#### Sept. 6, 1980

As we trudged up the hill from Summit Hall to the "New Stadium", we were sweating from the heat and our indulgences of the night before. It didn't help that we all had on Levi 505's to cover the Black Jack that we had taped to our legs.

We didn't know where the stadium was, exactly, but we followed the lemming-like crowd. All around us, we could hear the others, bemoaning the move from "The Bowl." We were only Juniors, on top of the world with our feet hanging over, but we had had two years of hearing the roar of the bass as the Marching Band burst from the tunnel. The reverberation of the cheer as it used to be, all one sound, "Let's Go, Mountaineers! as it bounced around the pit. How could this new place possibly compete with such a long standing tradition?

Suddenly, we crested the hill, and there it stood before us, a behemoth, pristinely white with clean arching lines. We stood in queue with thousands awaiting the cursory search before entrance, and then we were in! Instead of a clearly established student section, the seating was open to both students and alumni. We all stood shoulder to shoulder as we waited for the arrival of John Denver to break in our new digs with Country Roads.

The helicopter landed midfield amidst the screams of the crowd and he made his little speech and we all joined in to sing the song of our people. There wasn't a dry eye in the place.

And then we waited. The field cleared and then we heard it, the heavy beat of the Drum line, sticks on rims, mallets on skin. Suddenly, the field was flooded as the Pride of West Virginia rushed out, a sea of

The total cost per adult is \$34.96 (tax included). #### DIRECTIONS:

**From Cincinnati** – Take I-71 North to Exit 28 (St. Rt. 48); turn left (south) on Rt. 48 to U.S. Rt. 22 & 3. Turn left (east) for about 3 miles to the winery.

**From Dayton** – Take I-75 South to Exit 29. Turn left (east) onto St. Rt. 63 for about 8 miles (through Lebanon) to St. Rt. 48. Turn right (south) on Rt. 48 to U.S. Rt. 22 & 3. Turn left (east) for about 3 miles to the winery.
