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
Seldom before in American history has it been so necessary for the young men of America to be well trained in the science of physical fitness and combat conditioning. War today creates demands that were never before thought possible.

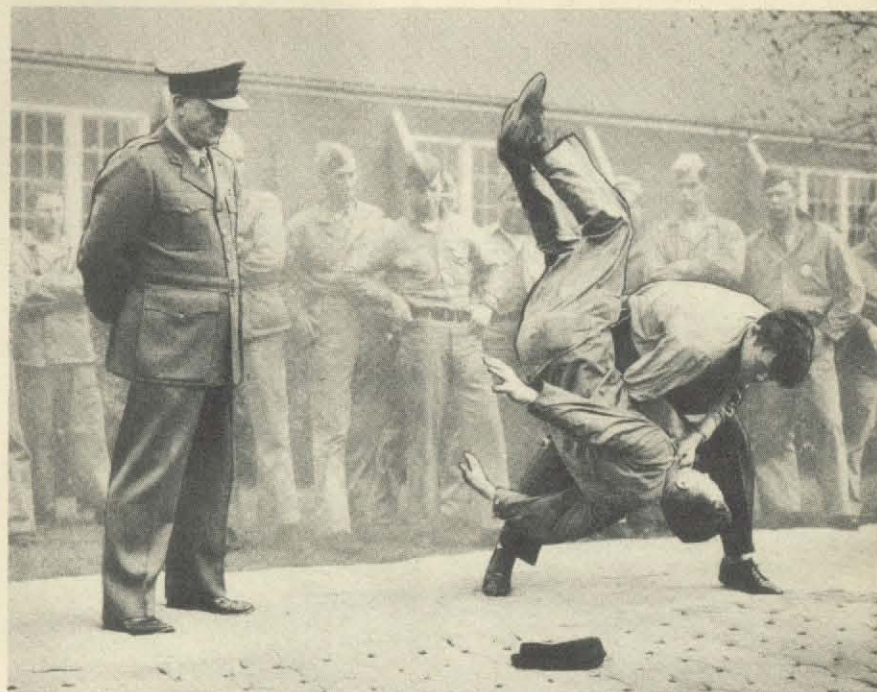
America's problem today is to match and surpass the toughness of our enemies - and this can be done only through a thorough and far reaching program of physical training.

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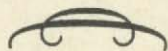
PREPARING FOR JIU JITSU DEFENSE FALLS AND THROWS

It is important to prepare the body for Jiu Jitsu slams.

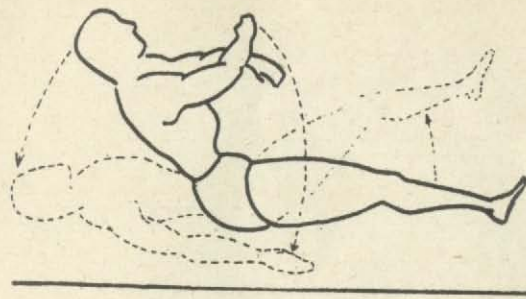
After a little practice you will be able to throw and be thrown practically from any position without shock or injury to the body.

It is very important to exercise as shown on the following pages.

This will give you an idea on how to prepare for falls. Be sure to relax. When throwing an opponent in practice, grasp his sleeve near the muscle and hold him back slightly. Use either hand.

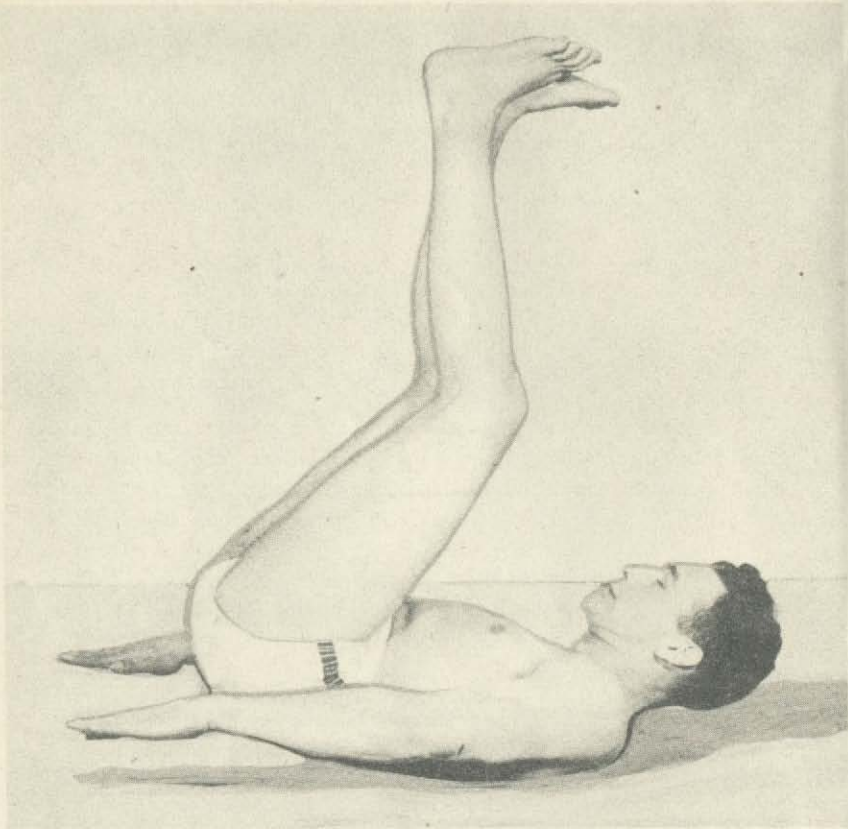

JIU JITSU FALLING EXERCISES

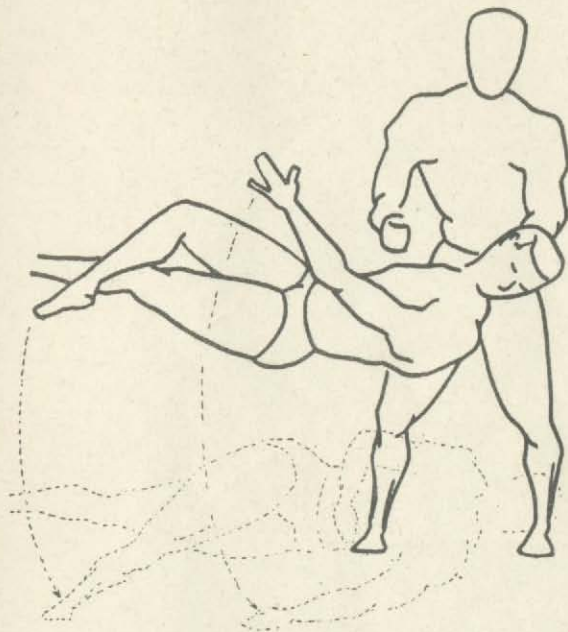
1. Lay flat, feet stretched out, chin pulled in, cross extended arms across chest and let them fall on mat in a slapping position, about 45° from body. Cup hands slightly. Repeat this many times.
2. Sit up, cross arms and fall back. Hand should slap mat at same time back does.
3. (Not sketched.) Lay flat on mat, cross arms. Rotate body to the left. The left arm then slaps the mat 45° from body. The right leg swings across the left leg, slapping the mat with the sole of the foot. Same movement for the right. Repeat this many times.



JIU JITSU DEFENSE FALLING EXERCISE

1. Lay flat, feet stretched out, chin pulled in, cross extended arms across chest and let them fall on mat in a slapping position, about 45 degrees from body. Cup hands slightly. Repeat this many times.
2. Sit up, cross arms and fall back. Hand should slap mat at same time back does.

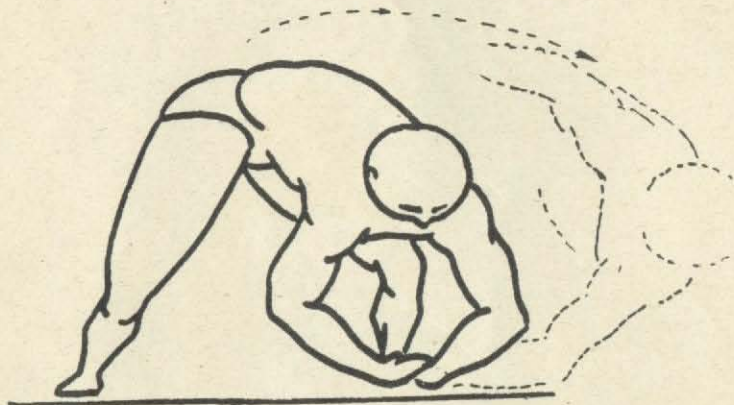

FALLING EXERCISES

When you are thrown by an opponent with the hip throw or over-shoulder throw, twist your body while falling in same position as sketched. Your hand must be 45° from your body. Slap hard against mat at the moment of impact of your body.

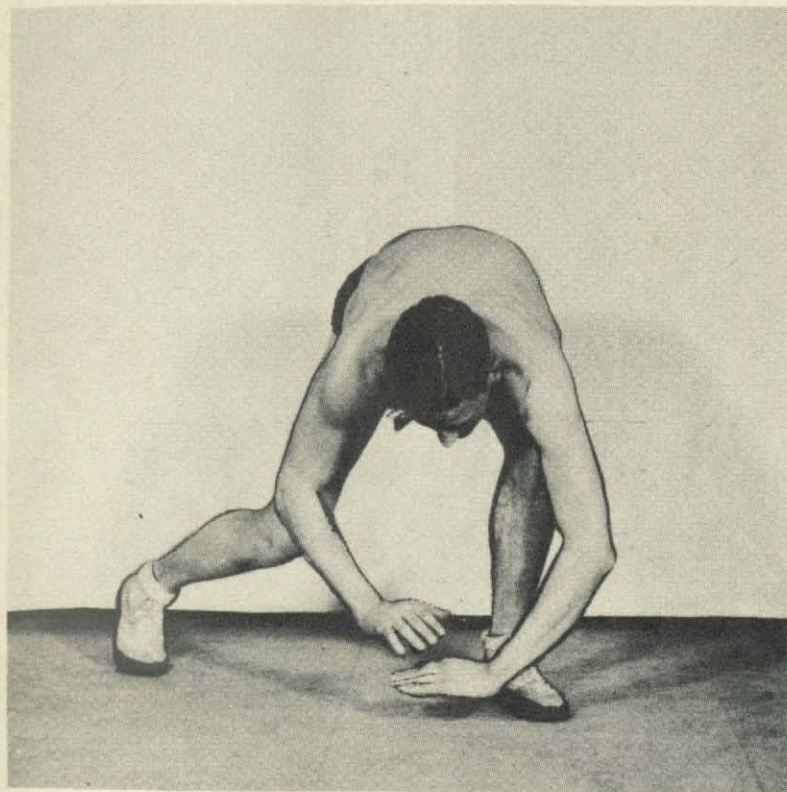

FALLING EXERCISES

In falling forward take 1 step forward. Your left foot will be extended, fingers pointing towards your body. Put your right hand on your left hand, palm down, fingers pointing toward your left hand. Your arms will then form a circle. Roll towards your left, rotating on your left arm, shoulder and back. Keep arms in a circular position. Then you will come up on your feet.

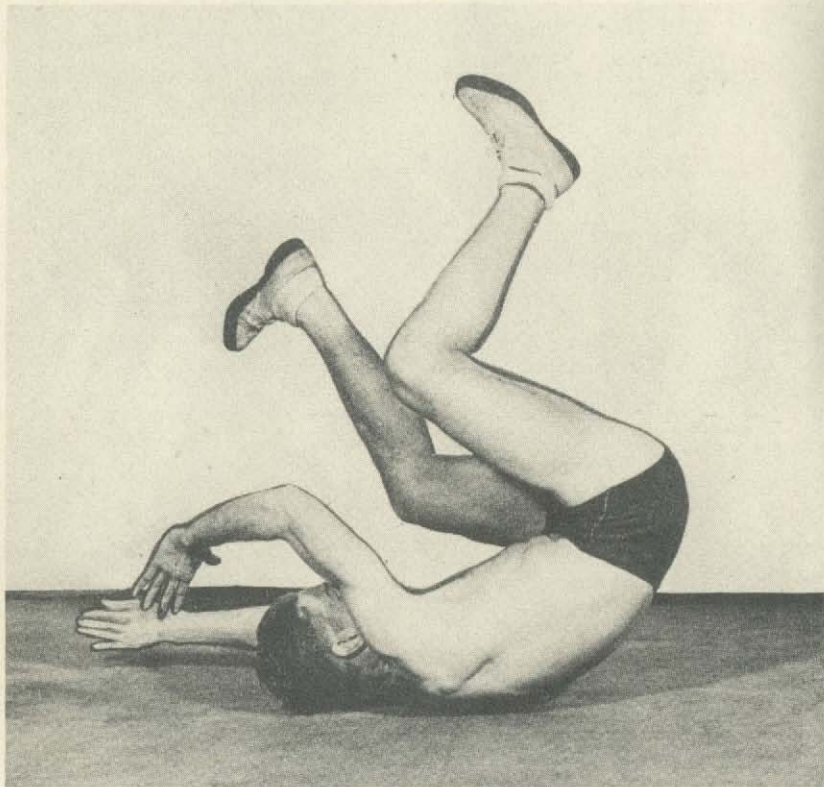
JIU JITSU FALLING EXERCISE



ACTION 1

In falling forward, your left foot must be extended, bend down and place your left hand close to the mat, fingers pointing to your right foot. Put your right hand on your left hand, palm down, fingers pointing to your left. Your arms will then form a circle.

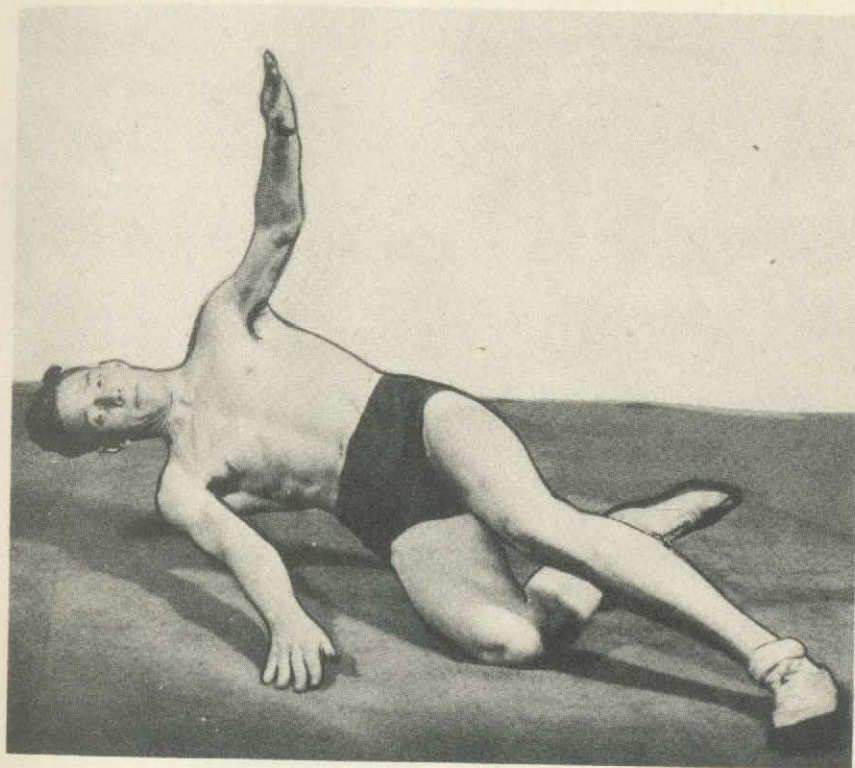
JIU JITSU FALLING EXERCISE



ACTION 2

Roll towards your left, rotating on your left arm, shoulder and back.

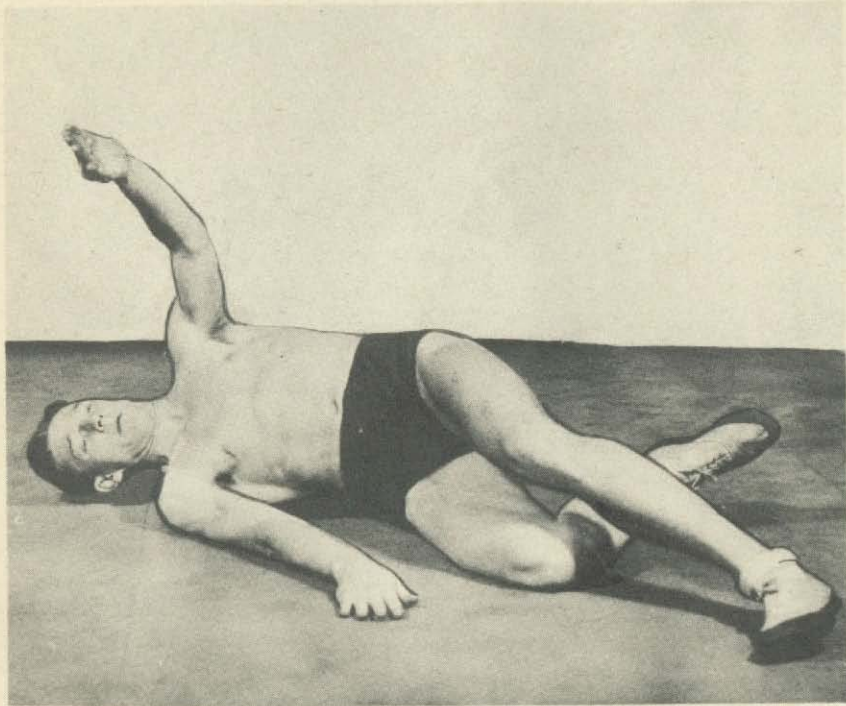
JIU JITSU FALLING EXERCISE



ACTION 3

When landing on mat, your right hand will be extended 45 degrees from your body, your left foot extending over your slightly bent right foot.

FINISH

Your right will slap the mat with your right hand slightly cupped, at the same time your body lands.

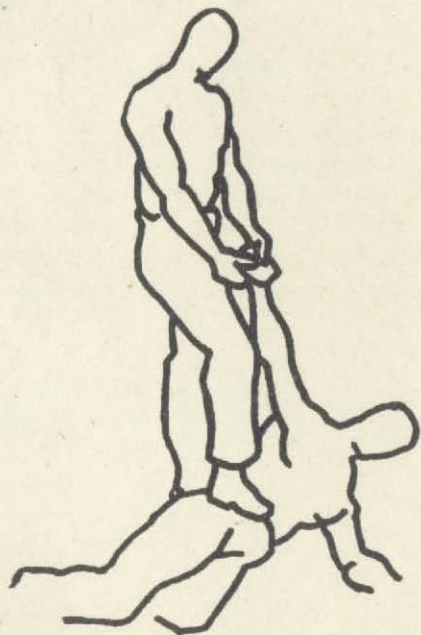
WRIST THROW

The wrist break and throw is one of the first and important things that you must learn to be a successful Jiu Jitsu player.

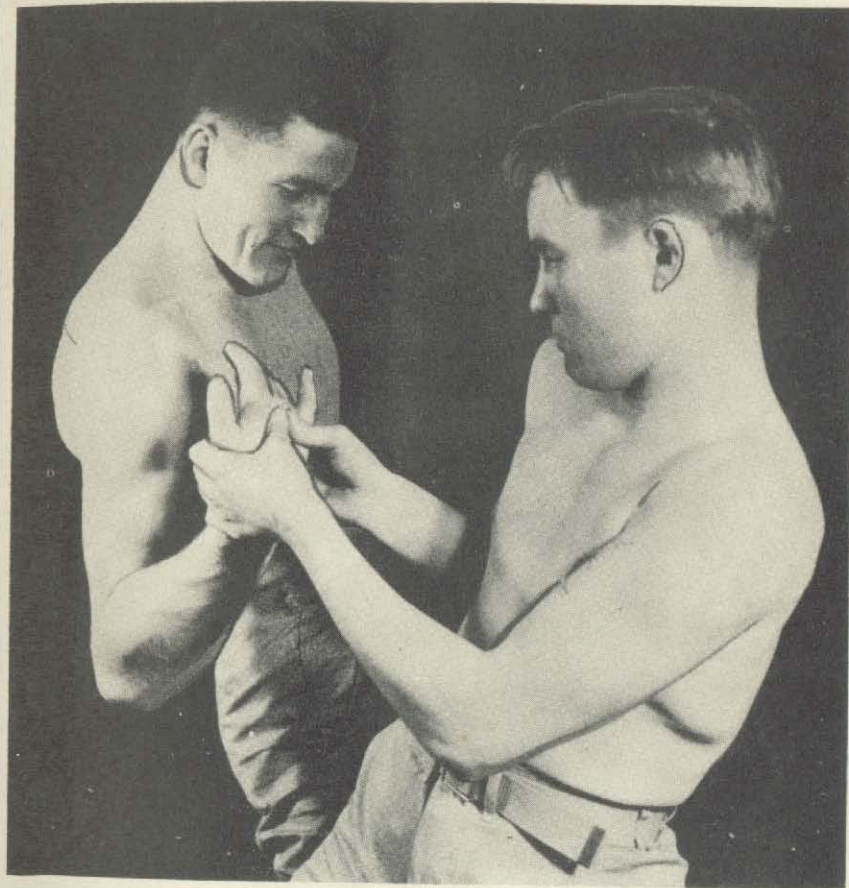
As the first thing your enemy will do is to strike at you which exposes his hand for a wrist throw.

