The best parent

As a thoughtful parent, you will always be your baby's best teacher.

But did you know that your baby can also teach you?

Your baby depends on you for everything and completely trusts you in every way.

Love that hurts

It usually does not take parents very long to realize that even very small children can have a mind of their own!

Parents, therefore, have to learn
how to provide loving discipline
for their children.

They have to teach them
the difficult discipline
of controlling their wants and to think
about what's good for others
instead of thinking only of themselves
and doing what makes them feel
good right now.

One way for you to do that as a parent is to practice what you teach.

If you want your child to grow up able to control his or her wants and to do what's best for other people too, start practicing these things yourself!

We don't enjoy discipline when we get it. It is painful. But later, after we have learned our lesson from it, we will enjoy the peace that comes from doing what is right.

Hebrews 12:11

Teach children in a way that fits their needs, and even when they are old, they will not leave the right path.

Learning to pray

Praying to God is an honor for all of us.

Children must be taught how to pray, too!

At first, maybe,
they will do little more than
fold their hands

Gradually they will learn that God in heaven sees them and hears them and listens to what they are saying.

They will learn that God loves to have His children pray, and that He promises to hear and answer them when they do.

What a joyful duty it is for you to teach your child how to pray!

The LORD is near to everyone who sincerely calls to him for help.

Just like you

When people see your baby for the first time, one of the questions they may ask is this:

Who does the baby look like?

Sometimes that question is hard to answer.

Who will the baby **live** like?

Joining the family

Your children are the most important responsibility you will ever have. Raise them in a way that brings them close to God, and you will have a positive spiritual effect on your entire family for generations to come. Here are four keys to help your family begin or maintain a relationship with Jesus:

1. Read the Bible - every day!

On your own, with your spouse, and with your children. When you read the Bible you are listening to God Himself.

2. Talk to God – every day.

Praying to God is not as hard as you might think. Just say what's on your mind. Make sure your children see you talking to God – as they imitate you, talking to God will become natural for them.

3. Keep it up.

Life is busy. Even when we have good intentions about reading the Bible, it's still hard to stick with it. It's worth the effort!

4. Let others know.

Tell other families how your family prays and reads the Bible together, and how this has helped you. And encourage your children to tell their friends about it.
