

## **Nautilus**

The nautilus pattern was first made by Northwood. Northwood produced the nautilus in custard and opalescent glass. Dugan later acquired the molds and produced the nautilus in peach opalescent, and purple. The most commonly found shapes are the sugar on the left, or the gravy on the right. The marigold banana boat in the center is the only one reported to date. The pattern on the base of these three pieces base is a sea motif consisting of shells, fish and coral. You can also find the nautilus in six to nine inch vases. The vase does not have the same base pattern as the gravy, sugar and the banana boat. The nautilus vases have been found in purple and marigold. It is assumed that the vases have been made from a tumbler.