Most successful throws are when the palm is turned back and you apply plenty of leverage by pushing his arm back to the side. Very often you will grab a man's hand and attempt to force his wrist back and he will stiffen it so that you can't bend it, pretend that you are going to pull the arm towards you, he will then try and pull it back. Step right in and this motion will cause him to bend his own wrist. It is important that you use the same hand and the same foot in applying any wrist breaks.

WRIST THROW



ACTION 1

Grasp opponent's right hand with your left hand palm facing down. Your fingers are curled around his thumb. Press your thumb hard against the back of opponent's hand. Raise his hand shoulder high applying your right hand in the same manner. Twist and push to your left and force his wrist backwards and down.

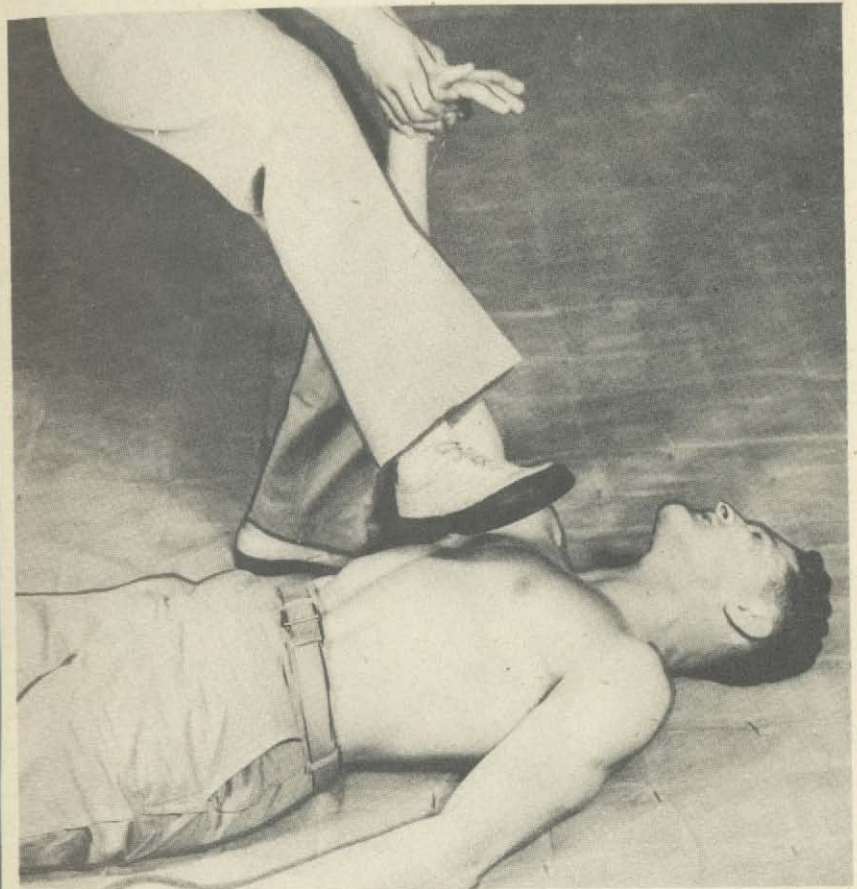
WRIST THROW



ACTION 2

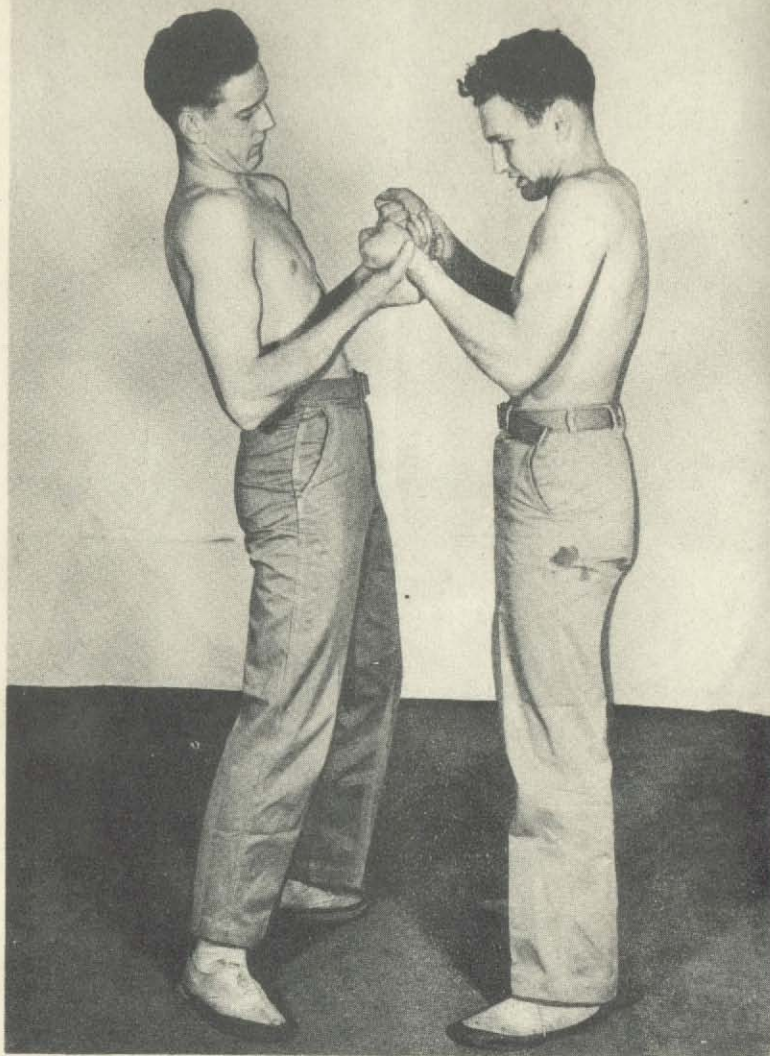
Place your right foot against his right foot blocking it from the back and throw him to the ground.

WRIST THROW



FINISH

Hold his right hand tightly and with the heel of your shoe stamp into head or testicles.

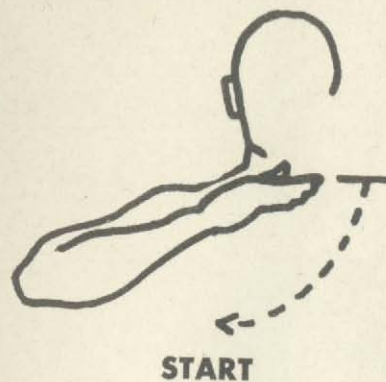


DOUBLE WRIST HOLD BREAK

Opponent grasps your wrists, standing directly in front of you with his thumbs up. To free yourself, press both of your elbows to your sides, step towards him at the same time, draw your hands in and up against your opponent's thumbs.

If your opponent is very powerful, press your arms down and against him, then bend your forearms sharply in, up and out.

ILLUSTRATING EDGE OF HAND SLASH



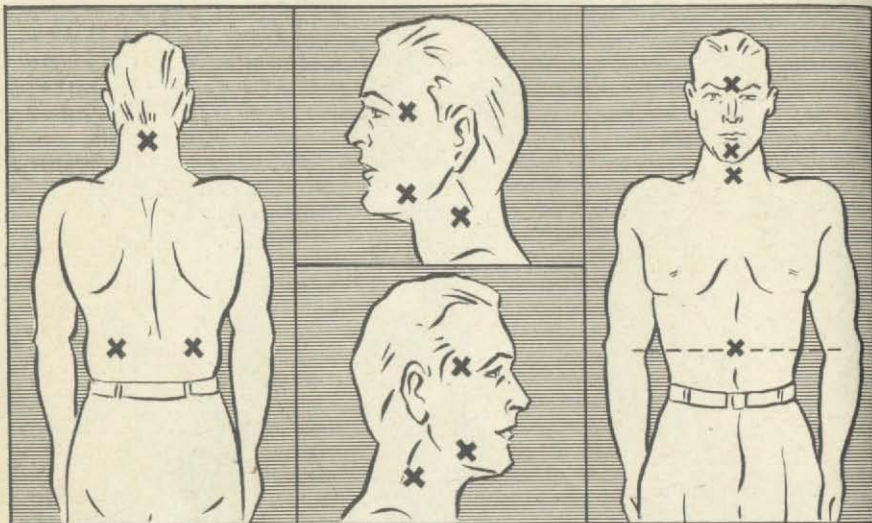
EDGE OF HAND SLASH

CAUTION: These slashes are very dangerous.

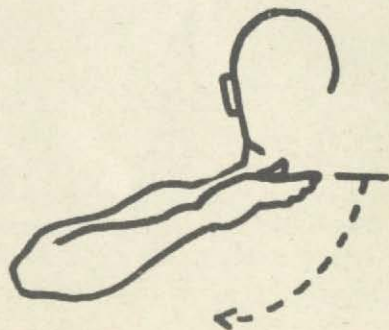
Deliver slashing blow with arm slightly bent; fingers straight and close together. Palm of hand must face down. Strike either side of neck or spine close to head or to adams apple. Use either hand for slashing.

Extremely dangerous are slashes against the bridge or base of the nose.

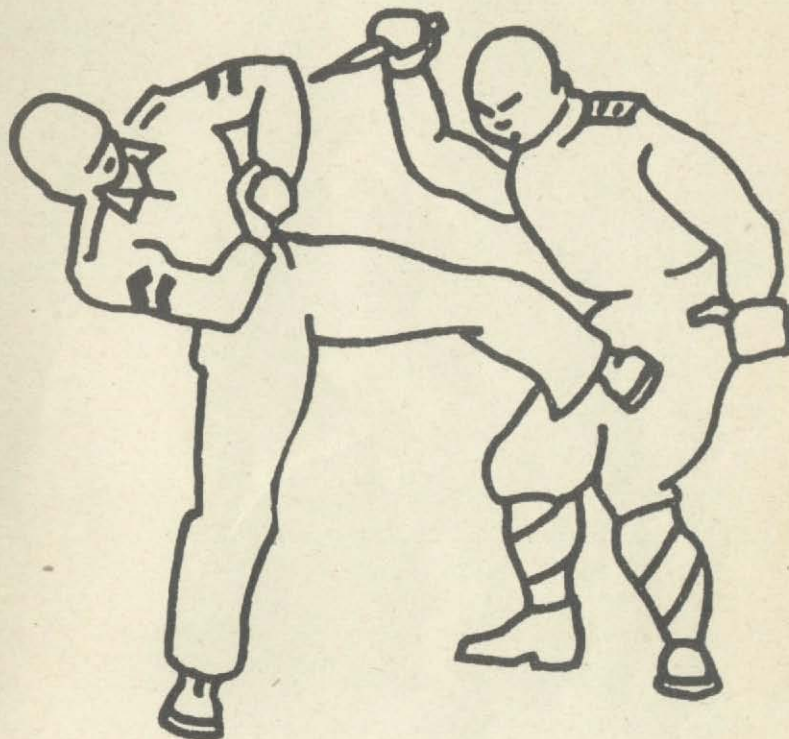
VULNERABLE SPOTS FOR KNOCKOUT BLOWS



The spots illustrated herein are vital and blows striking against them will knock a man unconscious or kill him. It is best to use the edge of the hand slash against these spots.

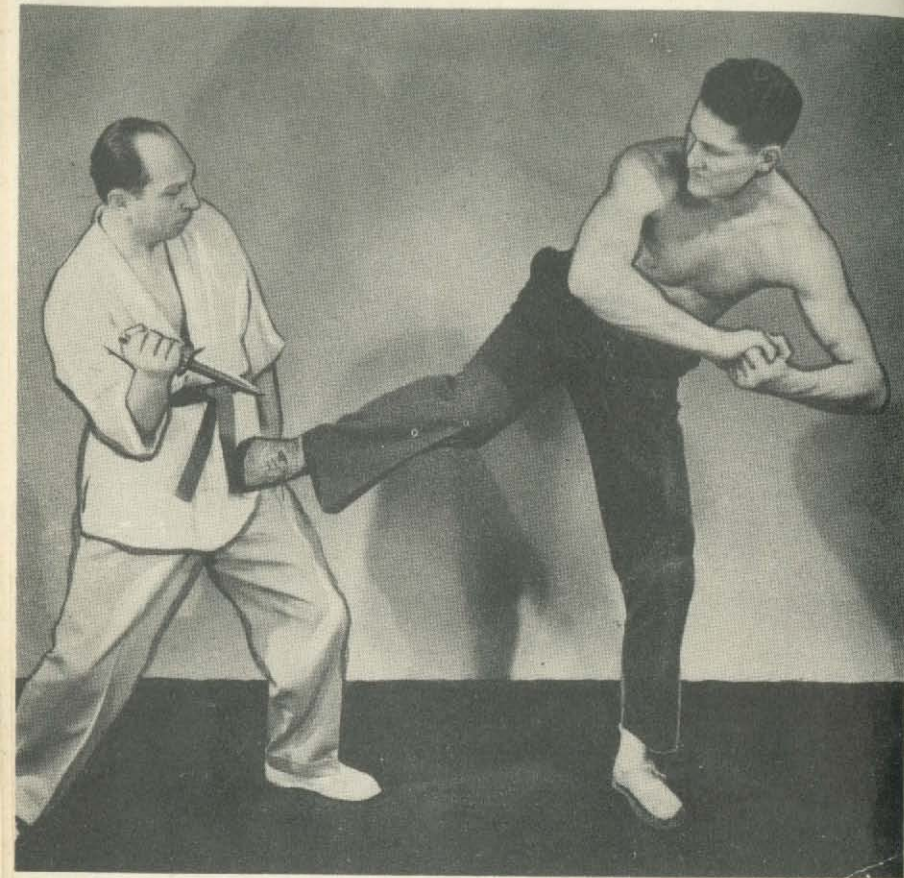


KICK DEFENSE AGAINST CLUB, KNIFE, BLOW



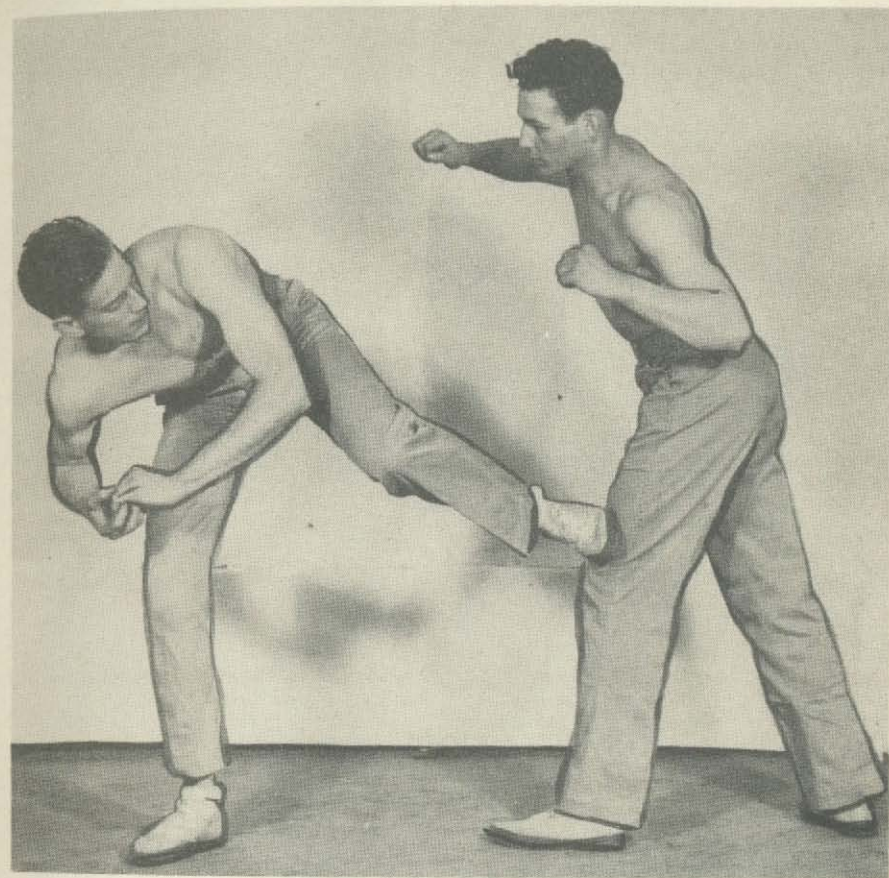
Pivot so as to be at right angles with the opponent. Clasp hands in front of chest to maintain balance. Kick leg straight out from hip, bringing foot back fast for additional kick. Aim at vulnerable spots, knee caps, testicles, heart, etc.

Use caution in practice.



KICK DEFENSE AGAINST SHARP WEAPONS

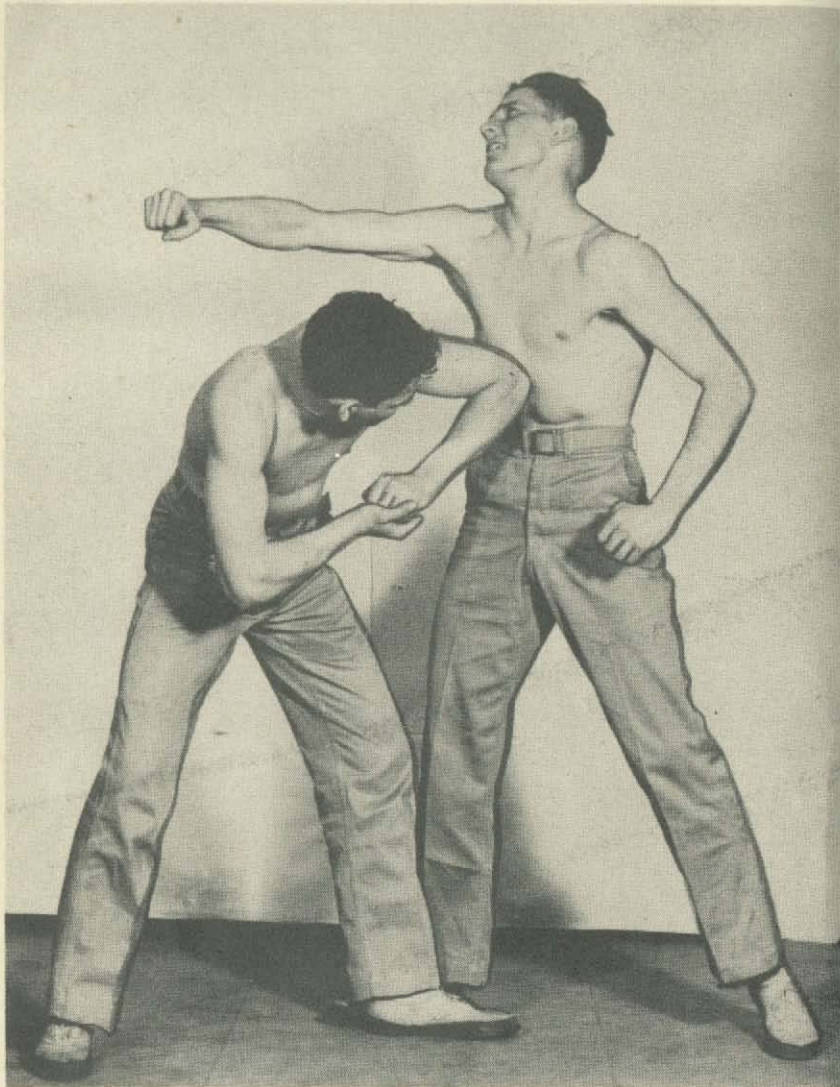
Enemy attempts to use knife, club, or fist. Step in as if you were going to box with him, grasping both hands directly in front of you for balance. Turn your foot at right angles from your enemy and kick hard, bringing the foot back immediately for another kick. Vulnerable spots are the knee-cap, testicles, stomach, heart or into the neck. This is a very important defense and a lot of practice is required, as the foot is used in the same manner as a fist would be. It must be shot quickly and returned immediately into position for another kick. Use caution in practice.



KICK DEFENSE AGAINST CLUB, BLOW

Pivot so as to be at right angles with the opponent. Clasp hands in front of chest to maintain balance. Kick leg straight out from hip, bringing foot back fast for additional kick. Aim at vulnerable spots, knee caps, testicles, heart, etc.

Use caution in practice.

