





GARDEN GROVE CAMPUS

Garden Grove Campus houses career and technical education (CTE) activities, which are primarily funded through a series of grants designed to increase student success, retention, persistence, transfer, job placement, articulation, collaboration with K-16 partners, and employment. To meet the grant requirement activities of approximately \$4.5 million in grants, the Garden Grove Campus hosts a wide variety of activities such as Pathway Days, CyberPatriot competitions, workshops, trainings, articulation events, and community outreach activities such as tax preparation and regional meetings. In addition to these activities, the campus supports the activities of the Transfer Center, Counseling, and the Intercultural Resource Center. The campus seeks to remodel the information commons to allow for tutoring, computer usage, industry testing, and grant coordinators' workspace. GGC is expanding the regional NetLab Center, which allows colleges to reduce their IT footprint and software licensing requirements and utilize a virtual system 24/7.

NEWPORT BEACH CAMPUS

The Newport Beach Campus focuses on Science, Arts, and Mathematics (SAM) and the Special Programs Center. The campus has increased site-based offerings which has led to an increase in enrollment and sections in STEM. Future plans are to continue to build momentum in the natural and physical sciences by adding courses and programs for students with majors in other science areas (e.g., geosciences) and engineering. In addition to the plans for expansion, the chairs and dean are seeking to add more technical courses in the areas of arts, music, and, potentially, biotechnology. NBC has also identified tutoring space within the Student Success Center, added furnishings for outdoor areas and second floor atrium, is currently identifying quiet study areas, and is implementing a card system in the SSC to allow pay-to-print for students. It is also the location of the locally recognized Coastline Art Gallery. The Art Gallery is open to the public and showcases the works of student artists, community artists, and well-known international artists.

WESTMINSTER LE-JAO CAMPUS

Westminster Le-Jao Campus prides itself in promoting a learning environment that respects and meets the individual needs of its diverse student population. In order to support the success of diverse student populations and diverse learning styles, redesigning classroom space is a priority. Currently the campus has 19 general-use classrooms and one wet lab. Two of the general-use classrooms had been converted into hybrid use rooms that are used as computer labs and/or general use classrooms. The campus identified two more classrooms for upgrade to allow for the multi-use of classroom/lab spaces and completed construction for the new Student Success Center. A collaborative work-space was also included in the design of the Student Resource Center. Additionally, Library services have been extended to the SRC via a parttime librarian, and group meeting rooms are now equipped with computer monitors.

FOUNTAIN VALLEY STUDENT SERVICES CENTER


The Fountain Valley Student Services Center is located in Fountain Valley and is the Administration building for Coastline College. It houses the Admission's Office, the Bookstore, Counseling Office, Assessment Center, Financial Aid, EOPS. The Admissions and Records department and the Counseling departments are implementing Cranium Café, the asynchronous platform used to increase student access and to engage with students at a distance. The Financial Aid department makes more than one hundred informational financial aid videos available to students on their website covering almost every financial aid subject and is continuing to provide support and resources to students through Financial Aid TV, events, and awareness materials. The Student Services Center continues to adopt new technology and practices to strengthen student access and 98.5% of Distance Learning students report satisfaction with support services.

Construction will begin soon on a new building for the Coastline College Fountain Valley Student Services Center, which will turn this campus into a cutting-edge, one-stop shop for everything related to student services. The new Coastline Student Services Center, whose exterior design will harmonize and strengthen the overall character of the Coastline College. As a "gateway" building, it will provide members of the college community and visitors with an even stronger and more visceral sense that they are entering a great innovative campus.


Learning 1st Programs











Learning 1st Programis a guided pathway program offering students an opportunity to pursue an Associate degree from Coastline and a Bachelor's degree from a partner university, entirely online. This is an affordable online option for busy adults. Learning 1st is a collaborative partnership among four nationally recognized, regionally-accredited online institutions. The partnership consists of Pennsylvania State University (Penn State World Campus), Troy University (Troy), the University of Illinois-Springfield (UIS), the University of Massachusetts-Amherst (UMass-Amherst), and Coastline College.

Coastline's Military Programs. Coastline's Extended Learning Division (ELD) has over 35 years of experience providing specialized programs and services within the military community. Distance education classes, Certificates, and Associate Degree Programs are available to active duty servicemembers, veterans, and their families. ELD has a dedicated team of faculty and staff experienced with serving the military community. Coastline College hosts several National Testing Center (NTC) facilities offering CLEP and DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST) testing. During 2019-2020, the National Testing Centers provided approximately 1995 tests to military service members and their families: CLEP (825), DSST (572), and Pearson Vue (568). The Extended Learning Division has 11 Military Site Advisors


(MSAs) positioned at various locations throughout the United States who aid with admissions and work in support of student services to provide unofficial evaluations and inclusive interaction. MSA team members performed over 9400 interactions with over 6100 students or potential students in FY20.

