

Hurts

Everyone hurts at one time or another. Sometimes the hurts are relatively minor and tend to go away by themselves. But at other times the hurts are so intense that we wonder whether they will ever go away.

God does not promise that His children will have no hurts in this life.

But God wants you to know that every hurt of yours is of concern to Him. And He graciously invites you to give all your worries to Him, because HE cares for YOU.

Discouragement

Most of us are realistic enough to know that life will never be totally free from problems.

Accidents happen, sickness comes, mistakes are made, things break down. We all know that.

But at times it seems as if almost everything goes wrong. Nothing at all seems to go right. We simply do not know how we will ever get on top of things again. And we become thoroughly discouraged.

God understands our discouragement. He knows why you feel the way you do. And He promises to be there when you turn to Him for help. Others may turn away from you when things go wrong – but God will never leave you when you're down.

Hope from the Bible

Give your worries to the LORD, and he will care for you. He will never let those who are good be defeated. *Psalm* 55:22

Why am I so sad? Why am I so upset? I tell myself, "Wait for God's help! You will again have a chance to praise him, your God, the one who will save you."

Failure

Someone once said, "It's better to have tried and failed than never to have tried at all."

Is that true?

It surely does not always seem that way. Failure usually hurts, and it often hurts a lot.

But failure by itself is never the end of the road. And failure in one thing is surely not the end of you!

Your reaction to failure often says far more about the kind of person you are than success does!

God can use failure as the starting point of a personal victory in your life that could not come in any other way.

Commit your failures to Him, and trust Him to turn your failures into victory!

"I say this because I know the plans that I have for you." This message is from the LORD. "I have good plans for you. I don't plan to hurt you. I plan to give you hope and a good future. Then you will call my name. You will come to me and pray to me, and I will listen to you.

You will search for me, and when you search for me with all your heart, you will find me. " Jeremiah 29:11–13

Trust the LORD completely, and don't depend on your own knowledge. With every step you take, think about what he wants, and he will help you go the right way.

Nothing in all the world can be hidden from God. He can clearly see all things. Everything is open before him. And to him we must explain the way we have lived.


Hebrews 4:13

Psalm 31:14-16


I went to the LORD for help, and he listened. He saved me from all that I fear.

Temptation

The only temptations that you have are the same temptations that all people have. But you can trust God. He will not let you be tempted more than you can bear. But when you are tempted, God will also give you a way to escape that temptation. Then you will be able to endure it. *1 Corinthians 10:13*

Jesus, our high priest, is able to understand our weaknesses. When Jesus lived on earth, he was tempted in every way. He was tempted in the same ways we are tempted, but he never sinned. With Jesus as our high priest, we can feel free to come before God's throne where there is grace. There we receive mercy and kindness to help us when we need it.

I always remember that the LORD is with me. He is here, close by my side, so nothing can defeat me.


Psalm 16:8

Guilt

A flash of temptation in a moment of weakness may have resulted in a mountain of guilt for you. If only you could live that hour all over again, everything would be so different now. But you can't.

The deed is done, and you are left with a heavy load of guilt that does not go away.

What can you do with guilt? If you seek to deny it, or try to hide it, or lightly excuse it, you will never know the freedom that forgiveness brings.

But if you humbly tell God what you did that was wrong, and ask Him to forgive you because Jesus' death paid the penalty for all our sins. Then, you will find a forgiveness that will fill your mind with peace and joy. Your heavy load of guilt will be gone!

Whoever hides their sins will not be successful, but whoever confesses their sins and stops doing wrong will receive mercy.

Proverbs 28:13

God, be merciful to me because of your faithful love. Because of your great compassion, erase all the wrongs I have done. Scrub away my guilt. Wash me clean from my sin.

Broken promises

When the promises of love are first made to us, our hearts overflow with joy. But when promises are broken, the love vanishes, the hope disappears, and we feel empty and alone.

And we wonder in despair, What did I say to bring about such change? What did I do to turn away such love? Am I not worthy of another's love? Am I no good at all?

God hears those cries of our broken hearts. He promises to stay especially close to us until our hearts are mended and our wounds are healed.

The LORD is close to those who have suffered disappointment. He saves those who are discouraged.

[The LORD] heals their broken hearts and bandages their wounds.

Psalm 147:3


The LORD has heard my request for mercy. The LORD has accepted my prayer.

Rejection

One of the worst feelings we can ever have is the feeling of rejection.

To feel that no one needs us or wants us or really cares about us hurts beyond words.

Rejection can come in so many forms: a desire for friendship met with contempt a plea for understanding refused a longing for acceptance misunderstood a hope for recognition never granted.

Why do others treat us as they do? Don't they understand how much it hurts to be rejected?

Perhaps not. But God does.

If you come to Him in faith, He will never turn you away, and nothing will ever separate you from His love.

Hope from the Bible

I called to the LORD, and he heard me. He heard my cries. He lifted me out of the grave. He lifted me from that muddy place. He picked me up, put me on solid ground, and kept my feet from slipping. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see what he did and worship him. They will put their trust in the LORD.

Psalm 40:1-3

Can anything separate us from Christ's love? Can trouble or problems or persecution separate us from his love? If we have no food or clothes or face danger or even death, will that separate us from his love?... But in all these troubles we have complete victory through God, who has shown his love for us. Yes, I am sure that nothing can separate us from God's love – not death, life, angels, or ruling spirits. I am sure that nothing now, nothing in the future, no powers, nothing above us or nothing below us – nothing in the whole created world – will ever be able to separate us from the love God has shown us in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Perhaps you did not know it, but you are a very special person in the sight of God. God fully understands the problems of your life. He knows all the hurts that you have had. Your life is very precious to Him, and every hurt of yours is a concern to Him.

Perhaps He has permitted some of the hurts to enter your life so that you will turn to Him and learn just how much He loves you.

Is your life open to His love?

But Christ died for us while we were still sinners, and by this God showed how much he loves us.


Romans 5:8

God cares

The help and healing described in these pages are offered by God to all His friends. God's friends are those who talk and listen to Him every day.

This is easier than you might think! Here are four steps to get you started:

1. Read the Bible – every day!

God wrote the Bible for you. Spend time listening to what He has to say.

2. Talk to God – every day.

God is here, right now, ready to listen. Just say what's on your mind.

3. Keep it up.

When you are hurting or discouraged, it can be difficult to read the Bible and pray. But try. God wants to share your pains and sorrows.

4. Let others know.

Painful experiences can bring growth if you use them to nurture your relationship with God. And you'll heal and grow even more when you share with others how talking and listening to God helped you.

Hope from the Bible

We can come to God with no doubts. This means that when we ask God for things (and those things agree with what God wants for us), God cares about what we say. He listens to us every time we ask him. So we know that he gives us whatever we ask from him.

1 John 5:14–15

So what should we say about this? If God is for us, no one can stand against us. And God is with us. He even let his own Son suffer for us. God gave his Son for all of us. So now with Jesus, God will surely give us all things.