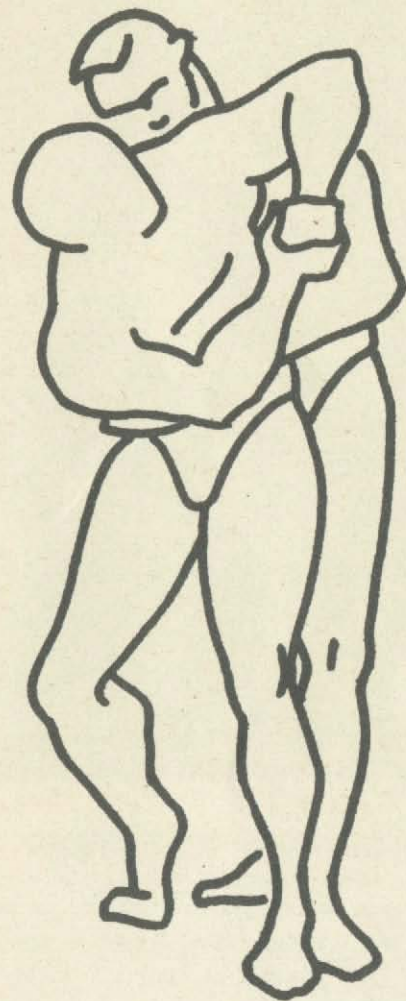


KIDNEY BLOW AGAINST BOXER

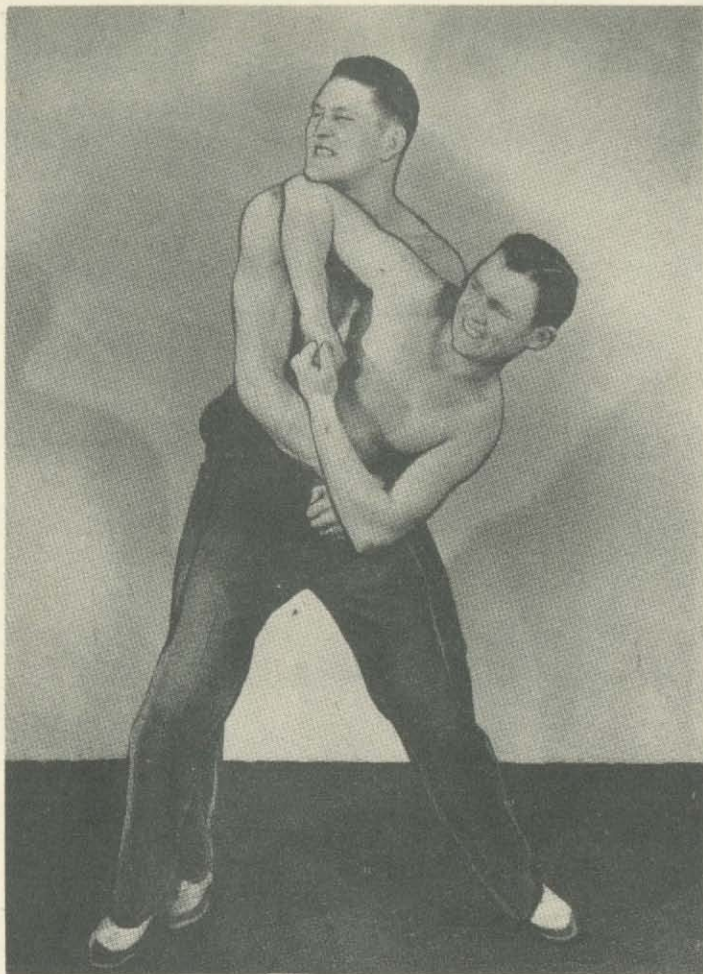
Opponent is aiming a blow at your head with his right fist.

Side step to the left pushing his right elbow to his left with your left hand. Pivot to your right until your body is facing the same direction as his, and smash your left elbow into his ribs, kidneys, heart or testicles.

BREAK FOR BACK HUG UNDER ARMS



(Instructions on following page)



BREAK FOR BACK HUG UNDER ARMS

Opponent grasps you from around the waist from the back holding you tightly. Step forward with either foot and bend forward slightly. Clasp your hands shoulder high; swing hard to either side striking his head with your elbows.

Or:

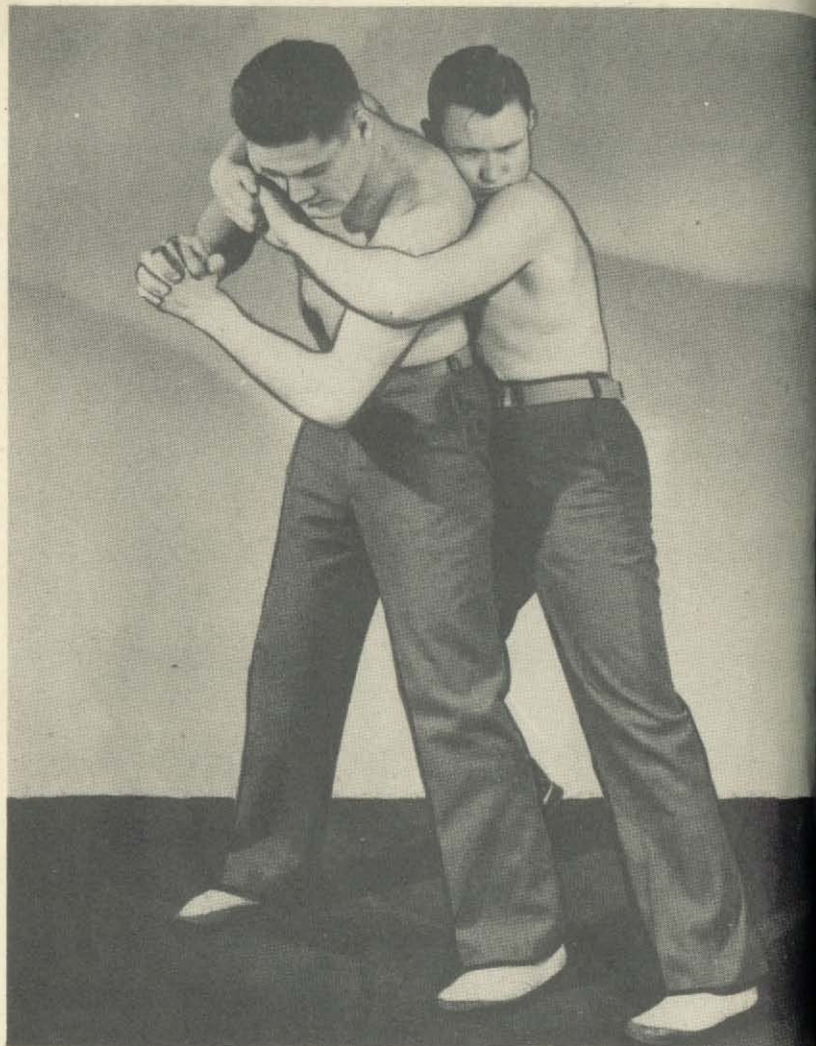
Grind heel of your shoe into his toes or instep or reach back and grasp his testicles:



BACK HOLD, OVER ARMS BREAK

ACTION 1

Enemy grasps you from the back, locking your arms to your sides. Immediately step forward with your right foot, form a "V" by clasping your hands together, take a deep breath.



**BACK HOLD, OVER ARMS BREAK
ACTION 2**

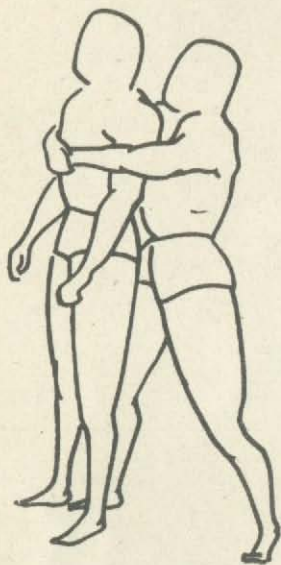
Force your arms up, shoulder high, exhaling at the same time. This will loosen his arms slightly.



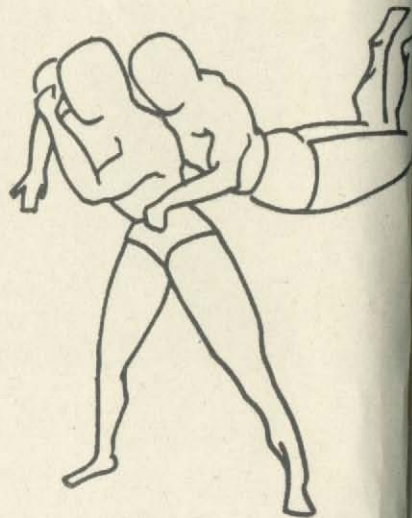
**BACK HOLD, OVER ARMS BREAK
FINISH**

Bend down quickly while still clasping your hands, thus forming a pivot. Jab your left elbow into your opponent's heart, side, stomach or testicles. Use caution in practice.

DEFENSE FOR BACK HOLDS OVER ARMS

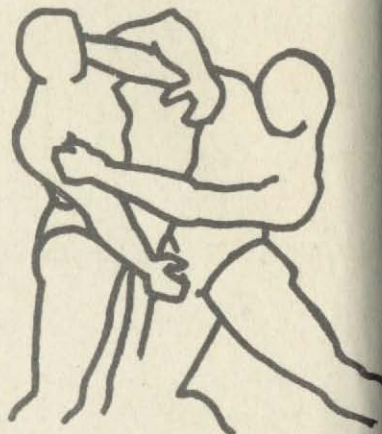
If enemy grabs you from the back locking your arms against your body step forward slightly with your right foot. Clasp your hands together and at the same time taking a deep breath, bring your hands up quickly and exhaling at the same time. Then with his hands loosened, grasp his right muscle with your left hand and with your right hand grasp him high near the collar and go into the "Over Shoulder Throw"

Or:

Jab your left elbow into his kidneys.

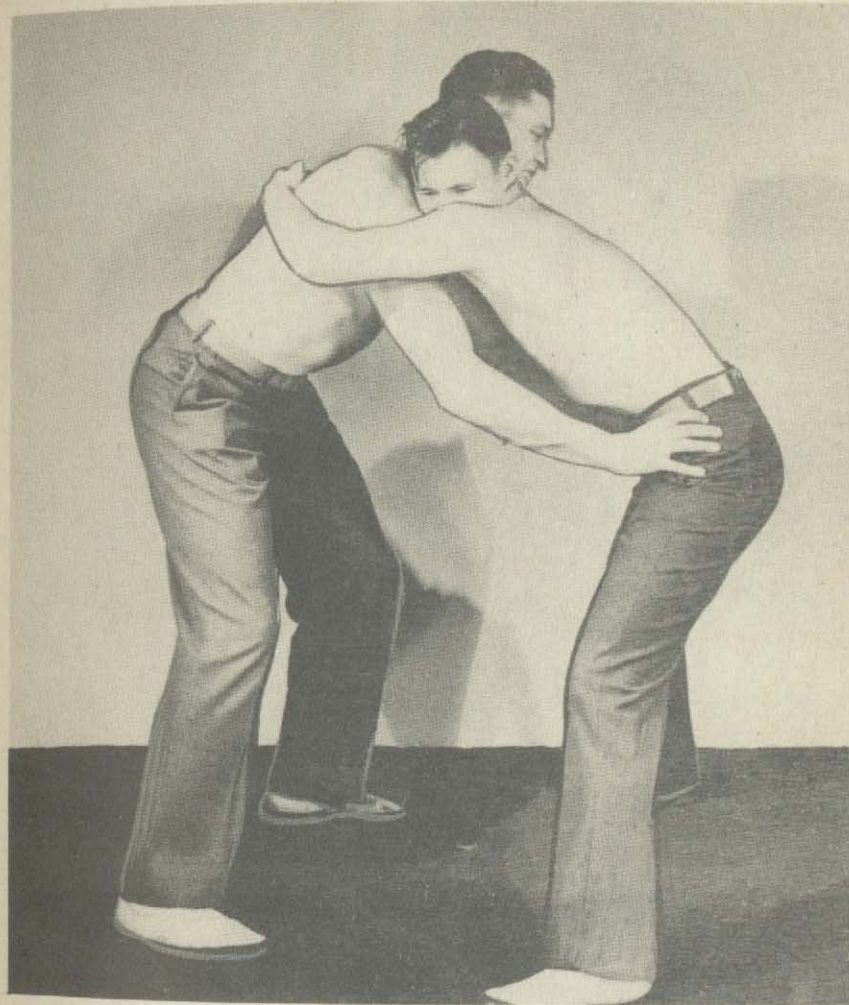


BREAK FOR FRONT HUG



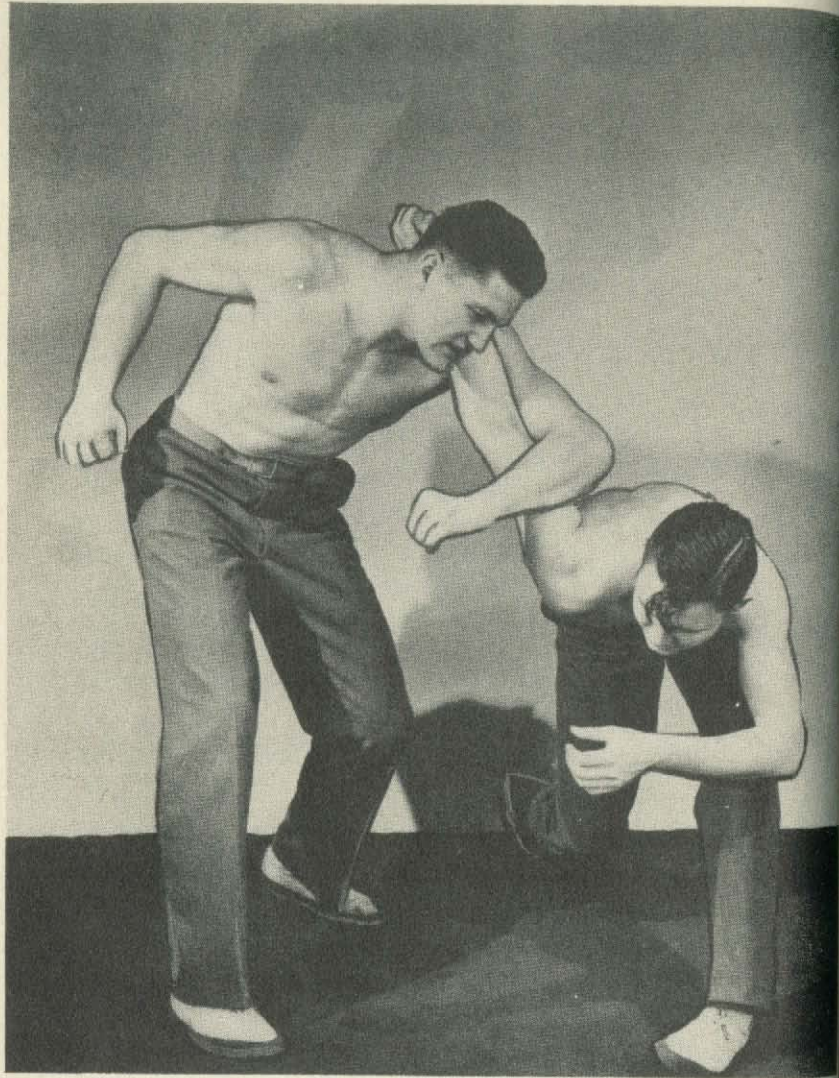

FRONT HUG BREAK



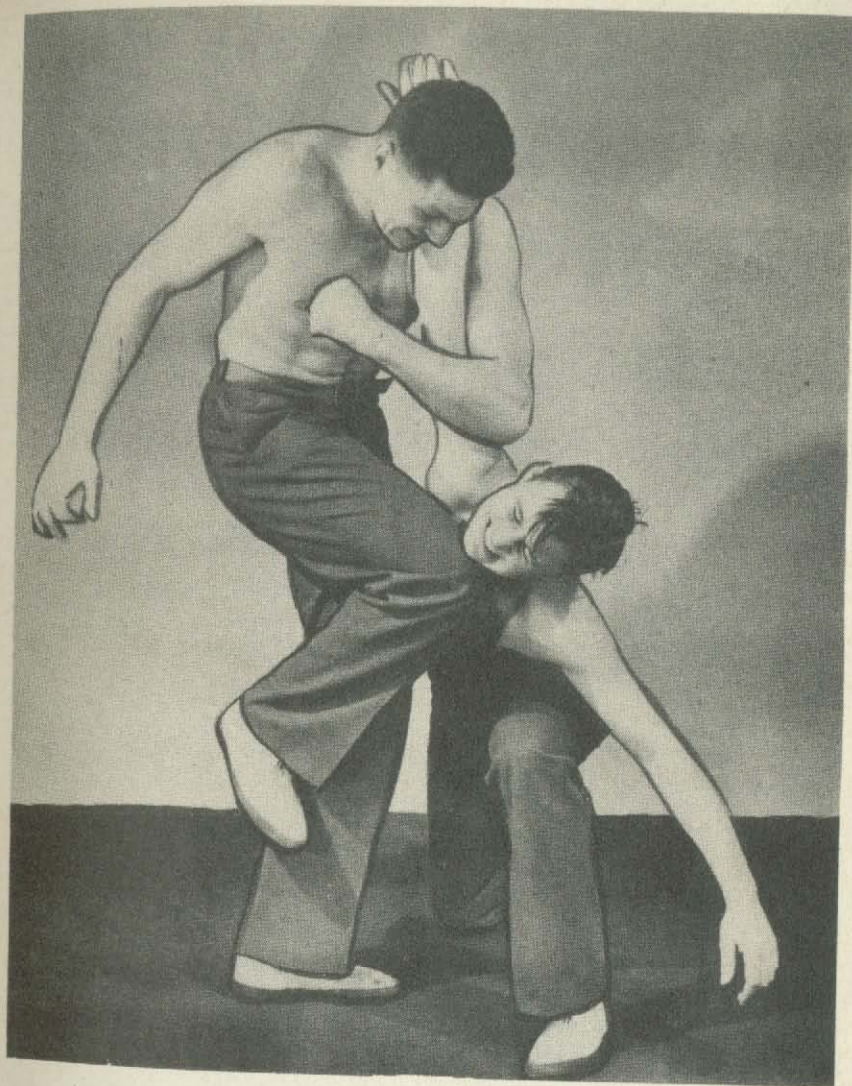
ACTION 1

Your opponent grasps you tightly from the front, locking your arms to your sides. Place your hands flat against his thighs, forcing him to back away from you; or bite his ear, causing him to bend forward.



**FRONT HUG BREAK
ACTION 2**

You can also grasp his testicles, forcing him to step back, and with your left hand reach up and over in a circular movement, forcing his right arm against your neck and shoulder. Push down hard on his arm causing considerable pain, or break.



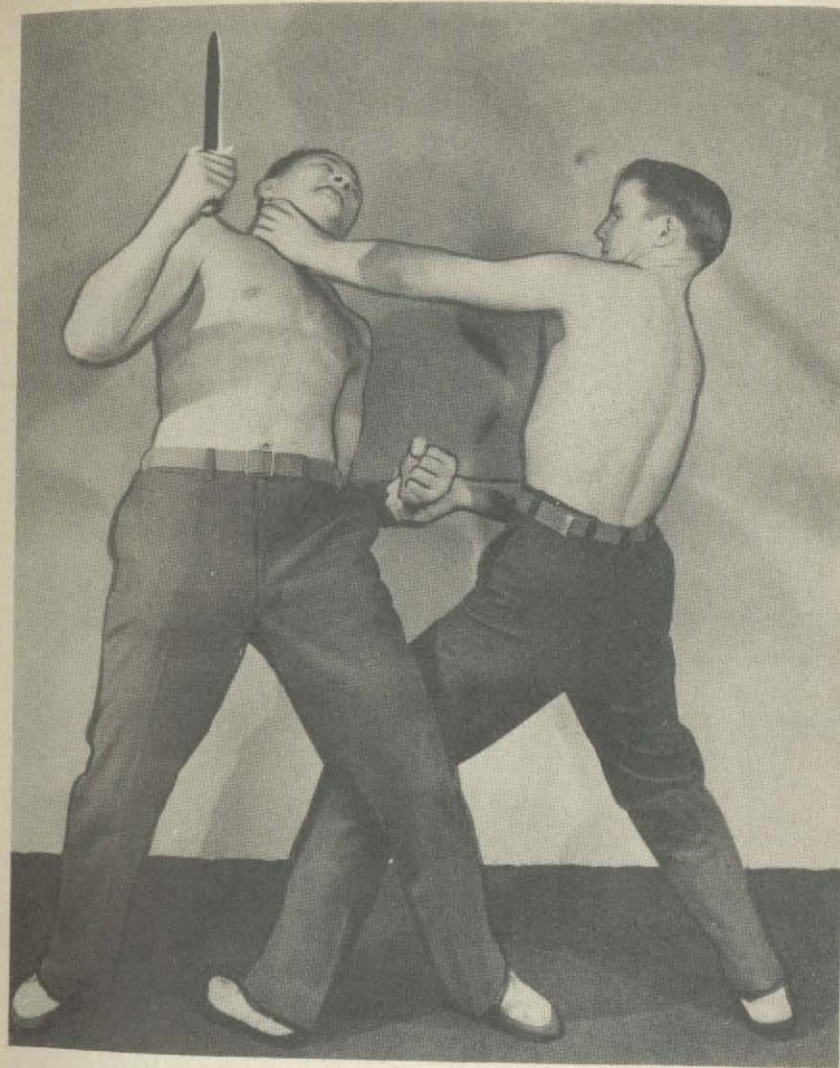
**FRONT HUG BREAK
FINISH**

When he lowers his head, you slash with your right hand against the back of his neck, or kick with knee into his chin.



