



Join Us / Volunteer

Greater Cincinnati | Dayton WVU Alumni Chapter Scholarship

For the past 24 years, the Cincinnati/Dayton WVU Alumni Chapter has provided at least one scholarship to local students who attend WVU. The scholarships is one of the ways our chapter gives back to our alma mater and to the local community. To date our chapter has given out over \$28,000 to help support local students.

Our endowment now provides \$3,000 annually (and is growing) each year into perpetuity for deserving students in our area to attend WVU. Our goal is to to continue to build our endowment so that additional scholarships can be offered. The current value of our scholarship fund is over \$79K and we have a near term goal to grow this to over \$100K in the next few years.
