FIRST READING Acts 8:26-40

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, “Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.” (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, “Go over to this chariot and join it.” ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. Music Notes

Today's worship music is led by the Saved by Grace Band. In addition to leading the hymns and parts of the Liturgy, the group offers four songs from the Praise Band repertoire. Please sing along! The Prelude comes from the I Am They debut album of the same name released in 2015. The group's name comes from John 17, in which Jesus refers to his disciples as "they" in his prayer the night before his death. For the Last Prelude, the group summarizes the Biblical Redemption narrative in "King of Kings" from Hillsong Worship. Hillsong Church was founded in 1983 by Brian and Bobbie Houston in the western suburbs of Sydney, Australia and now has churches in 23 countries and an average global attendance of 130,000 weekly. Hillsong is closely associated with the Australian Christian Churches. Hillsong Worship is a collaboration of worship music that has created 46 albums since 1992 with over 300 songs and has won a Grammy for "What a Beautiful Name." New for the Band this year is the Distribution Anthem by Matt Redman, with text taken from Psalms 84:1-2, 10; 17:15; 24: 4, 8 and 63:7. The song is by Matt Redman, who in addition to being a singer-songwriter, is a published author with multiple books on Christian worship, including The Unquenchable Worshipper and the book Facedown (which accompanied the album of the same name). His latest book, Mirror Ball, relays his thoughts and experiences of "living boldly and shining brightly for the glory of God." The Postlude comes from the eponymous album by Matt Maher. It has a feel that's a cross between country and reggae and has a catchy hook you'll be hearing in your head for the rest of the day. Matt is a contemporary Christian music artist, songwriter, and worship leader originally from Newfoundland, Canada, who later relocated to Tempe, Arizona. He has written and produced seven solo albums to date. Three of his albums have reached the Top 25 Christian Albums Billboard chart and four of his singles have reached the Top 25 Christian Songs chart.

The Hymn of the Day is by Jack Hayford, who wrote, "In 1977, my wife Anna and I spent our vacation in Great Britain. We traveled through England, Scotland and Wales the same year that Queen Elizabeth celebrated the 25th anniversary of her coronation. There were many symbols of royalty... 'Majesty' describes the kingly, lordly, glorious, regal nature of our savior. 'Majesty' recalls that our worship can align us with God and His throne and His kingdom. We are rescued from death, restored to the inheritance of sons and daughters, and qualified for victory in battle against the adversary, and destined for the throne forever in His presence."