**BREAK FOR BACK HUG UNDER THE ARMS
FOOT GRAB**

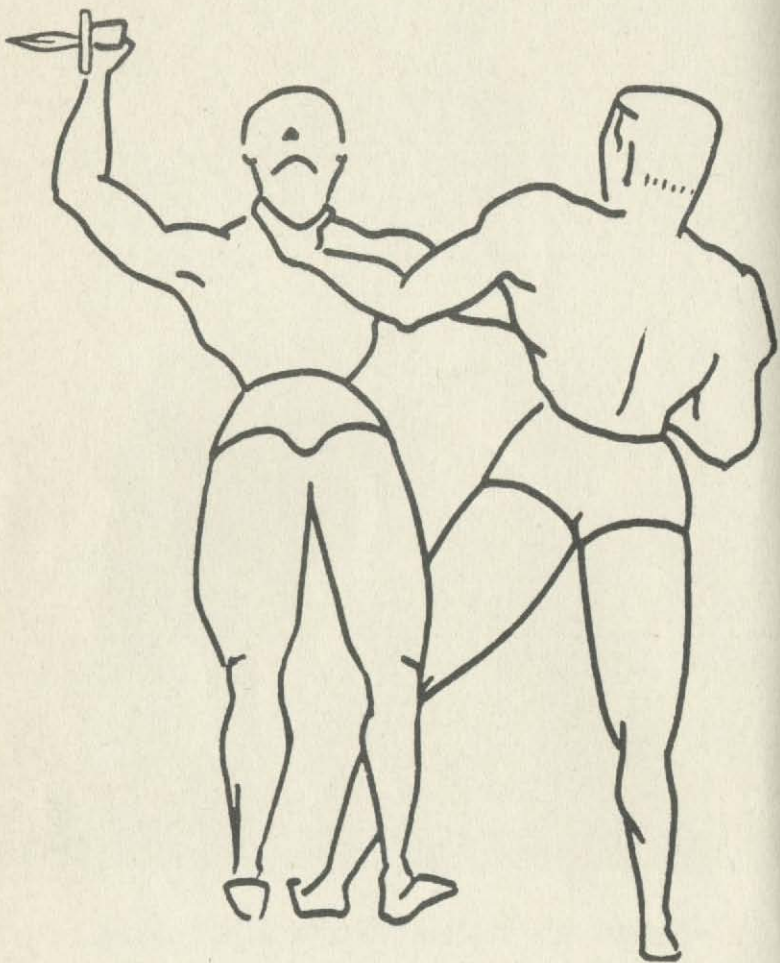
Opponent grasps you around the waist from the back, holding you tightly. Attempt to grab his hair, then suddenly bend forward, grasping his leg with both your hands. Pull forward and lean back, causing yourself to fall back on him and if your fall is hard you will injure him severely. Use caution in practice.



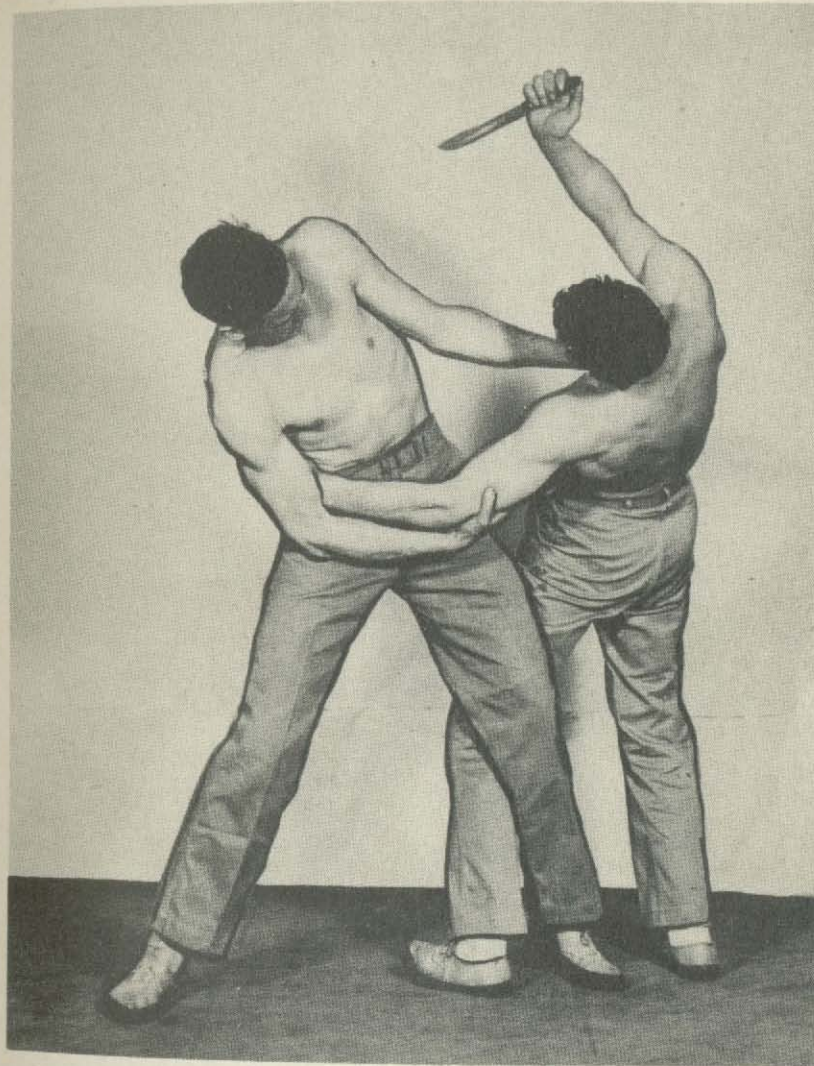
SLASH AT THROAT WITH KICK BACK

When attacked by enemy with a knife in his right hand, step to his left, slash your left hand into his windpipe. Grab his left hand at same time insert your left foot behind his left foot. Pull toward your right on his arm. Push back hard on his neck, causing him to take a very violent back fall. Kick into his heart, when he is down on ground. Either hand may be used. Very dangerous. Caution in practice.

SLASH AT THROAT WITH KICK BACK

SLASH AT THROAT WITH KICK BACK

When attacked by enemy with a knife in his right hand, step to his left, slash your left hand into his windpipe. Grab his left hand, at same time insert your left foot behind his left foot. Pull toward your right on his arm. Push back hard on his neck, causing him to take a very violent back fall. Kick into his heart, when he is down on ground. Either hand may be used. Very dangerous. Caution in practice.



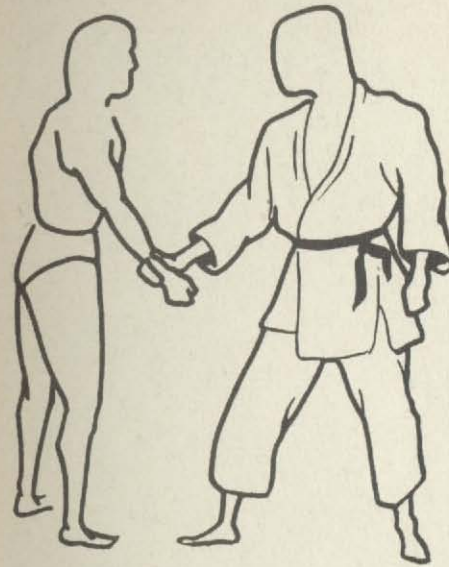
SHOULDER BREAK AGAINST KNIFE START

Enemy attempts to jab you from the side with knife in his right hand. Grasp his right wrist with your right hand thumbs down; and with your left hand thumbs down; push down on his arm then suddenly pull his arm upwards.



SHOULDER BREAK AGAINST KNIFE FINISH

Bring your right foot behind you, bending down slightly which will face you in the same position as your opponent; force your left shoulder under his raised right arm; rotate his arm so that his hand is palm up. Pull down hard on his arm, pushing up on his shoulder. This will break and dislocate his arm and shoulder.



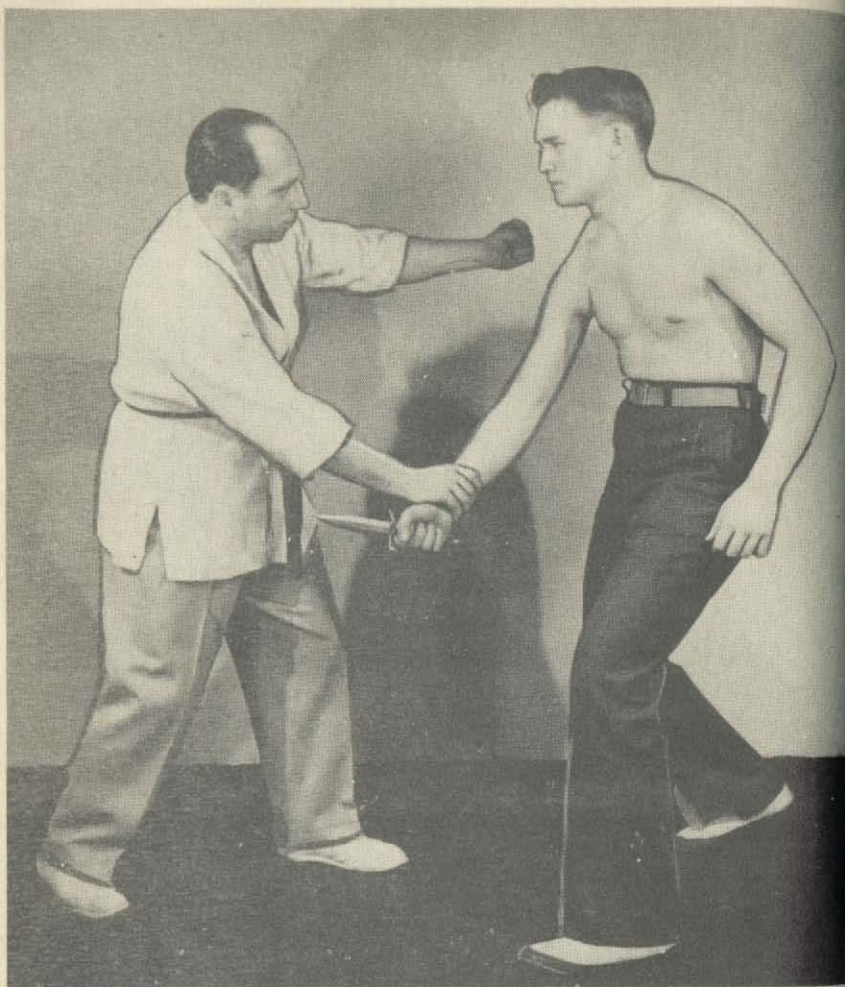
Enemy attempts to strike you with his right hand, grasp his right hand with your right hand. With your thumb up, pull him toward you slightly; his arm must be rotated palm up and at same time step behind him toward your left. You will then be facing the same way. Wrap your left arm around his right arm muscle tightly and grab your own coat lapel to your right. Push your hip into his and force his captured arm down with your right hand, thereby causing considerable pain or breaking the arm.



CHIN JAB AND KICK BACK

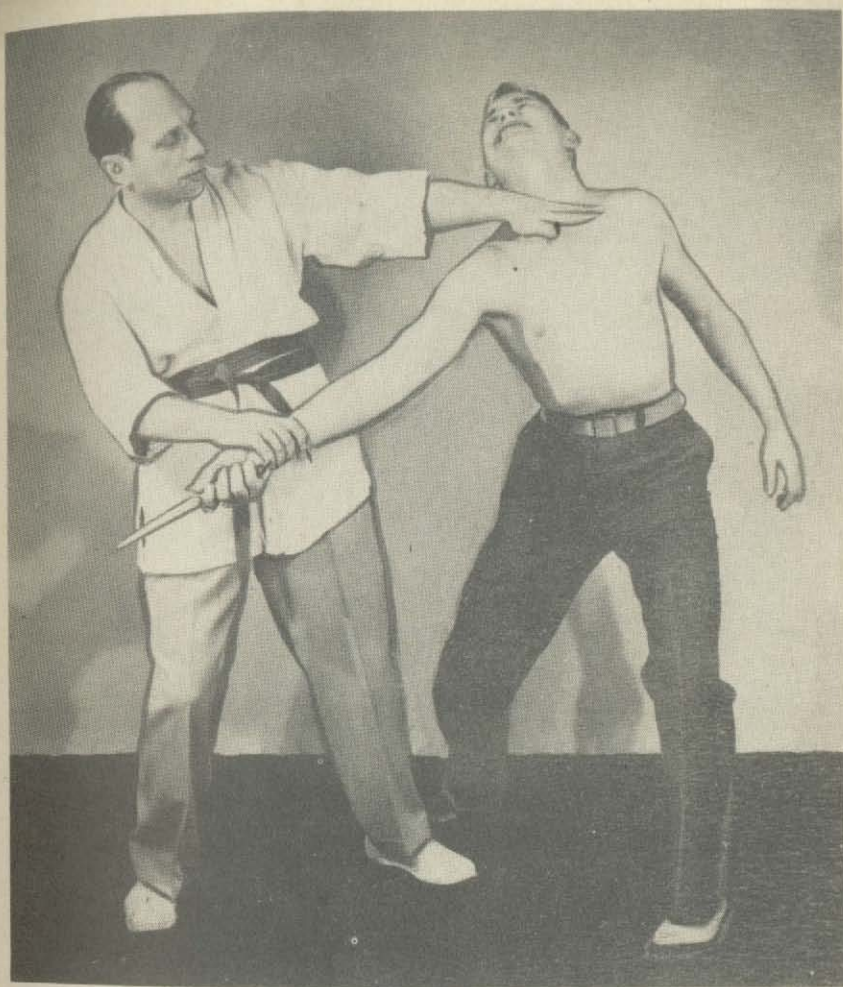
Enemy attempts to strike you with club in his right hand. Step to his right side at the same time blocking the blow with your left hand. Insert your right foot behind his right foot, at the same time kick back and jab hard into his chin with your open palm.

This is very dangerous as it will dislocate his neck and throw him backward violently.



**ARM BREAK, AND MARCHING
PRISONER HOLD
ACTION 1**

Enemy attempts to stab you with an upward motion. Grasp his right wrist with your right hand, thumb to your left, at the same time pulling his arm down and towards you and keeping him off balance.



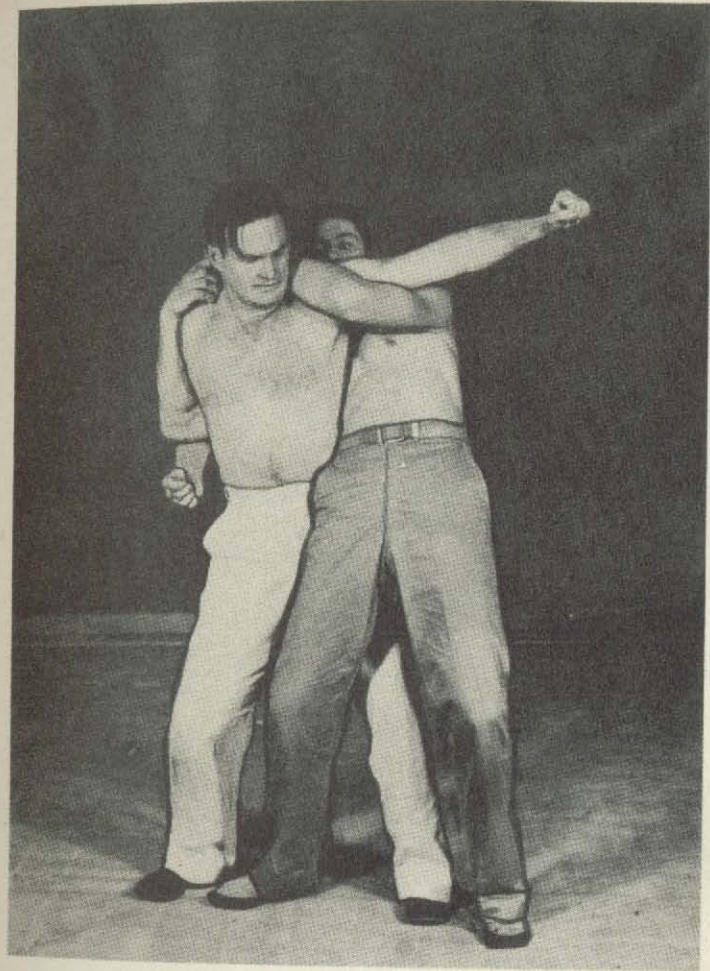
**ARM BREAK, AND MARCHING
PRISONER HOLD
ACTION 2**

While continuing to hold his arm step back so that you are then facing in the same direction as he. At the same time slash with your left hand into his windpipe.



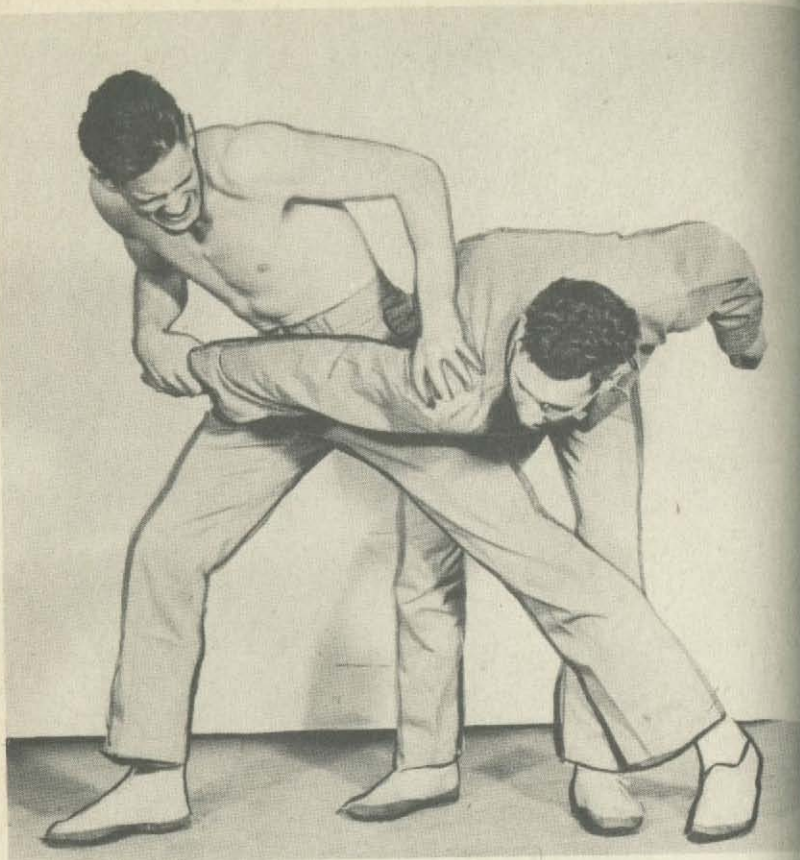
**ARM BREAK, AND MARCHING
PRISONER HOLD
FINISH**

Wrap your left arm around his right arm close to his shoulder. Grasp your own coat near the right collar. Lean back slightly, applying pressure against his shoulder and pull down on his captured arm, thereby causing such terrific pain as will make him drop his weapon. You can march your enemy by holding his arm in this position.



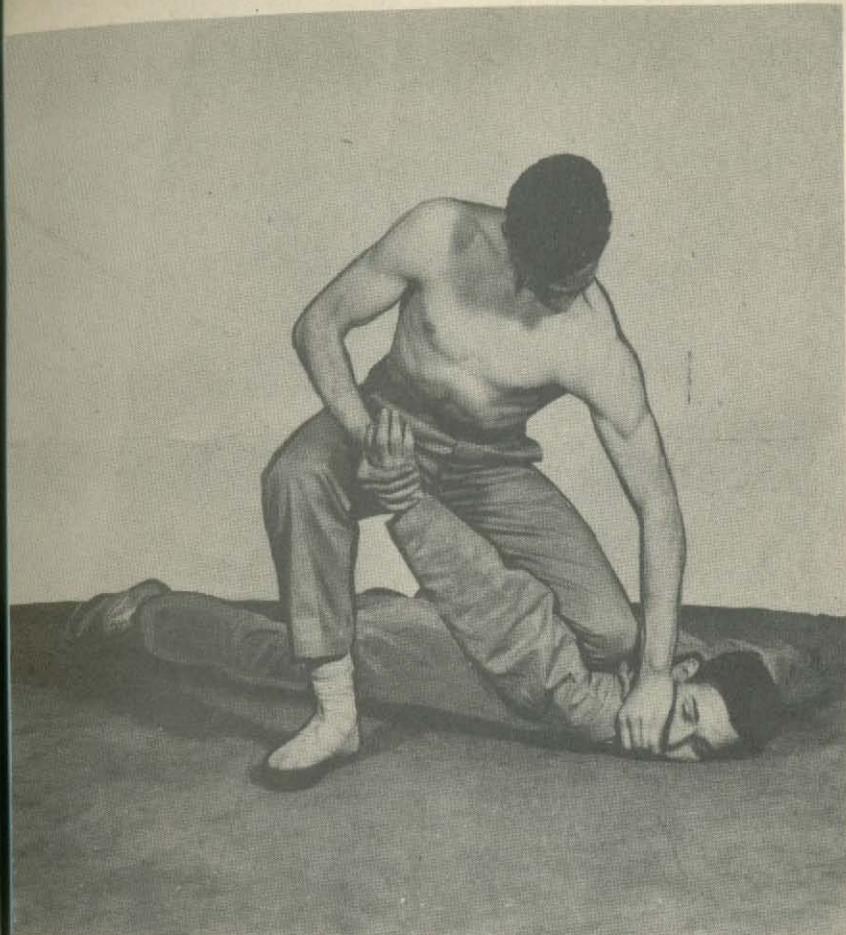
BREAK FOR FULL NELSON

Your opponent puts a full nelson on you from the back. This will force your neck down slightly and your arms up. Step to your right with your right foot and suddenly insert your left foot behind your opponent's right foot. Bend back from the hip, at the same time forcing your right arm against your opponent's face. If he holds on tightly he will cause you to fall backward on top of him. This is very dangerous, as you may fall hard into his stomach or chest and either knock him out or break his ribs, so use caution in practice.



