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
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Introduction

Travel Tips

Languages

German

The German-speaking part of Switzerland comprises 65% of the country with 17 cantons having German as their official language.

Italian

Considered to be Switzerland's third language, around 350,000 people speak Swiss Italian as their native language, both in the canton of Ticino and in the trilingual canton of Graubünden.

Romansch

Romansch is predominantly spoken in the southeast, specifically in the Canton of Graubünden, where Italian and German are also official languages.

French

The French and German speaking parts of Switzerland are said to be split by an invisible line, known as Röstigraben. Known as Romandy, the French-speaking section of Switzerland is famous for the Lavaux wine region and its world-class cities.



Currency

Swiss Francs (CHF) is the main currency of Switzerland. In some locations, Euros are accepted but it is an expensive choice given that the exchange rate may not be in your favor.










Mountain Excursions








Zurich

Resting picturesquely on the banks of Lake Zurich where the River Limmat flows into the pristine turquoise lake, Switzerland's largest city gracefully balances modern Swiss sensibilities with its storied past. Zurich is often hailed as one of the most liveable and attractive cities in the world and it's easy to see why - the diverse array of charming architecture built throughout history, its relaxing yet lively lakefront promenade, and opulent ambience evident in its world-class

dining and museums. As one of the country's major cultural and financial centers, Zurich holds a special importance for the Swiss and especially for the German-speaking portions of the country, with a long history as one of the European centers of banking and finance, as well as being a deep tradition of opera and theater that coexists alongside a cosmopolitan nightlife today. From its church spires to its chocolatiers or simply the view of the Alps across the lake, Zurich is not to be missed.



Hotel Ambassador a l'Opera 4*

This luxury hotel is ideally located just a few steps away from Zurich's star attractions, including the Old Town and the lakefront promenade. Its 45 rooms are all individually decorated, ensuring that every guest's stay is unique.



Romantik Hotel Europe 4*

This upscale, family-owned hotel is situated alongside Zurich's lakeside promenade within the city center. Each room has a unique character, combining historic Swiss style with modern charm and technology.



Glockenhof 4*





Base



Straddling both banks of the Rhine River - in the corner where Switzerland, France, and Germany meet - the elegant city of Basel shines on its own. With a strong sense of its own identity, Basel has become known as one of the world's premier cities of culture, home to almost 40 museums, various symphonies and performing artists, and the world's most renowned art fair - Art Basel. Additionally, Basel is Switzerland's oldest university city and this prestige is indicated by historic architecture, ranging from Romanesque to Baroque to Modern and everything in between. Many American travelers will see Basel as part of a Rhine River cruise and they'll be able to enjoy Basel's botanical gardens, its riverfront parks, its fine dining, and its museums in just a short amount of time as part of a pre or post cruise extension.





Private Basel Walking Tour

This succinct tour of Basel will give newcomers a view of the city from a local's perspective. A private guide will take you through the city's narrow alleyways to its bustling city squares to show you Basel's impressive monuments - including the Town Hall adorned with art, the red sandstone architecture of the Basel Minster, and so much more.

Stago



Within the canton of Bern, this sleepy mountain village's quaint timbered architecture belies its reputation as an upscale resort town popular with the rich and famous. Enjoy a stroll through traffic-free city center where a plethora of shopping and fine dining options await. Outside of the village of Gstaad are numerous neighboring villages within the five valleys of Gstaad that showcase a more authentic and slower side of Switzerland.

Only a 3 hour train ride from Geneva, Gstaad is a winter sports paradise with over 120 miles of ski slopes and several snowparks. During the summer, hike or mountain bike along the 186 miles of trails, canoe or kayak on the River Saane, hit the links for a round of golf, or even go cross-country skiing at the Glacier 3000 ski region.







Hotel Gstaaderhof 4*

This family-owned hotel is located in the center of Gstaad and is only a short walk from the train station and the ski lifts. This hotel exemplifies the Alpine tradition with its classic Swiss chalet style and offers equally authentic accommodations in every room. Relax in the sauna, enjoy the first-class dining experience at the in-hotel Müli Restaurant, or simply stroll along the promenade of Gstaad nearby.





