

Soul of Christ, sanctify me! St. Thomas Aquinas

When we receive the Holy Eucharist, that is exactly what Jesus is doing in us: his soul is sanctifying our souls. He is joining his soul to our soul. We become **one with him.** St. Thomas Aquinas tells us that the human soul of Christ has sanctifying grace, that this soul is in union with the Word of God, is dignified above all human souls, knows and loves God more perfectly than any other soul and that the grace of his soul overflows upon all others. The grace of the human soul of Jesus overflows to us.

We're coming to that time of year, the middle of Autumn, when the leaves are falling, the air is brisk, the days are short; it's a time of transition into a different state of mind. We begin to hunker down and prepare for winter. We observe the death of summer; it's now a memory. Life passes, seasons change, people die. It's all part of life.

There is no other religion or organization that attends to death as deeply reverent or profoundly meaningful as the Catholic Church. The Tibetan Book of the Dead which describes the transition rites of Tibetan Buddhists come the closest to Catholic thinking about life after death.

First Nations People have a beautiful sense that their ancestors live on in some way. When they pray, they often invoke "all my relations", meaning the line of ancestors that goes back to the beginning of time. Catholics have a similar belief we call "the Communion of Saints". I'm not so sure that Catholics in general understand that or believe it or invoke their "relations" that have gone

before them. First Nations People get this.

But the one thing concerning death that we, as Catholics have that others do not, is hope! St. Paul tells us, "You don't have to mourn as others do who have no hope." (2 Thessalonians 4: 13). We can look forward to our death with joy because Jesus rose from the dead and that makes us co-heirs to the Kingdom of God. Naturally we grieve our loved one's death, but our grief is tempered by our hope and we carry the joy that comes from knowing our loved ones are likely to be with God in heaven. Or we can at least hope they're in purgatory and eventually they will be in heaven.

We are in the month of November, a time when we especially remember and pray for the souls of our loved ones.

We just celebrated All Saints Day on November 1, a day when contemplate the glory of the Church **Triumphant** and we implore intercession. We ask the Saints to pray for us. On All Souls Day, November 2, we considered the pains of the Church Suffering and we prayed for these souls the divine assistance: "Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord." This is the dogma of the Communion of Saints put into practice. The **Church Triumphant** intercedes for us, the Church Militant; and we, in our turn, hasten to help the Church Suffering. You see, there is no real separation from those who have died in Christ. Because Jesus has sanctified our soul and has joined his soul to our soul.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.