FRONT TRIP AND ARM BREAK ACTION 1

Enemy attempts to strike you with right fist. Grasp his fist with your right hand, thumbs down, pull him towards you; pivot towards your right so you are facing the way he is; insert your left foot in front of him; your left toe pointing towards your right; force his shoulder down with your left hand; continue pulling with your right.



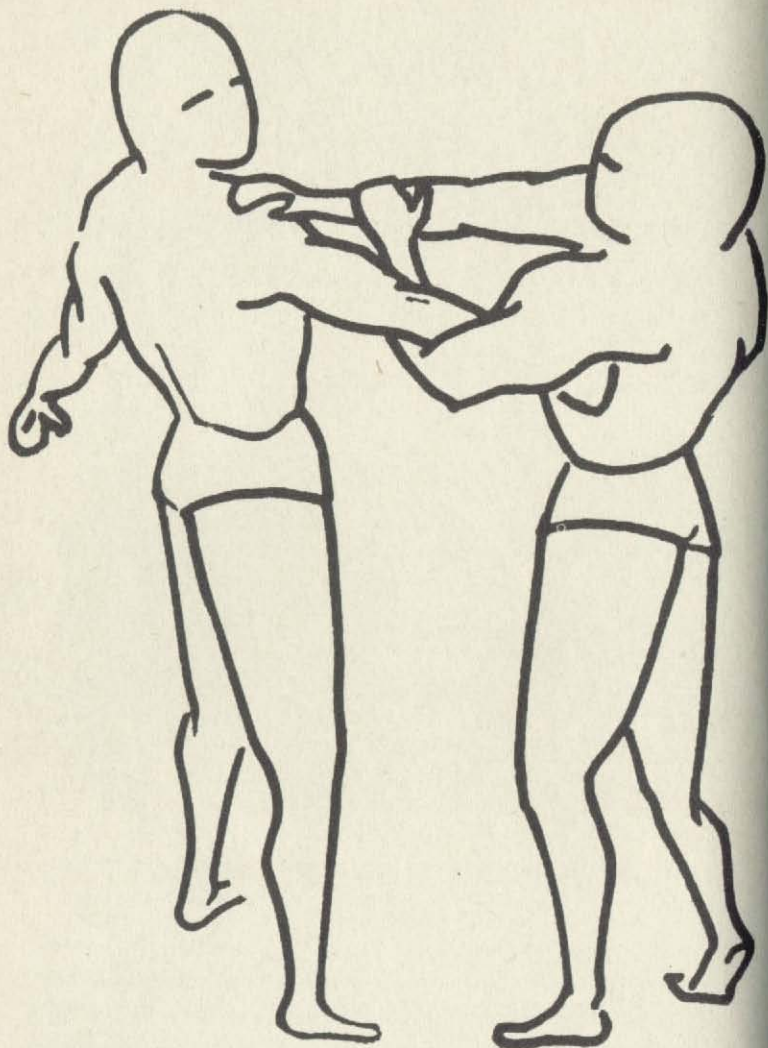
FRONT TRIP AND ARM BREAK FINISH

While your opponent is falling forward over your left leg, continue holding his right hand; when he is flat on ground, force your knee against his right shoulder with your left leg; pull his extended arm up towards you which will cause dislocation.

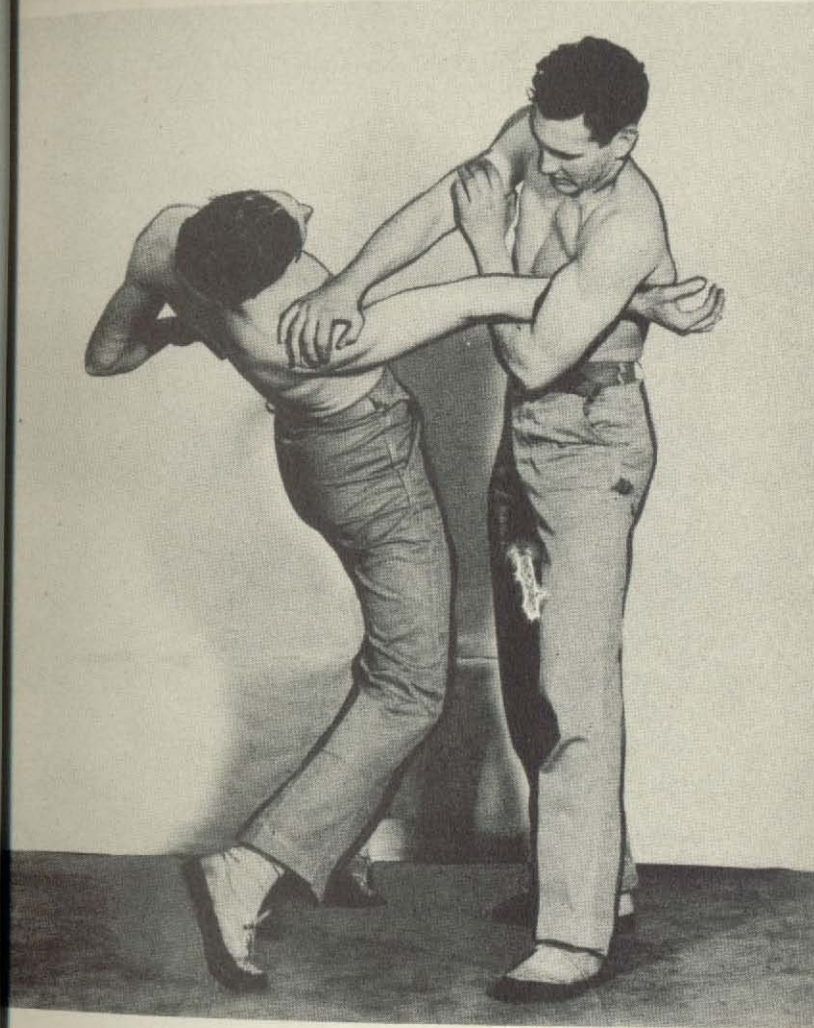
For additional punishment, grasp his chin with your left hand and pull up violently.

This fall is very dangerous, use caution in practice.

SHOULDER PRESSURE ARM BREAK

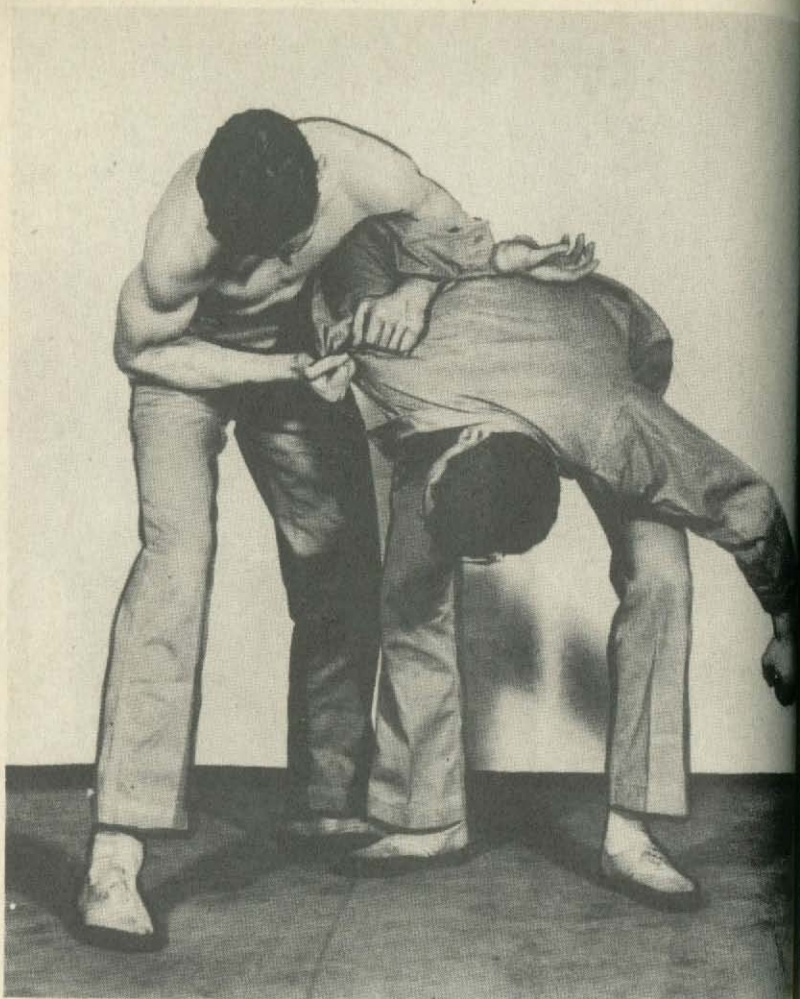

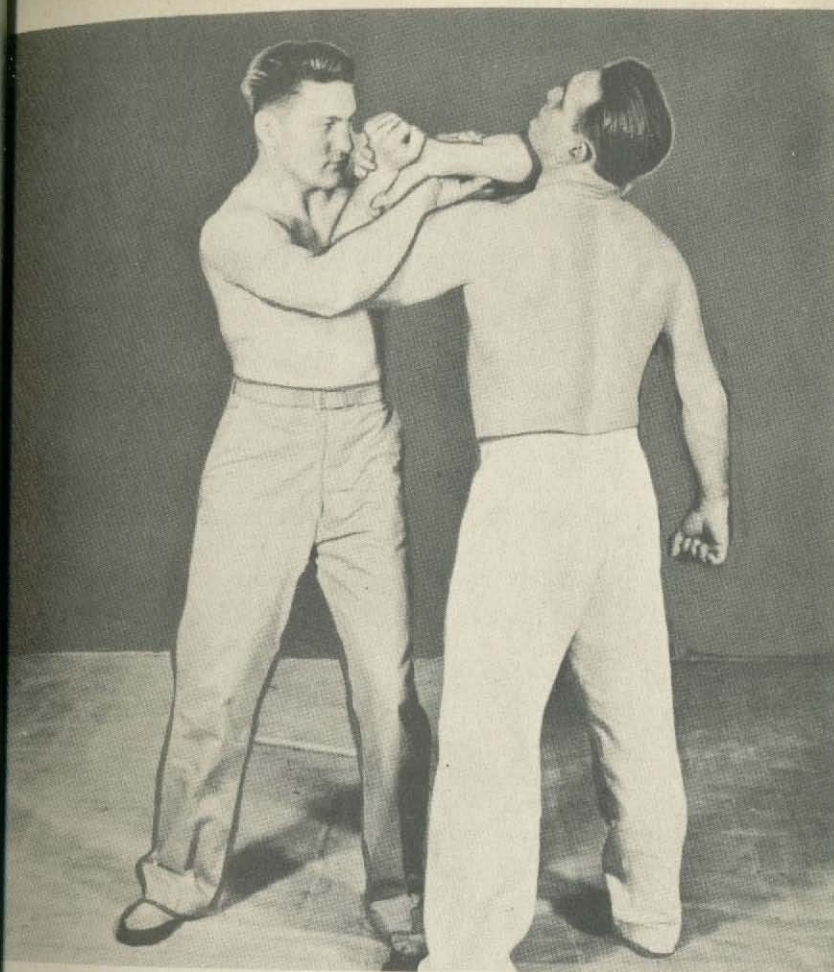
SHOULDER PRESSURE ARM BREAK

If opponent slides his right hand under your left arm pit capture it and break it by twisting your left arm around the outside of his while your right arm rests on his shoulder. Grasp your own right arm with your left hand and pull up with your left hand and lean back slightly. This will cause considerable pain or break his arm. This hold can be applied with either hand.



ACTION AGAINST ARM AND SHOULDER

Your opponent is directly in front of you; he attempts to strike a low blow with his right hand; block his right arm with your left hand slightly bent at the same time grasp his sleeve at the muscle with your right hand; force his arm back with your left hand and at the same time rotating so that it is in the crotch of your arm and your left hand is now on his right muscle; force his bent arm up and across his back; lean towards him forcing him to bend forward with upward pressure of your left arm; to secure him grasp his collar with your right hand.



CROSSED ARM HOLD AND CHIN BLOW

Opponent attempts to strike you with his left hand. Step to your right clasp his wrist with your left hand, thumbs down, pulling him toward you slightly. Step forward with your right foot, at the same time wrapping your right arm around his left arm. Rotate his arm upwards and backwards as you clasp your own wrist with the thumb down. Force your elbow hard into his face and step behind him, using a kickback.

THROWS WITH THE HIP

Throwing with the hip is the commonest and most important of all throws. There is a lot of power in the hip when it is properly applied. Proper motion of the hip is to lower it slightly and rotate it backwards, quickly and upwards. The hip should be used in throwing when your opponent is standing still and resisting you. If you will follow instructions on the following pages, you will find the hip a very easy and effective means of throwing your opponent.

OVER-SHOULDER THROW

In the over-shoulder throw, your opponent is pushing you backward, you turn suddenly on him so you are facing the same direction as he is. In this case, you use your hips and shoulders combined in throwing your opponent.

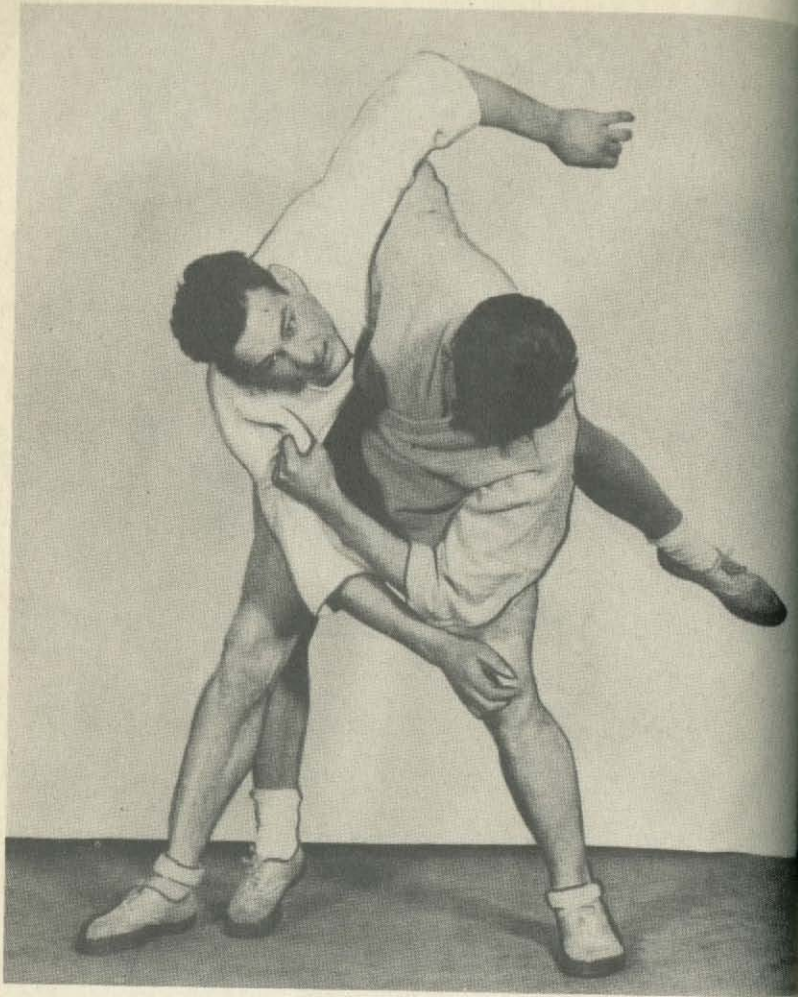
STRAIGHT FOOT THROW

In this throw, you do not use your hip but your right foot and apply it only when your opponent is pushing backward.

FRONT HIP THROW



Grab your opponent's right arm at the muscle with your left hand, wrap your right arm around his waist, and turn forcing your right hip into his stomach. Lean forward to your left and pull down on his right arm—throwing him violently forward.



HIP THROW AND FALL ACTION 1

Enemy attempts to grapple with you. Step into him; throw right arm around his waist, close to his shoulder; turn your body to your left so you are facing the same direction he is, at the same time grasp his right sleeve high up on his shoulder; insert your hip hard into his stomach; bend down, pulling him toward you so that your hip throws him forward violently.



HIP THROW AND FALL ACTION 2

Your opponent will fall in this manner and if you are thrown with the same hold, you must learn to fall by keeping your left arm 45 degrees from your body and relaxing.



HIP THROW AND FALL FINISH

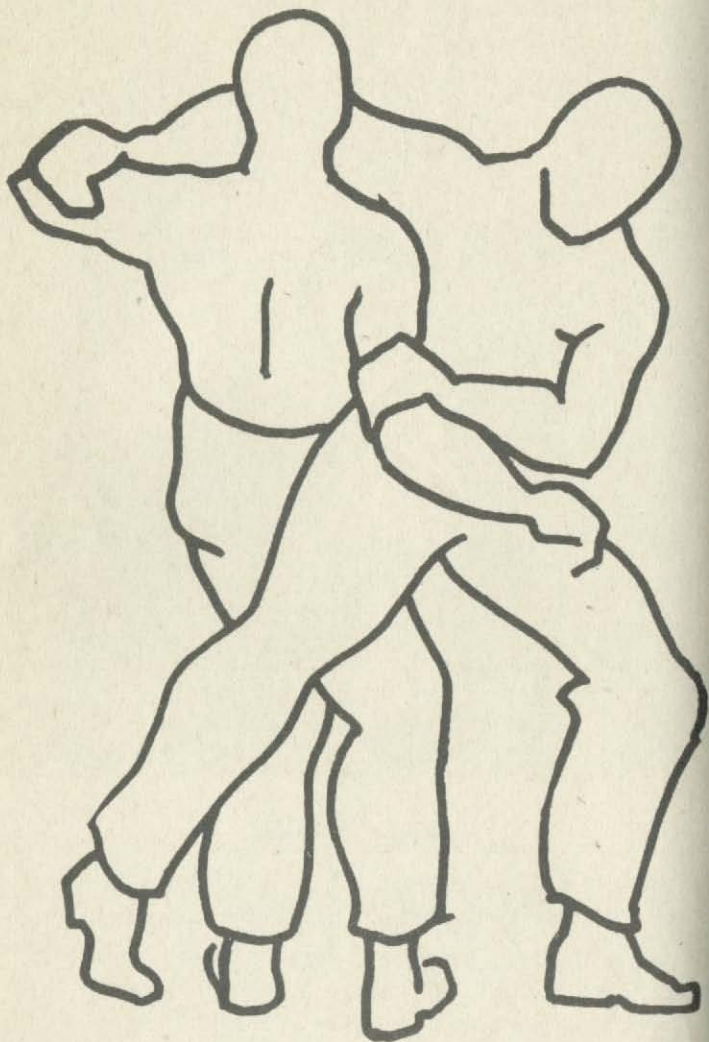
Your whole body should strike the ground at the same time. Your right leg is over your left in a bent position. It should strike the ground at the same time your hand does.



