#### FROM THE PASTOR

"This is the day the Lord has made – let us rejoice and be glad in it!"

-Psalm 118:24

You may remember in last month's Kerygma that Kay and I were scrambling to get a trip to Pennsylvania together as Kay's mother (Beverly Reed on our prayer list) was near death. Losing blood quickly, she had received two transfusions and her doctor felt a third one would be ineffective. He gave her two days to live. So it's been over a month now and the old girl is still with us. We've been calling her, "Wonder Woman". Her 96<sup>th</sup> birthday is at the end of April and we wouldn't be surprised if she makes it. Who knows, she might even outlive the rest of us. One tough lady. Kay's brother went to visit last week and sent out a photo of Mom in a wheelchair, playing kick ball! I kid you not. Just as big a surprise is that she is socializing, where for the past several years she was content to sit alone in her room. Has her brush with death opened a new appreciation for life? We wonder about Wonder Woman and the mystery of life's dance so close to the edge that one becomes more alive. Of course, considering her condition, we don't expect the dance to last forever, but it is a wonder to behold. Life, however uncertain, can still be wonder-full and sometimes catch us by surprise.

I write this for the April Kerygma, but today is Tuesday of Holy Week and Easter is March 31, so it's not quite here yet. But I know it's coming. I know because the daffodils and forsythia are bursting with yellow blossoms, as sure a sign of Easter as anything. Among the first blooms following winter, they are harbingers of life to come. Anticipating their bold celebration of color each year is always a hopeful thing. Of course, the still greater hope is the joy of Easter itself, the Day of Resurrection, of God's gift of forgiveness and new life in Jesus Christ. Light comes and the darkness fades. The days grow longer and the world around us greens and blooms.

Such joyous hope for today and tomorrow is not naive foolishness in the face of the world's turmoil, but rather a bold proclamation that the love of God remains, indeed finds opportunity to blossom and bear fruit in the lives of those who dare believe in it and live it. Life plays kickball in the face of death. Oh, the wonder of it.

In 1 Corinthians 15, the Apostle Paul seems to mock death while praising Christ:

"Where, O death is your victory? Where, O death is your sting? ... but thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!"

We share Christ's victory. It's why we can look forever forward with genuine hope, with anticipation for new life, with joy, with wonder. Every day is a gift.


