

3rd SUNDAY OF LENT

1st Reading: Exodus 20.1-17 2nd Reading: 1 Cor. 1.18, 22-25++ Gospel: John 2.13-25

(Genesis 12: 1)

"Leave your country and come into the land I will show you..."

This is God's call to Abram, who of course becomes Abraham, considered the father of the faith. Following the Lord's instructions, he left his home country of Ur about 4,000 years ago and as promised, his descendants are as numerous as the stars in the sky. We are those descendants, all of us who have been called by God to baptism in the Church.

When an adult is searching for the truth and desires to be baptized into the Church, that person is called a catechumen. He or she has been called to "Leave your own country and come into a land I will show you..." The catechumenate is a period in which the person is given pastoral formation and guidance to know the faith. The person "becomes familiar with the Christian way of life, and is supported by sponsors, godparents, and the entire Christian community. They learn to turn more readily to God in prayer, to bear witness to the faith, in all things keep their hopes set on Christ... and to practice love of neighbor..." (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults p. 37)

We have one such person, one catechumen who, God willing will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. We are

blessed to have Francis Fang with us, a young man who, over many years has gradually been pulled closer and closer to Jesus. You may have seen him as he has been singing in the 11:00 choir for the past several months.

We are also blessed to have Mark Fisher, a young man who was raised in the Anglican faith and therefor a baptized Christian. As we know, baptism cannot be duplicated and therefore Mark is not a catechumen but what we call a 'candidate'. He will, God willing, be welcomed into full communion of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil where he will receive his First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

We are blessed indeed. These young men represent our hope for the future. And, if you think people are not drawn to the Church, you should have seen the Holy Rosary Cathedral, where we celebrated the Rite of Elections with Archbishop Miller last Sunday afternoon. The cathedral was packed catechumens and candidates and their sponsors from around archdiocese. And the thev filled Cathedral two weeks in a row. Packed!

Pro-abortion claim:


Babies are better off aborted than being put in broken-down foster care systems where they suffer.