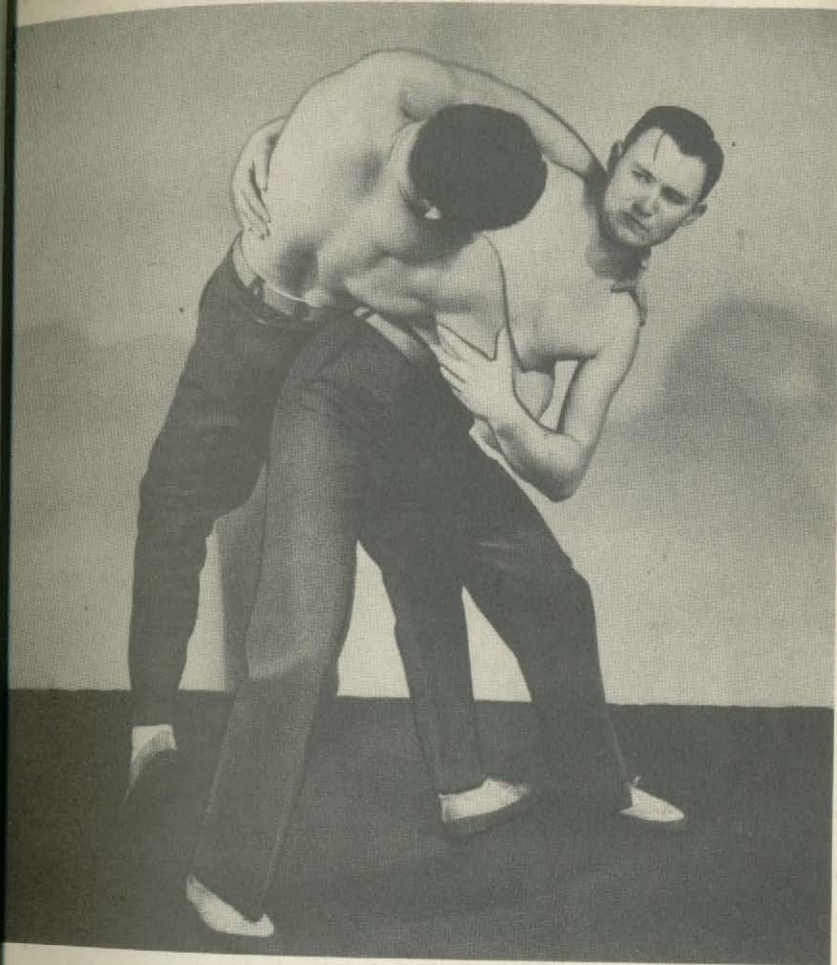
ANKLE THROW

Grasp your opponent's right lapel with your left hand, thumb up. At the same time grasp his left sleeve near the shoulder with your right hand. Spring in towards him on your right foot, at the same time laying your left ankle against his left ankle. Force your hip into his stomach and, in one motion, pull up with your left hand and down with your right, bending slightly towards your right and forcing your right ankle against his left ankle in a raising motion. Pull down with both hands and at the same time raise him with your ankle, causing him to take a very violent forward fall. This throw requires a great deal of practice, and is very dangerous.

BACK HIP THROW



(Instructions on opposite page)

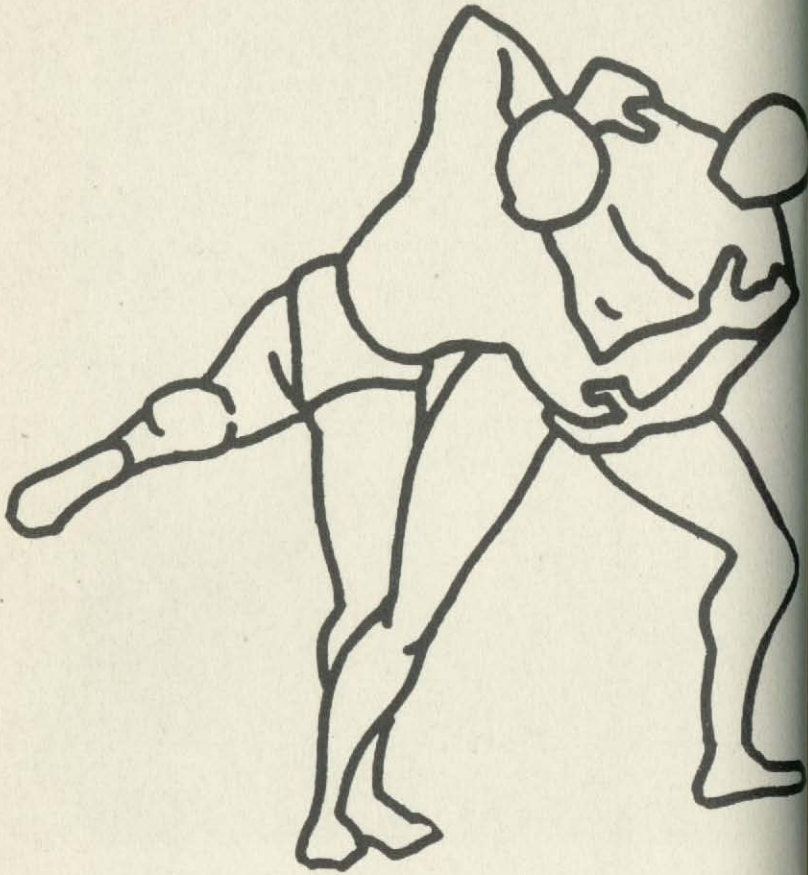


BACK HIP THROW

CAUTION: This fall is very dangerous. Grasp your opponent's right arm at the muscle with your left hand. Step behind him with your right foot inserting your hip against the back of his. Grasp his left arm with your right hand and pull down with your left while bending your knees slightly; rotate hip upwards thus throwing him to the ground.

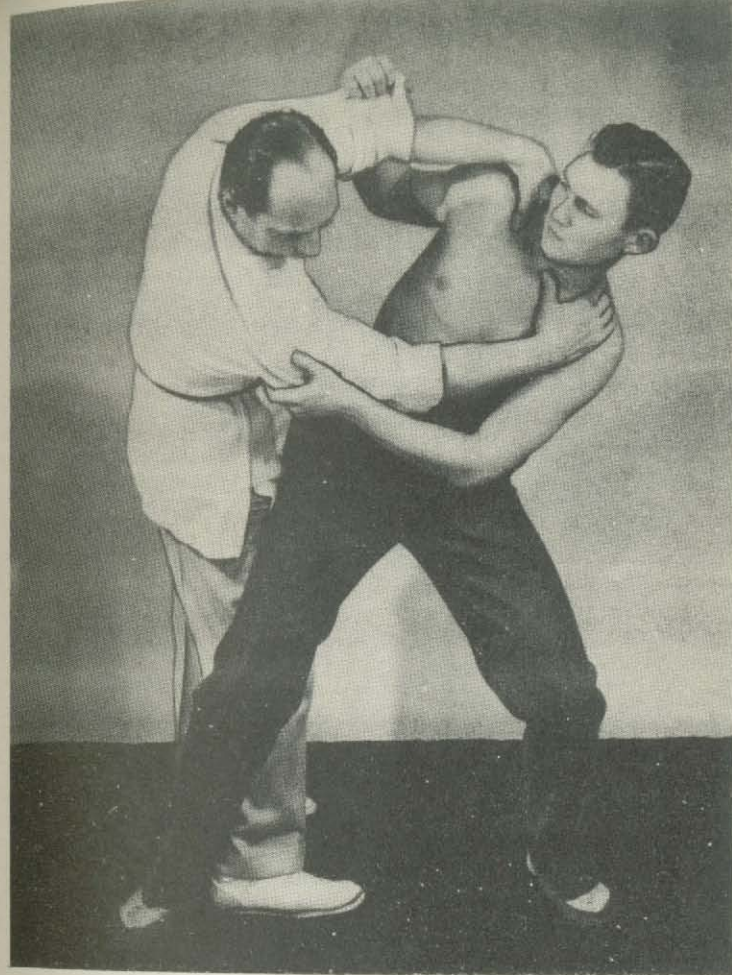
Finish: Hold on to his left arm tightly and while keeping him slightly off the ground kick down with the heel of your shoe into his heart or head.

STRAIGHT FOOT THROW



Enemy is choking you from the front.

Grab his right arm at the muscle with your left hand, thumb up and with your right hand grab his coat lapel. Step back until your left foot is back, his right foot will be forward. Put your weight on your left foot. Extend your right foot to the outside of his right ankle. Trip him with your right foot by pulling and leaning towards your left and push him backwards with your right hand. This will cause him to fall on his back.

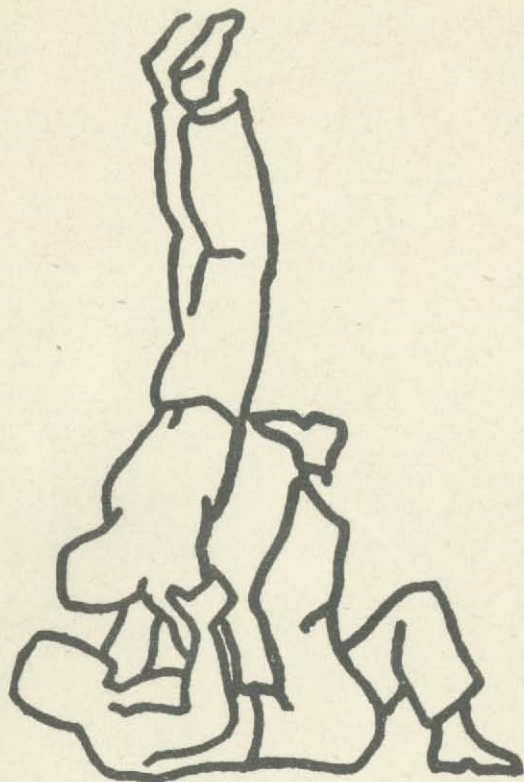


STRAIGHT FOOT THROW

Enemy is choking you from the front.

Grab his right arm at the muscle with your left hand, thumb up and with your right hand grab his left sleeve. Step back until your left foot is back, his right foot will be forward. Put your weight on your left foot. Extend your right foot to the outside of his right ankle. Trip him with your right foot by pulling and leaning towards your left and push him backwards with your right hand. This will cause him to fall on his back.

CIRCLE THROW



(START)

Grasp opponent by the collar or back of arms. Force him backwards slightly. He will then push against you forcing you backwards. You will then lean back while kicking him in the stomach with either foot and pulling him towards your face. While lying flat on your back, with bent foot kick hard straight up throwing your opponent over your head.



CIRCLE THROW

(FINISH)

The author is here demonstrating how to break a fall when thrown by "Circle Throw."

The fist comes down first and you roll on your arm rolling across your shoulder and slapping the mat hard just before your back lands.

OVER SHOULDER THROW



(Instructions on opposite page)



OVER SHOULDER THROW

If opponent attempts to choke you from behind with his right arm around your neck, step forward slightly with your right foot and at the same time grasp his arm at the elbow with your left hand. Reach up with your right hand grasping his clothes at his right shoulder. Stoop forward suddenly, and forcing your hips violently into his stomach, pull him over your shoulder.



**OVER SHOULDER THROW AND FALL
ACTION 1**

Your opponent grasps you from behind, locking your arms to your side. Clasp your hands together and at the same time take one step forward with your right foot.



**OVER SHOULDER THROW AND FALL
ACTION 2**

Force your clasped hands up suddenly and at the same time bend forward slightly. Reach up and grasp your opponents right sleeve or arm with your right hand high up on the shoulder and with your left hand grasp his sleeve or arm at the muscle.



OVER SHOULDER THROW AND FALL ACTION 3

Pull him down and forward against your hip and shoulder. Insert your hip hard into your opponent's stomach. This will throw him forward violently.

In practice, if you are falling, relax and slap mat with your hand 45 degrees from your body.



OVER SHOULDER THROW AND FALL FINISH

In throwing your opponent, you can break his right arm while he is falling by anchoring his right arm under your left arm pit, and placing both of your hands at his elbow. Lean back at the same time.

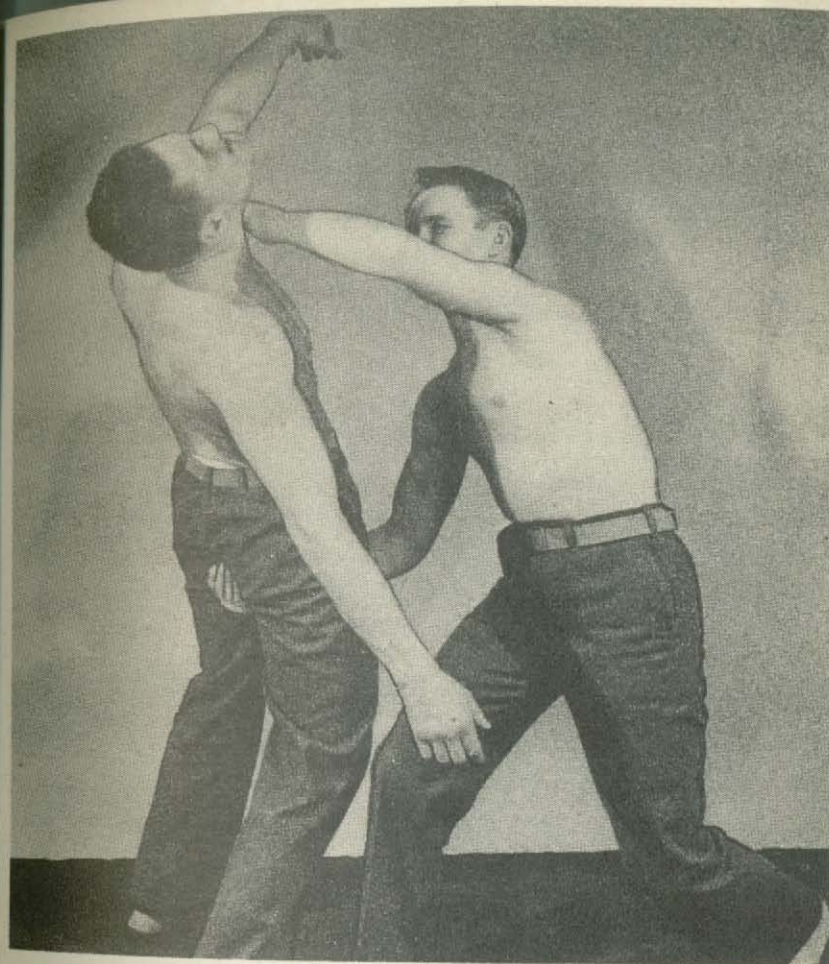
Use caution in practice.



CRAB CLAW THROW

This is used for disarming against a knife:

The action is done by grasping his right wrist with your left hand and resting your right on the ground and jumping against his body with your feet spread apart; your left foot high against his waist and your right against the the back of the ankles. Twist towards the left causing your opponent to take a very vicious fall.



FRONT GRAB FOR BACK THROW, WITH SLASH IN THROAT

Enemy attempts to grab you. Bend down quickly towards his right with your right foot extended. Slash at his throat with your left hand, which will cause him to bend back; at the same time insert your right hand between his legs, trying to grab his belt from the back, or the seat of his trousers. Pull forward with your right hand, forcing him backwards with your left-hand slash, and causing him to fall backwards. This fall is very dangerous and is very likely to kill your opponent. Be very careful in practice.

Reverse action for a front throw.

CHOKE BREAKS

The following pages consist of a variation of choke breaks. When an enemy attempts to choke you, the most important thing to remember in most cases not to grab for his hands that seem to be choking the life out of you. First in importance is the straight jab with the arm and fingers into the windpipe. The next is the slash into the throat from the side and then comes the V-thrust into the face or the pit of the stomach. Then the pull forward and kick the knee in the testicles. And then the arm breaks and the pull downs with kick of the knee into the face. These breaks are important and a good deal of time and practice should be used. Be very careful in practise as they are all very dangerous.



CHOKE BREAKS



CLASPED HAND THRUST

Clasp your hands forming a V. Thrust up hard against the arms and strike face with a downward movement; in so doing opponent's nose and face is smashed.

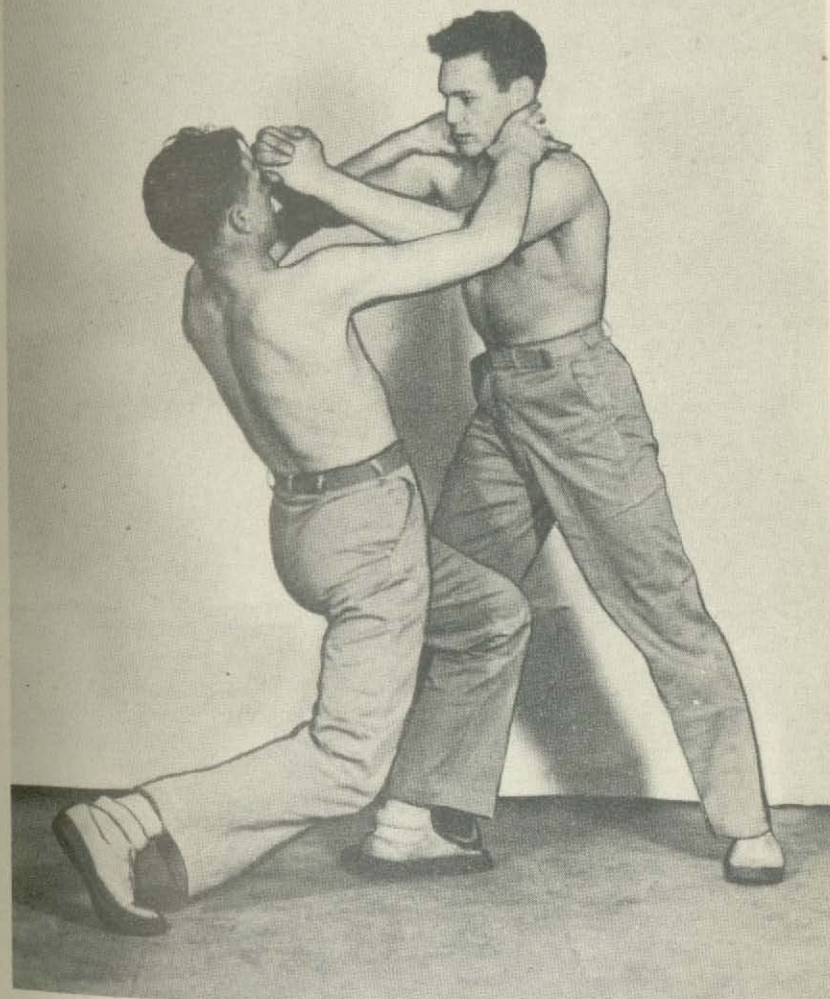
CHOKE BREAK



FINGER JAB IN THE THROAT

Enemy attempts to choke you:

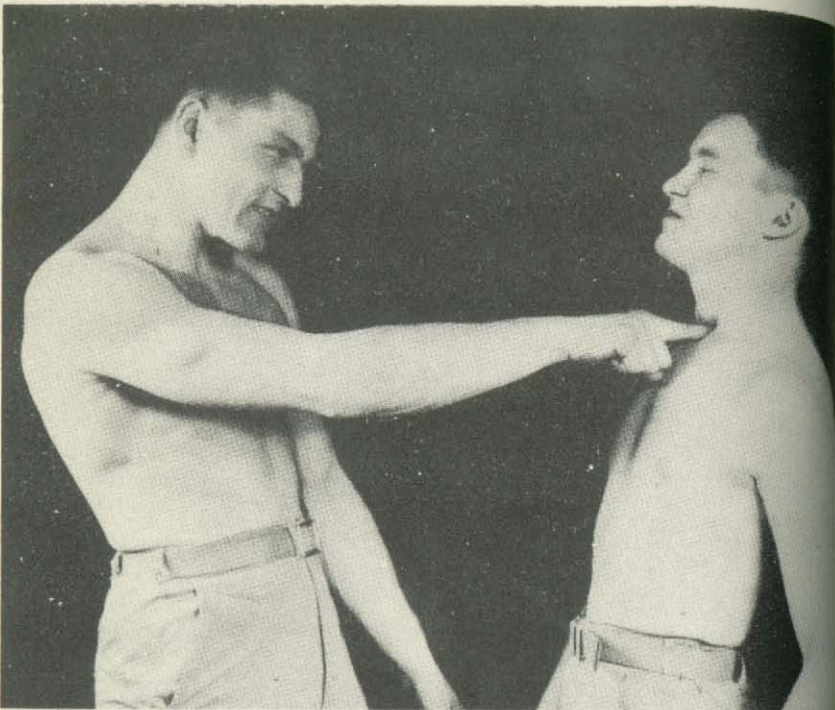
Jab hand with fingers held rigid hard into opponent's windpipe. Either hand may be used. Take one step forward and thrust knee into testicles.



CHOKE BREAK

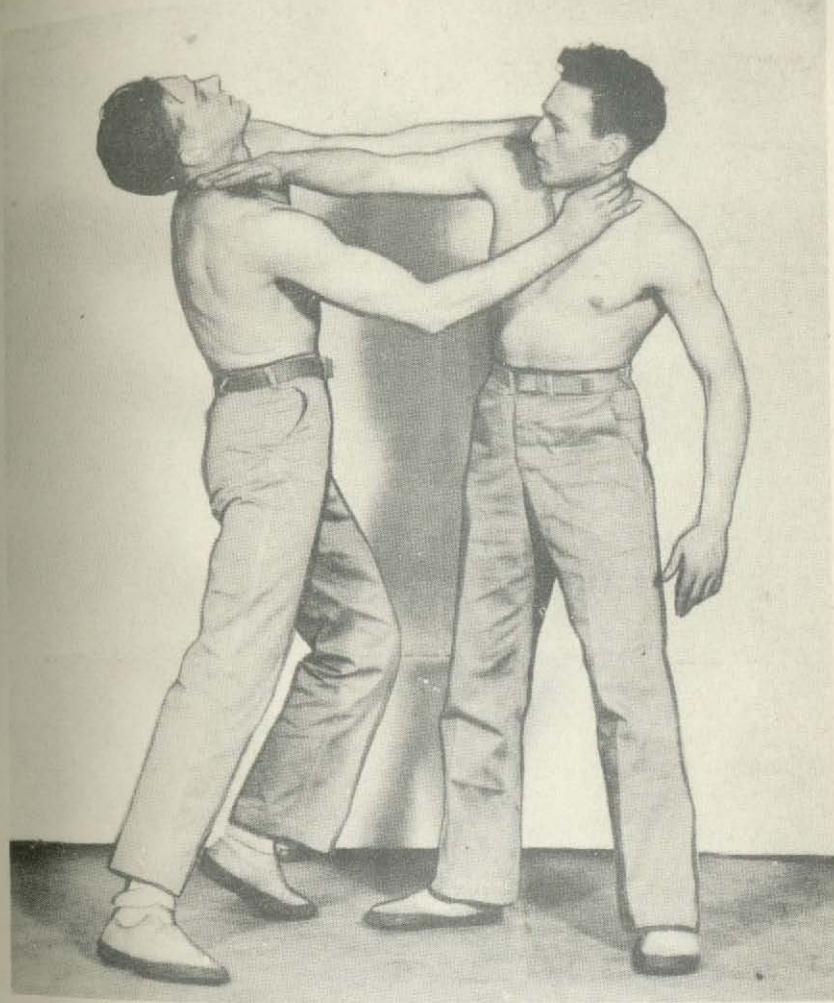
CLASPED HAND THRUST WITH KNEE KICK

Clasp your hands forming a V. Thrust up hard against the arms thus breaking the choke hold. Grasp him by the shoulders pulling him toward you. Then drive your knee into his testicles.



