

Abuse Happens!!

Each year, thousands of older

Pennsylvanians are being abused,
neglected, exploited or abandoned by
members of their families or others. Older
adults are often individuals who are
vulnerable and are unable to help
themselves and rely on others to meet their
daily basic needs.

Pennsylvania's Older Adult Protective
Services program can assist these older
adults . Active Aging staff will investigate
reports of need to determine what services
can be offered to the older adult to
eliminate or mitigate the risk of abuse,
neglect or exploitation.

What to look for.

Abuse-Physical, Sexual or Emotional

- Cuts, Bruises and Broken Bones
- Complaint of pain in pelvic area
- Emotionally Withdrawn
- Fearful or intimidated
- Isolation and Anxiousness

Neglect- By Self or Caregiver

- Malnutrition and Dehydration
- Untreated medical condition
- Inadequate clothing or personal hygiene
- Inadequate living situation

Exploitation-

- Unpaid bills, homelessness, lack of food or medication
- Missing money from bank accounts
- Unusual use of credit cards
- Missing possessions

Abandonment-

 Desertion by a caregiver or family member

How to Report

Anyone who witnesses or suspects abuse may call Active Aging at 814-336-1792 or 1-800-321-7705. Trained staff is available to take a report on the older adult. Name and address of the older adult is helpful but not necessary.

What Happens Next?

Trained staff will locate the older adult and begin an investigation into the allegations on the report. If the older adult is found to be in need of protective services, staff will offer services to that individual to eliminate or mitigate the risk.

The older adult does have the right to decline services. Protective services may not be involuntarily provided unless there is evidence that the older adult is at risk of death or serious physical harm.