The Computer Service Technology and Computer Information Systems departments are committed to the development of cyber defense education pathways and cybersecurity workforce development initiatives. Coastline collaborates to develop cybersecurity education pathways through articulation agreements and activities to inform students about the cybersecurity education and career pathway programs. Among the various pathway initiatives, the program includes CyberTech Girls workshops and CyberPatriot competitions for middle and high school students, an online AS in Cybersecurity degree with handson technical experiences, a cybersecurity student club, skill-building cybersecurity competitions, and on-the-job training and industry certifications for apprentices in the CA Cybersecurity Apprenticeship Program.

STUDENT SERVICES







Comprehensive Online Library Services. Coastline is recognized as a pioneer and a leader in delivering comprehensive online library services, with Librarian Elizabeth Horan serving as a teacher, mentor, and a resource to other colleges during the transition to remote during COVID 19. Librarians streamlined the transition of working 100% online without interruption for students. They created a magnitude of YouTube tutorials for students to learn how to use different online systems at Coastline.

Coastline was the first community college to go live with the California Library Services Platform (LSP) project and organized local community colleges to collaborate on the LSP project.

Open Education Resource (OER) materials. To support student access, retention, and success Coastline faculty curated and developed a wide array of free Open Education Resource (OER) materials, replacing expensive books and instructional materials. The highest in the Coast District, Coastline has developed 243 sections of Open Educational Resource (OER) offerings. Coastline sections using zerocost course materials has increased annually by 60%. Successfully created zero-cost course materials for general education courses in Option 2 (CSU) transfer pathway.

Coastline's Extended Opportunities Programs & Services (EOPS) help students who come from disadvantaged backgrounds achieve their academic goals through financial aid and numerous student support services. EOPS also manages Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE), which provides extra support for single parents, and NextUp, a support program for current and former foster youth.

Coastline Promise. Coastline implemented the Coastline Promise for the third year, providing free enrollment fees, books, and other supplies as well as case-managed support services for eligible first-time college students.



HELPING STUDENTS

In partnership with Coastline, Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB) delivered 20,878 pounds of food to the Student Food Pantry in Fountain Valley, which equated to 17,398 meals for Coastline students and has been expanded to operate through summer and provide fresh produce. In Spring 2020, the Coastline Pantry had 865 visits, including a Drive-By Food Pantry during COVID-19.

DURING COVID-19


A Summer Wellness series of workshops and activities was developed and implemented. A Technology Loan Program was created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the distribution of technology learning materials to students included Chromebooks, tablets with internet, webcams, and hot spots.

Emergency relief funds were provided to eligible students economically impacted by COVID-19: \$154,000 of CARES Act funds, \$40,000 Associated Student Government Emergency Funds, and \$102,250 Foundation Emergency Funds.

INSTRUCTIONAL/ PROGRAMMATIC EXCELLENCE

The Computer Service Technology and Computer Information Systems

has expanded the program to include the new Amazon Web Services (AWS) Associate Certificate of Accomplishment to provide students with the knowledge and skills needed for industry-recognized certifications and in-demand cloud jobs. The new Associate of Science in Digital Forensics and Incident Response (DFIR) program is now available as a program major. This is a milestone accomplishment of the Cyber Up! DFIR project under the National Science Foundation award #1800999. The Cisco Networking Academy program has been updated to the latest version to provide students with the skills needed for computer networking jobs.







The Extended Learning Division was recognized for its 10th consecutive year by Military Times as one of the best online and nontraditional colleges in 2020 serving military and veteran students. The college's military program awarded 620 degrees and 169 certificates during 2019-2020. The Military and Corporate Education Programs continue to maintain high success rates; Military Online 86.1%/Corporate 80% in 2019-2020.

Coastline College has three Veterans Resource Centers (VRCs) that provide resources and support to student veterans and the veteran community. During 2019-2020, the VRCs worked with Community partners and supporters to provide veterans with \$5,000.00 worth of gas cards and \$4,998.49 in textbooks grants. A Veteran Resource Center ongoing funding allocation in the amount of \$52,978.00 was awarded to Coastline College in 2019-2020.

The Emergency Management and Homeland Security program is the first associate degree-certificate granting program of its kind in the California Community College system. The program faculty have provided leadership in the development of EM/HS education throughout California. Additionally, Coastline faculty members are the presenters of the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office state grant initiative developing homeland security academic programs across the state.

Coastline's Business Program boasts the highest number of degrees awarded in the state thanks to the excellent work of the program's exceptional faculty, whose collaboration has resulted in a truly unique and effective program which offers concentrations in health care management, marketing, human resources, and supply chain management, as well as several popular certificates in entrepreneurship and home business development.

Coastline is the largest provider of education for students who are incarcerated in the state. Coastline's inmate education continues to play a vital role in supporting underserved students, transforming lives of students, and generating enrollments and FTES for the college. Student Success and Achievement Outcomes for 2019-2020 are 75.5% success and 92.5% retention. A 2013 RAND study shows that education reduces recidivism rates by over 40% for students who are incarcerated. Serving these students remains an integral part of Coastline's strategic plan.

Coastline offered the most courses and enrollments in the state of any of the Online Education Initiative (OEI) colleges. The OEI is a seamless pathway for students to register for online courses across participating colleges without requiring students to complete separate matriculation processes. Distance Learning enrollment remains as the highest in the state.




Tobi West, Coastline Professor and Department Chair