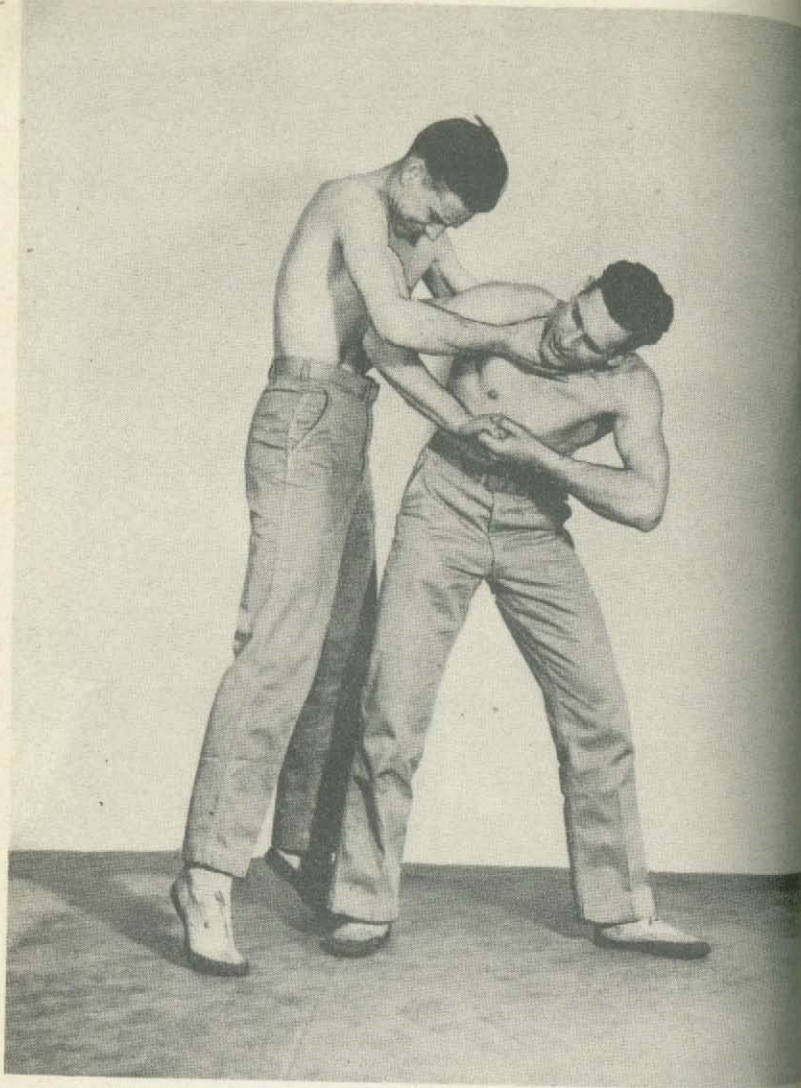
CHOKE BREAKS

Enemy attempts to choke you, or grab you. Force your forefinger into the lower windpipe, and push in with a rotating motion, forcing him to back away. Use slash to disable.



CHOKE BREAK WITH ARM SLASH

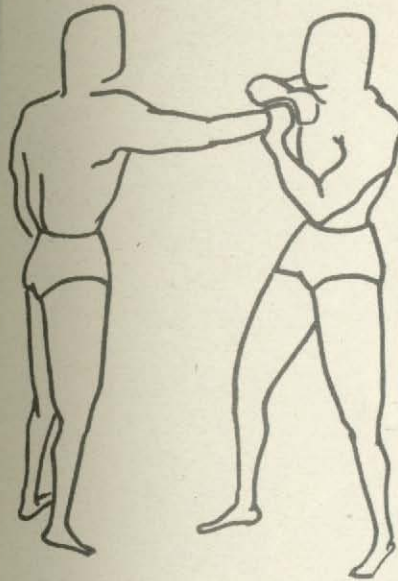
Enemy attempts to choke you from the front with both hands. Slash to the right side of his throat with your right hand. Your palm must be turned down. Use either hand. Very dangerous in practice.



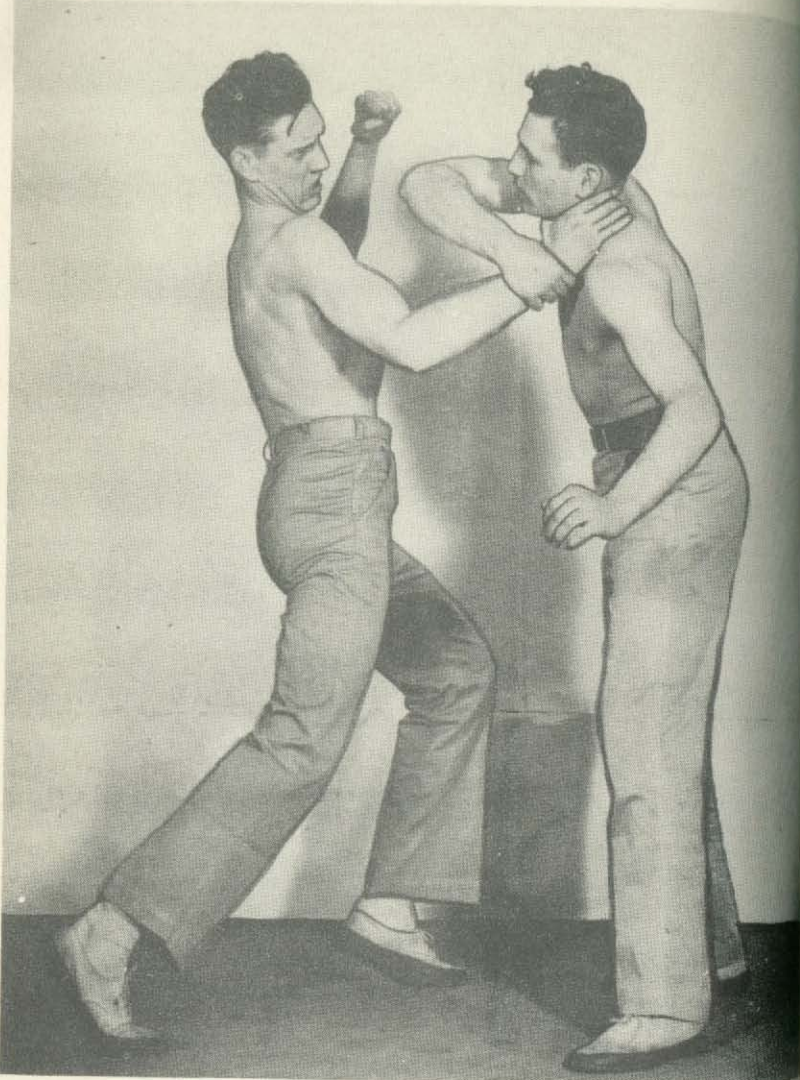
CHOKE BREAK WITH JAB INTO THE HEART

Enemy attempts to choke you from back or side, with both hands. Clasp both of your hands together forming a pivot; bend down slightly and jab your elbow into heart, stomach or testicles.

LEAN BACK ARM BREAK



(Instructions on following Pages)



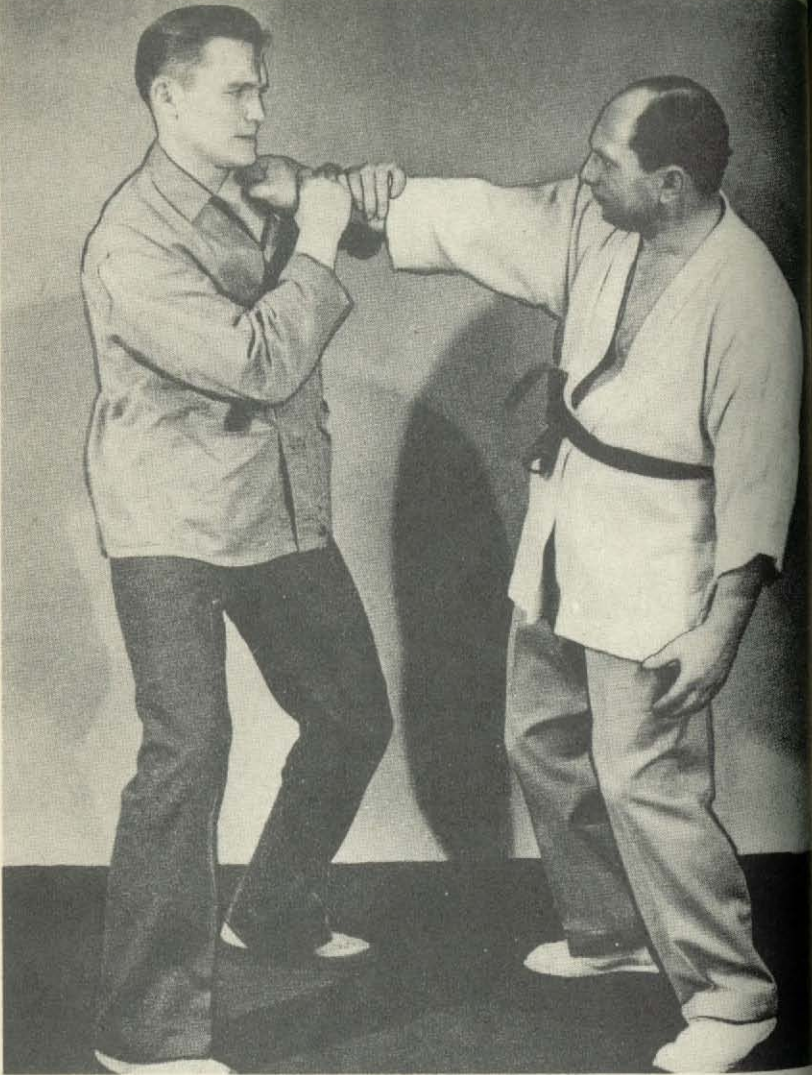
**SINGLE ARM CHOKE BREAK
START**

Enemy attempts to choke you with his right hand standing directly in front of you. Grasp his wrist with your right hand thumb down. Turn and bring your right foot behind you. You will be facing the same direction as he is. Continue holding on to his right hand pulling forward and downward slightly.



**SINGLE ARM CHOKE BREAK
FINISH**

Pull his arm under your left arm pit. His hand must be rotated so his palm is up. Lean back and down hard against his extended arm. This will cause it to break. Use caution in practice.



**COLLAR GRAB ARM BREAK
(START)**

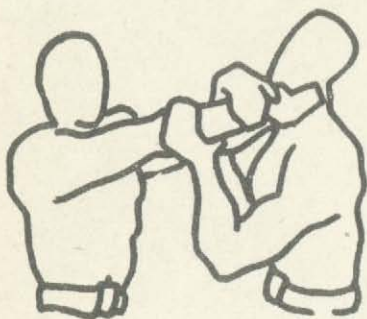
Enemy grabs the collar with his right hand. Grasp his right wrist with your right hand, thumbs down, and with your left hand on his wrist, also thumbs down. Force his hand against your shoulder.



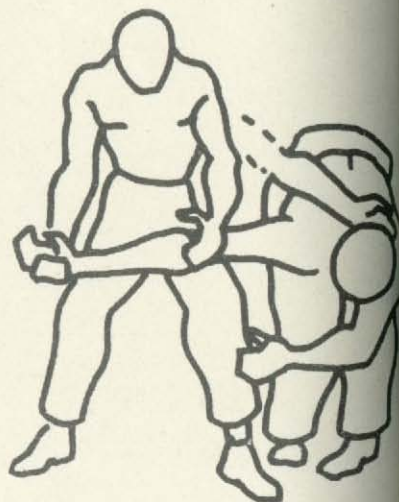
**COLLAR GRAB ARM BREAK
(FINISH)**

Turn and bring your right foot behind you. You will be facing the same direction he is. Continue holding onto his right hand at the same time rotating it so that his palm is up. Lean back in a falling position against his arm while pulling up on wrist. By relaxing slightly and pulling down a little on his wrist and up suddenly his arm can be broken very easily.

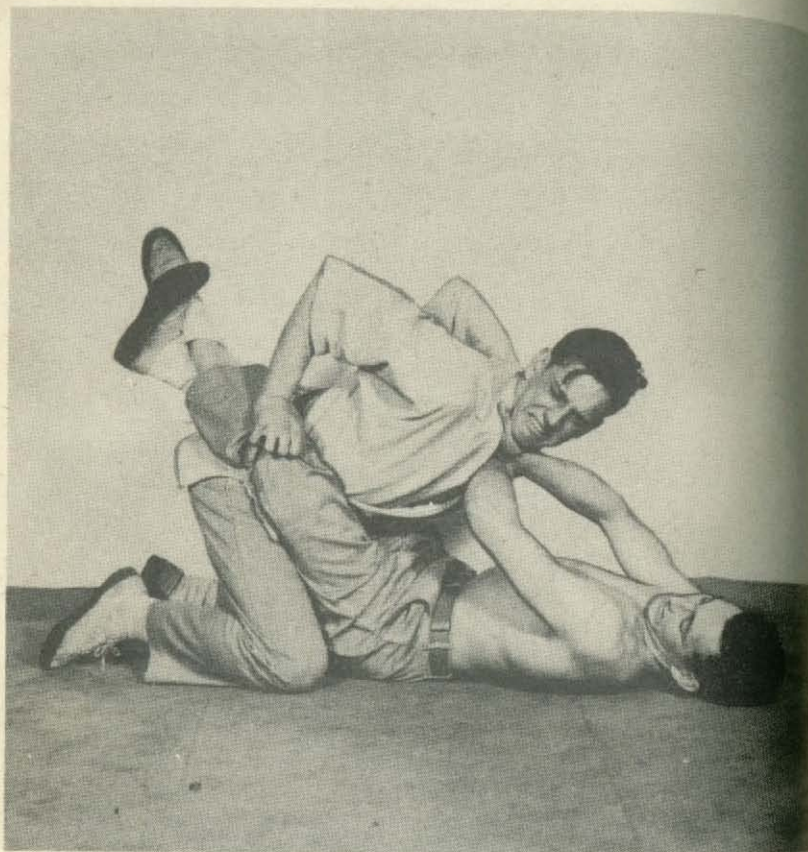
When you are knocked backwards or you miss a circle throw use a cross arm choke and push your feet into your opponent's stomach, raising your opponent slightly from the mat. This will force his neck hard into your crossed arms. Pull and twist hard on your arms and this will cause immediate strangulation. To counter this choke, slash your extended fingers and hand into his exposed throat or grab for his testicles.

This is very dangerous in practice. Use caution.



CHOKING OPPONENT WHEN KNOCKED DOWN

When attempting to choke an opponent, with crossed arm choke, when you are flat on your back, insert both of your legs in your opponent's stomach, raising him off the ground. This will cause him to fall forward and strangle himself. To counter this choke, jab extended finger into throat.



CHOKING OPPONENT IF YOU MISS A CIRCLE THROW

When attempting to use a cross arm choke, and circle throw, and if you miss the throw, let him fall between your legs and immediately apply a scissors hold and continue choking.

To counter this choke, grab his testicles or apply your elbows in a rotating manner to his thighs.

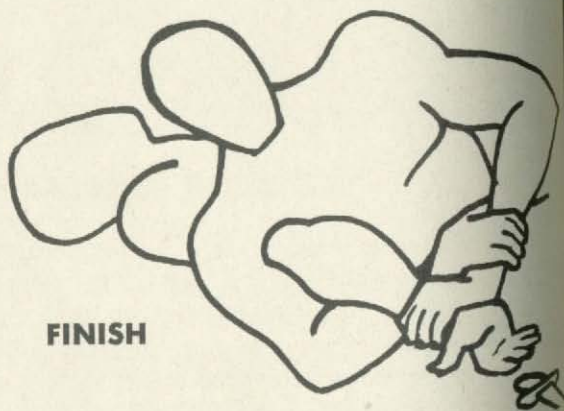
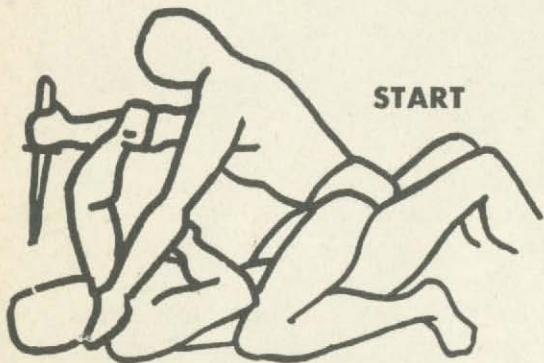


SPINE BREAK PRESSURE HOLD

To capture enemy, step in close facing him directly. Throw your right arm around his neck, step to the left with your right foot so that his body is directly behind yours. Slide him onto your back with a hip movement to your right, lowering your body at the same time. Wrap your left arm around his left leg. He is then directly across your back. Grasp the inside of your thighs with both hands, thumbs up. Hold on to your thighs and, to apply pressure, bring your legs together. This will eliminate or crush your enemy in a few minutes.

