

Why Care About Life? - Part 2

"I have set before you life and death. Blessings and curses. Choose life! so that you and your descendants may live." Deuteronomy 30: 19

That's clear: **choose life over death**. Death has ample opportunity to come after us. If it doesn't get us in the womb, it might get us as a young child, or as an adolescent or young adult. Perhaps death comes knockin in the prime of life and sometimes, we live to a ripe old age.

People choose to live through thick and thin, through trials and tribulations. We fight to stay alive. We have a basic instinct for life.

We are body and soul, and our soul is our life force. It is our meeting place with God.

God is Perfect Love, Perfect Truth, Perfect Goodness, Perfect Beauty, and Perfect Being. **Our soul**, through its spiritual relationship with God, **allows us to see Love, Truth, Goodness, Beauty, and Being in the world**. While we are alive, we can't see God face to face, but we see traces of him everywhere.

But God is not a being among other beings in creation; he is not OF this world; he is transcendent to the world. And at the same time, we say, "Where is God?" And of course, the answer is everywhere. That's because God holds all of existence in being, he is the ground of all being but is not a being himself: **he is the essence of being, he is being itself.**

We don't understand these things (Love, Truth, Beauty, Goodness) perfectly as

God does but he gives us the ability, to understand something about each of these things, so that we're always trying to create more perfect goodness in our lives. We seek to live and to better ourselves and our communities and our society because we are seeking to be more like God.

But life is not a bowl of cherries. Trouble, disappointment, betrayal, and tragedy may enter our lives, not to mention mental illness and depression. At times, things can look bleak and our zeal for life can waver. I agree with the Buddha, who states in the first tenet of Buddhism "Life is suffering."

And so it is. Who among us is not suffering in some way? Christ has come to give meaning to our suffering. He suffered greatly. And the **meaning of his suffering is the salvation of your soul**.

Suffering is part of human existence. **We** are called to help relieve each other's suffering, to have compassion for (to suffer with) others.

But **our government says we can stamp out suffering**. All we have to do is to convince vulnerable, suffering people to allow themselves to die by the injection of drugs.

Today Canada has the fastest growing euthanasia, assisted suicide rate in the world. The government has discovered that it is far less expensive to kill a patient (euthanasia) or give the patient drugs that they take on their own (assisted suicide) than to properly give care and comfort to dying patients. This is what they call Maid. Palliative care is chronically underfunded, and euthanasia is normalized.

In 2022, there were 13,241 euthanasia/assisted suicide deaths
