Leaf and Beads comes in a variety of different shapes, rose bowls as pictured above, nut bowls, plates made from the nut bowl, a tricorner candy dish, and a dome-footed nut bowl. Most of the rose bowls have a scalloped edge as seen above. Leaf and Beads rose bowls are hard to find with smooth edge or a beaded edge, although they do not seem to command higher prices that the scalloped examples. The Leaf and Beads rose bowls can be found with a variety of interior patterns, plain, rayed, or a floral interior. They also can be found in just about every color in the carnival spectrum, ice green opal, and lime green opal have claimed some of the highest prices and are quite rare to find, and a smoke rose bowl has been reported. The Leif and Bead rose bowls are very pretty and do not take up much space, you can build quite a collection if you take into consideration the all the variations of interiors and base colors that are found.