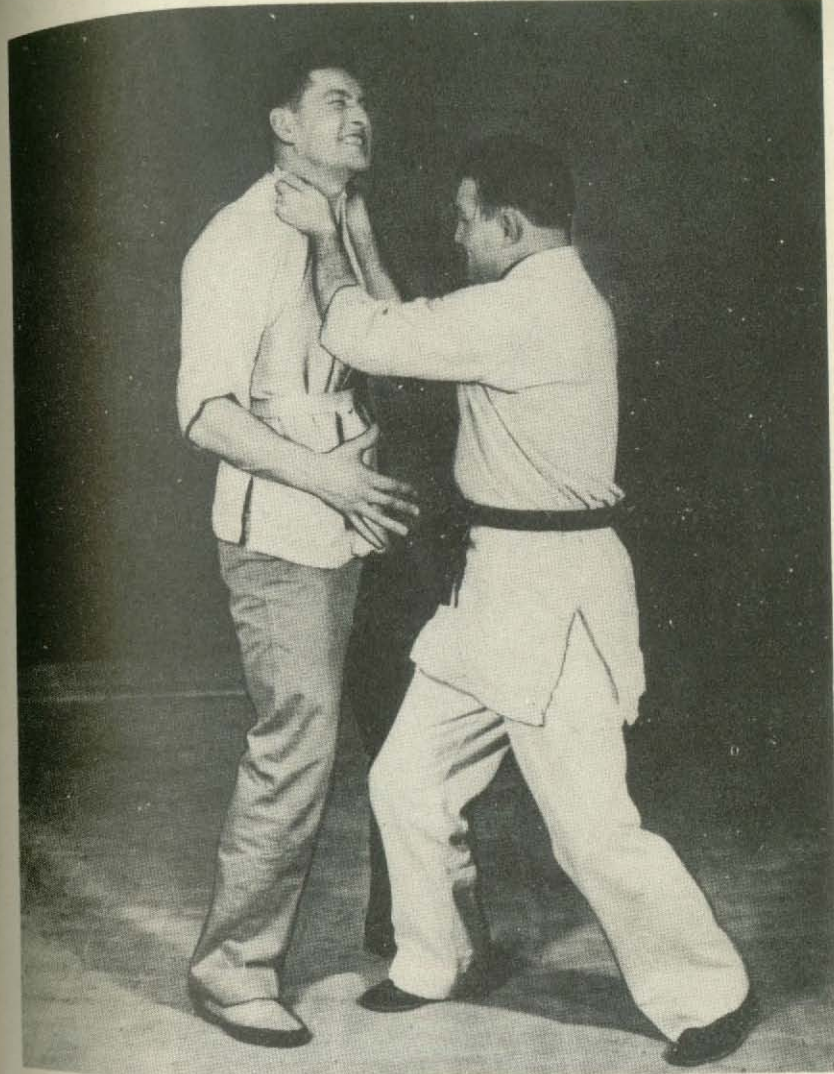

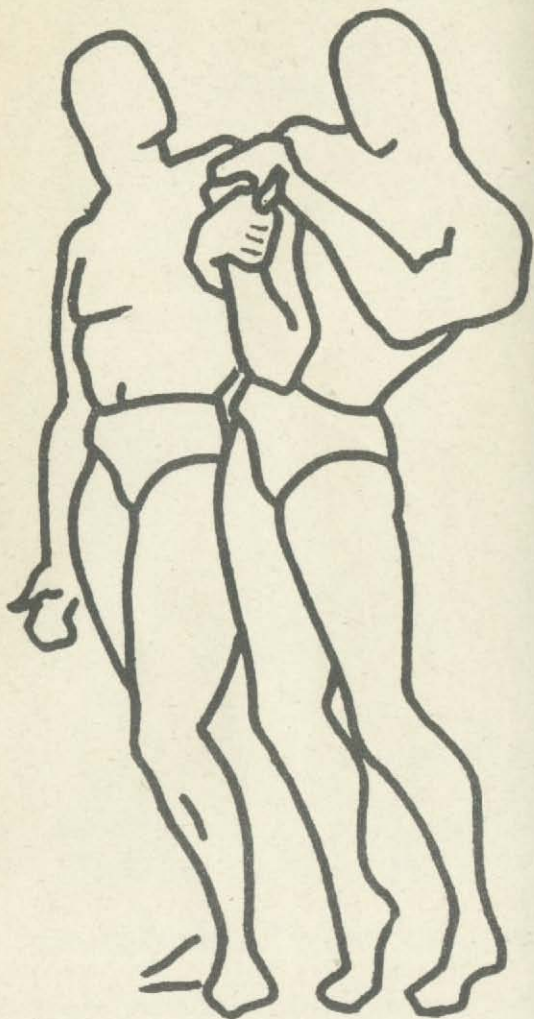

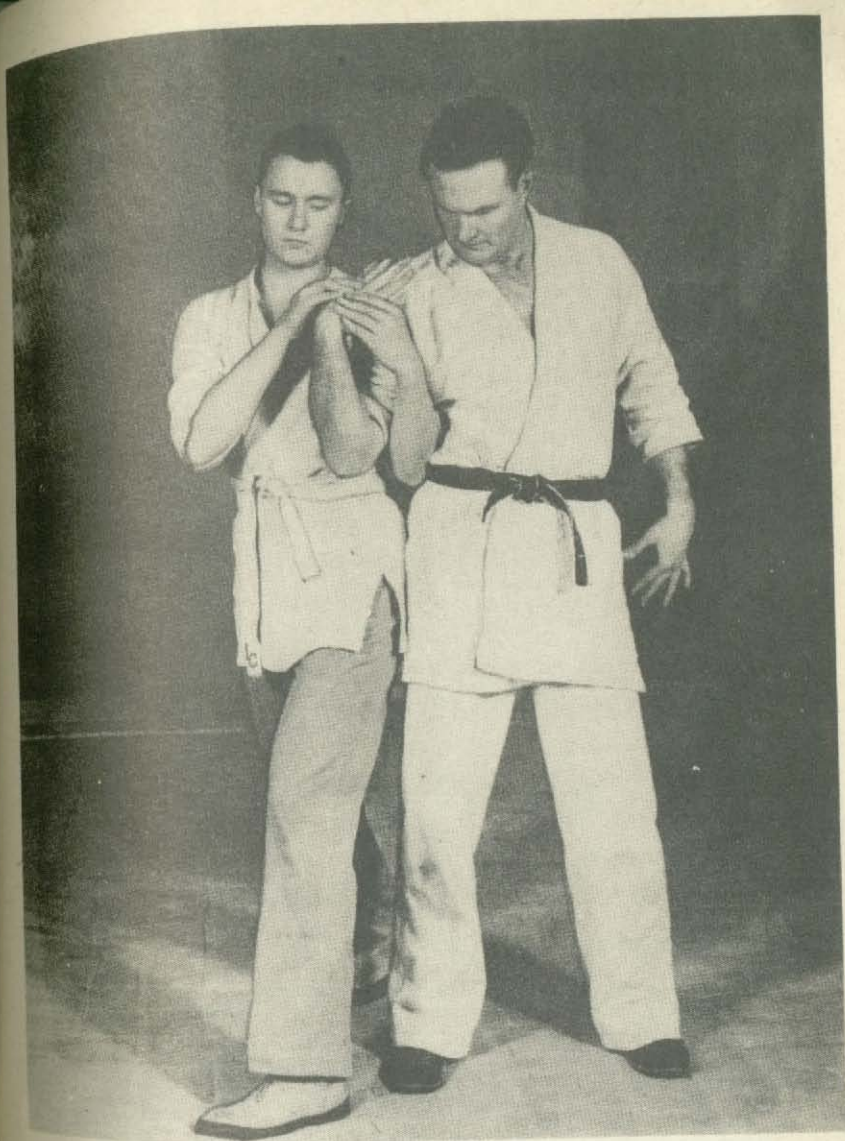

CLUB OR STICK DEFENSE

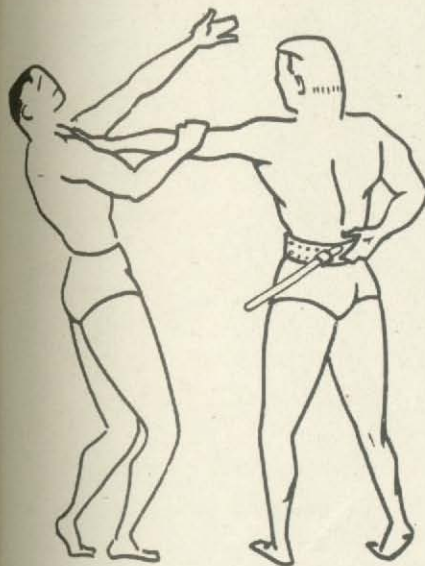
Club or stick defense is a comparatively new mode of defense. It is very important to military police and police officers and essential to men in the armed forces especially should they find themselves without weapons.

A short stick about 18 inches long, preferably pointed, can be made into a very dangerous weapon. The stick should be laid alongside of your right hand on the inside. By holding the stick in this position, it will not break.

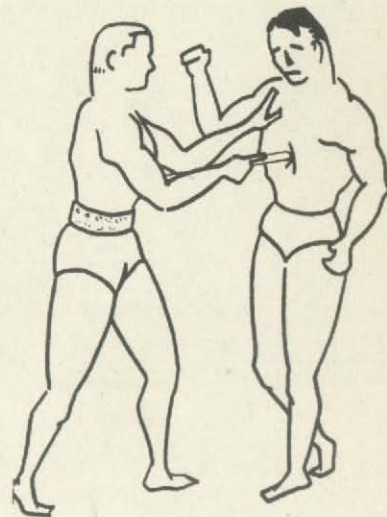
Three inches of the stick should protrude beyond your fingers. In this position it would be very hard for an opponent or enemy to take the stick away from you as it does not look dangerous held in that position. The most effective way to use the stick when held in the right hand is to step quickly with the right foot and slash down against the face tearing the face open; or jab the stick into the mouth; or slash it against the throat. Other vulnerable spots are jabbing the heart, stomach and testicles. It also makes an effective weapon against knife attack.

DISARMING TRICK NO. 1

Your enemy attempts to use weapon from the side:

Grasp his right wrist with your left hand. Step forward with right foot while sliding your right arm between his arm and side. Crook arm forming an "L" clenching fist tightly. Strike back of elbow sharply with center of your forearm. This will cause him considerable pain forcing him to drop his weapon.

If he attempts to throw his free hand about your neck, go into "Over Shoulder Throw."

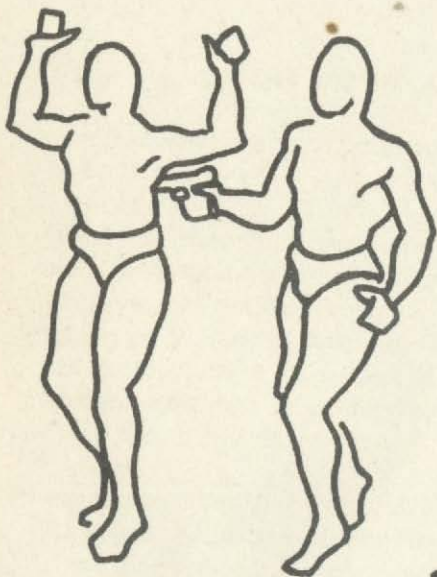

Lean back and down against his arm clamping your elbow against his arm and holding it tightly to your side.

Disarm by turning gun toward his face with your right hand. Strike him with captured weapon on the back of his neck. Continue holding him by leaning back against his arm.

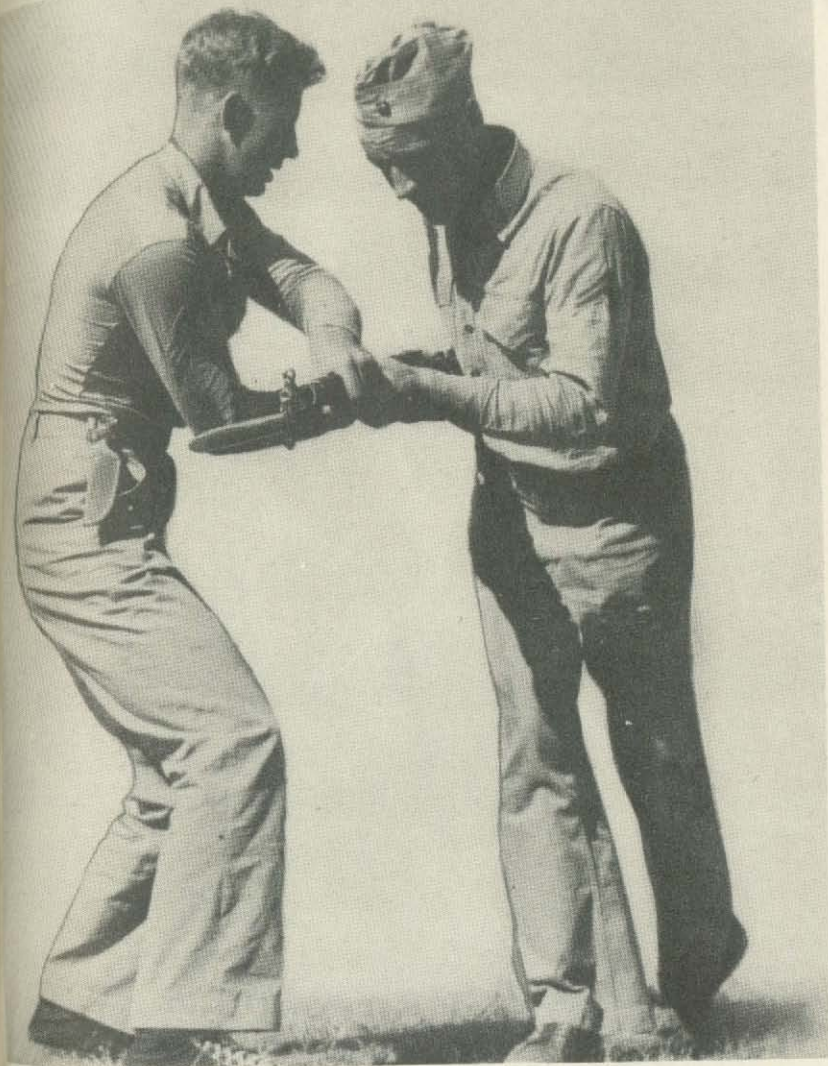

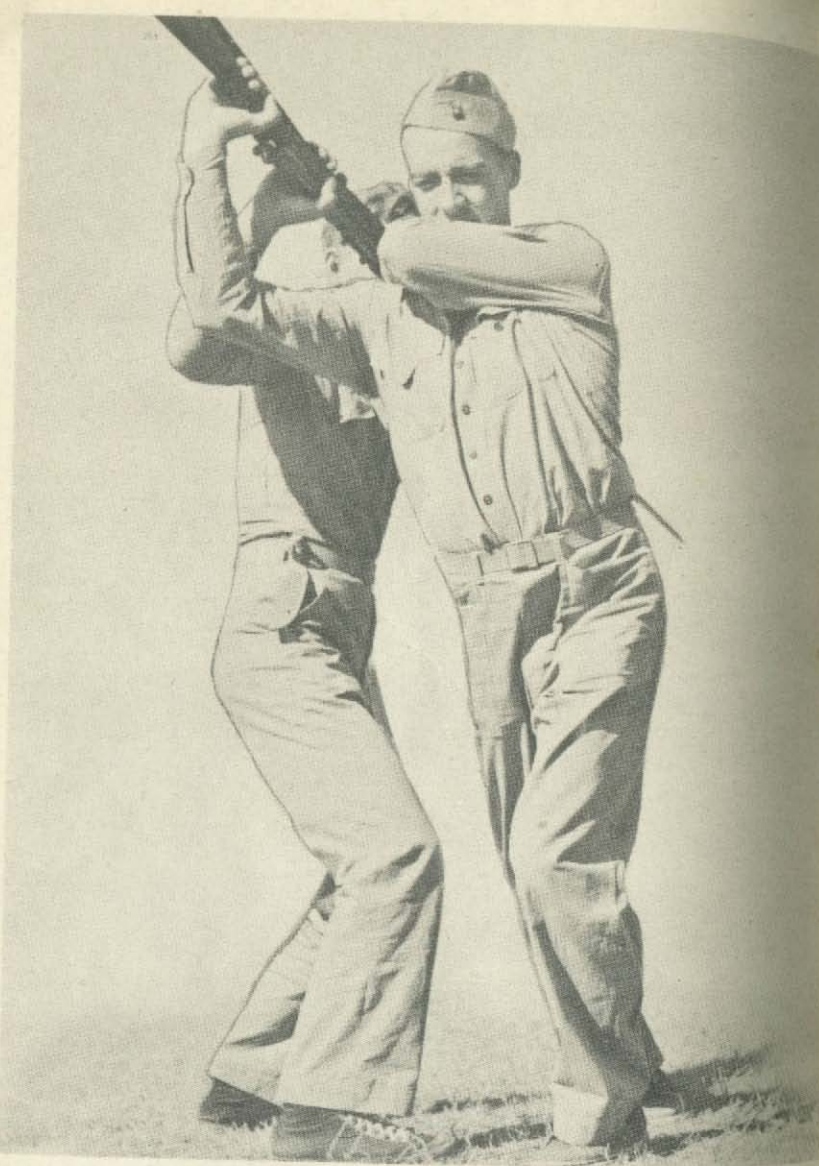

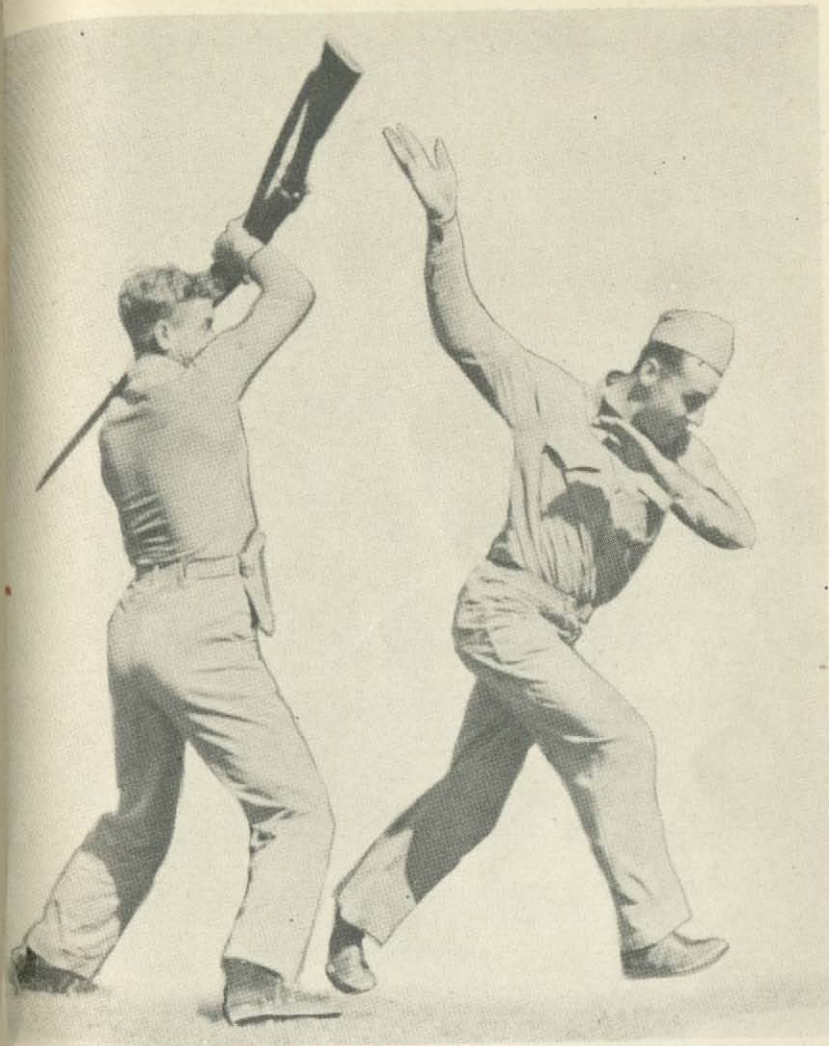

Coming out of foxhole, clasp enemy's leading foot, using hand on same side. Thrust hard with forearm against inside of knee joint, pushing out and back. Climb across enemy using knee in testicles and choke. This may be performed with either hand.

THE PURPOSE OF THE COMBAT CONDITIONING PROGRAM

The purpose of the following activities is for speeding up the physical training of our Marines as well as the youth of the nation.

Many of the instructions are not new as they are the same as have been used in the past. This war has created many new problems and, therefore, speed is essential primarily in combat conditioning. Our program has taken this into consideration by adopting all the new methods for conditioning the men.

A definite time is set for the program. Participation is compulsory. A systematic plan is followed, as outlined in the following pages. Effective administration calls for the cooperation of all officers and men.

COMBAT CONDITIONING PROGRAM

I. Drill:

1. Manual of Arms (5 minutes).
2. Close and Extended Order (15 minutes).
3. Physical Drill Under Arms (5 minutes).
Stack Arms (3 minutes).

II. Accelerated Calisthenics—Stress Speed—No Rests.

1. Clap hands—running in place accelerate.
2. Side straddle hop hand slapping head — 16 counts. Rythm — 16 counts — speed — men count.
3. Side straddle hop—hands on deck—16 counts. Rhythm—16 counts—speed—men count.
4. Breathing exercise—
 - (a) Inhale—hold breath—pound chest with fists. Exhale.
 1. Repeat once.
 - (b) Inhale—hold breath—hammer stomach with sides of hand—exhale.
 1. Repeat once.
5. Extend arms, touch alternate feet with opposite hand—stretch—2 counts—16 counts—men count.
 - (a) Bend extend arms—wind mill—16 counts —speed—men count.
6. Russian dance—arm bend—squat—left leg out —8 counts — right — 8 counts — alternate — 16 counts—latter—fast—shake legs out, at finish.
7. Clasp hands under knees — shuffling feet — alternate 16 counts—rhythm—16 counts—fast.
8. Stoop sitting—hands between legs—left foot back 8 counts—right foot back—8 counts—both back 16 counts.
9. Grass drill—running in place—front go—back go—right go—left go—back go—front go.

10. Push ups—hands under chest—push up both hands and feet off deck—slap hands—catch self—let down—accelerate action.
11. Hands at side—heels six inches off deck—heels and hands out—back—accelerate action. Alternate with heels six inches off deck hammering stomach.
12. Rocking horse.
13. Bicycle exercise.
14. Alternate with rotating feet—stiff legged bringing heels close to ground—also sitting up slowly—back to prone slowly.
15. Heels and toes on deck alternately.
16. Hurdlers' exercise.

UP ON FEET

III. Contact—Pair Off:

1. Hand wrestling.
2. Lock back of necks—bulldogging.
3. Exchange hands on opponent's chest alternating feet.
4. Same except heels of hands in abdomen. Accelerate above.
5. Pushing exercise—drape arm over opponent's neck, one hand on deck—push.
6. Lock arms back to back — pull up — shake opponent.
7. Rooster fighting.
8. Fireman carry.

IV. Tumbling:

1. Forward somersault.
2. Backward somersault—knees high—run backward.
3. Side roll.
- (b) Alternate sides.
4. General warm-ups—on mat—stress recovery with hands up.

V. Hand to Hand Phase:

1. Chokes and breaks.
2. Wrist lock and breaks.
3. Use of helmets—pails—tops of GI cans to keep
4. Hip throw.
5. All judo throws—slams.
6. Breaks for same.
7. Elbows—forearms—offensive use of same.
8. Kicks—stamps.
9. Pistol and knife—disarming.
10. Mass bare handed boxing.

VII. Bayonet Drill—new. (b) Disarming.

VIII. Obstacle Course with Rifles and Bayonets.

IX. Rope Climbing.

X. Swimming routine when possible—IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX used alternately—stressing V, VI, VIII as troops progress.

NOTE: Swim program should include:

1. Tread water — proper breathing — variety of strokes.
2. Use of trousers—shirts as water wings.
3. Use of helmets—pails—tops of GI cans to keep one afloat.
4. Proper way to leave deck of sinking aircraft carrier or troopship.
5. Methods of swimming in water where oil is aflame.
6. Life saving methods:
 - (a) Towing comrade.
 - (b) Breaking desperation holds.
7. Resuscitation.
