# **F**eelings

How should we feel when death takes someone we love away?

Should we be crushed with sadness?
Or should we be filled with joy because the person we love is in heaven with God?

It is not helpful to tell a person how he or she should feel when a loved one dies.

Feelings come – and feelings change from one moment to the next.

Do not be overly concerned about what you feel.
Rather, try to commit all your feelings to the Lord.
Give the Lord thanks for the times when you feel good.
And when you feel deep sadness,

remember that the Lord
understands the pain you feel and
He cares for you.

Psalm 77:1-2



It will not be the kind of home people build here.

It will be a home in heaven that will continue forever.

And we really want to be away from this body and be at home with the Lord."

But the Lord said, "My grace is all you need.


Only when you are weak can everything be done completely by my power."

The sun will not hurt them.





We know that


while we live in this body, we are away from the Lord.

We have sufferings now, but these are nothing compared to the great glory that will be given to us.

Romans 8:18

That is why we never give up.

Our physical body
is becoming older and weaker,
but our spirit inside us
is made new every day.

We have small troubles for a while now, but these troubles are helping us gain an eternal glory.

That eternal glory is much greater than our troubles.

So we think about what we cannot see, not what we see.

What we see lasts only a short time, and what we cannot see will last forever.

# Victory

But the government that rules us is in heaven. We are waiting for our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, to come from there. He will change our humble bodies and make them like his own glorious body. Christ can do this by his power, with which he is able to rule everything.

The body that is "planted" in the grave will ruin and decay, but it will be raised to a life that cannot be destroyed.

When the body is "planted," it is without honor. But when it is raised, it will be great and glorious.

The body that is "planted" is a physical body.

When it is raised, it will be a spiritual body....

So this body that ruins will clothe itself with that which never ruins.

## **I**nvitation

The victory and glory described in these pages are promised to everyone who loves and follows Jesus Christ. He takes care of His followers and promises to stay close during our darkest times.

Here are four steps to begin or maintain a relationship with Jesus – not only in times of sadness, but also during the times of joy, which He promises will return:

#### Read the Bible - every day!

God wrote the Bible for you. Listen to what He is telling you. Hear His comforting words.

#### 2. Talk to God - every day.

Your loved one is not here to talk to anymore, but God is. Praying to Him is not as hard as you might think. Just say what's on your mind.

#### 3. Keep it up.

When you are angry and grieving, you may not feel like reading the Bible or praying. But keep it up. God understands.

#### 4. Let others know.

You may not be ready to talk with people for a while. But when your hurts are healing you can help others by sharing how talking and listening to God helped you.

Jesus said, "I assure you, anyone who hears what I say and believes in the one who sent me has eternal life. They will not be judged guilty. They have already left death and have entered into life." John 5:24 Jesus said, "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in and eat with you. And you will eat with me." Revelation 3:20 He will keep you strong until the end so that on the day when our Lord Jesus Christ comes. you will be free from all blame. God is faithful. He is the one who has chosen you to share life with his Son. lesus Christ our Lord. 1 Corinthians 1:8-9
