vienen a visitarnos.