Park Gstaad 5*

This upscale hotel combines the authentic Swiss chalet design with refined and understated luxury. First opened in 1910, this hotel now offers 4 restaurants with a wide range of culinary options, an all-encompassing spa program, and even a cigar lounge with mountain views.



Interlaken

Within the Bernese Oberland is the adventure capital of Europe, the city of Interlaken. Snugly located between the glacial lakes of Lake Thun and Lake Brienz, the city is blessed with gorgeous mountain vistas in all directions, without actually being in the mountains. A small but lively town with a wide range of restaurants, shops, and (of course) chocolatiers, the city's attractions pale in

comparison to the array of adventurous activities beyond the city limits. In winter, Interlaken is the gateway to the Jungfrau region and world-class skiing; in summer, this makes a great home base for hiking in the Bernese Alps, kayaking on the nearby lakes, or simply enjoying that Alpine air and Swiss culture in a nearby village.





Jungfraujoch

Known as the Top of Europe, an expedition to Jungfraujoch is quintessentially Swiss. From the top, completely engulfed in the snow and ice, the views of the Bernese Alps and its stunning mountain valleys are unforgettable. On a clear day, even Germany's Black Forest is visible. Home to the highest train station in Europe, the Sphinx Observatory, and a restaurant with panoramic views of the glacier - Jungfraujoch continues to attract visitors every year and continues to leave intrepid explorers speechless.

Hotel Interlaken 4*

This historic hotel, built in 1491, combines classic Swiss elegance with modern tastes. Located in the center of town, just a few minutes from the train station, visitors can stroll through the Japanese Gardens next door and enjoy authentic Swiss cuisine in the hotel restaurant.



Lindner Grand Hotel Beau Rivage 5*






Small Group Swiss Food & Culture Tour



The mountain village of Wengen is located almost directly beneath Jungfrau, offering visitors sublime views of the mountains above and the valley below with easy access to ski lifts and the ski slopes. Finally, charming Mürren, perched atop a cliff, is a car-free mountain village across the valley from Wengen with panoramic mountain views and quick access to hiking trails and ski slopes. No matter which of these cities you choose, you are ensured to have a pictureperfect Alpine getaway.






Montana Art Deco Hotel 4*



A stopover on the Glacier Express, this sleepy, well-preserved historic village entices with traditional wooden houses and an easygoing pace compared to high-traffic ski destinations. Not just a winter wonderland, Andermatt is a year-round destination with hiking, climbing, and golf being warmweather draws.







Radisson Andermatt 4*

Designed as a modern interpretation of a Swiss chalet, the Radisson Blu Hotel Reussen is perfectly positioned in the heart of the serene, snow-capped Alps. The hotel is situated in the center of charming Andermatt and is the ideal base for any mountain enthusiast.

Valais Matterhorn Region

Valais is a canton in southern Switzerland filled with stunning, wild nature. It is home to the pyramid-shaped Matterhorn mountain, upscale Alpine resorts, as well as the largest producer of wine in Switzerland and the starting point of the Glacier Express scenic train in Zermatt. The region is also home to Leukerbad, the largest thermal bath and wellness resort in the Alps, and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Aletsch Glacier, the longest ice flow in the Alps. Valais is the ideal destination for outdoor adventure in Switzerland whether you choose to hike, bike, drive, or ski.





Located in the same area, you'll find the eponymous Matterhorn, towering over the town of Zermatt. Other renown destinations include nearby Saas Fee, the Pearl of the Alps. Both Zermatt and Saas fee are car free and world-renown ski destinations in winter and perfect spots for outdoor sports, such as hiking and biking. For unrivaled panoramic views of the Matterhorn, take Gornergrat Bahn, Europe's highest open-air cog railway, from Zermatt to the Gornergrat ridge of the Pennine Alps.
